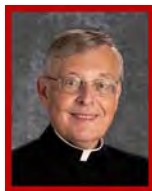

# Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

We have flipped the calendar page and started February. Yet, it is so important to celebrate the moment - to live in the present. Our presence to each other in the current moment is the "true present or gift" we give to each other. As we start a new month together, let us remind ourselves that the gift of humor is a wonderful gift from God - especially during the cold months of a Chicago winter.

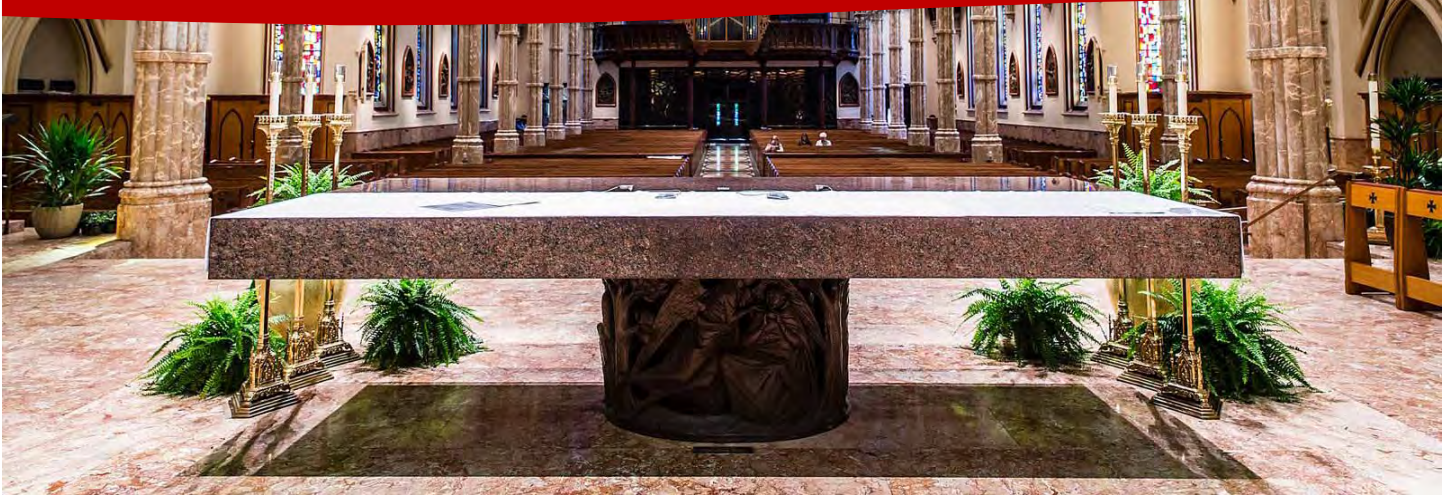
