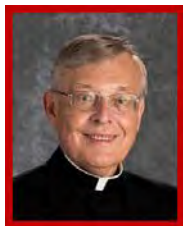

Message from the Rector



Dear Holy Week People,

In Holy Week we celebrate the most sacred mysteries of our own Christian faith when we gather to remember Christ's dying, through which he destroyed our death, and His rising, through which he restored our life. The mysteries we celebrate during these days are not only something long ago, something far away, but are as close as our own and our world's struggle with living and dying.

To deepen our experience of life together, and to celebrate Christ's dying and rising to new life, we need to gather together, to tell the stories of God, to break bread together. We need to celebrate together, to be at peace with one another, to give thanks as a people who continually grow in faith.

The liturgies of Holy Week invite us to ponder the meaning of Christ's life, death and resurrection. I encourage you— yes, I urge you—to be present at the celebrative moments in the life of the Christian Faith Community. For it is when we gather, that we are most truly Church—the People of God.

Holy Week provides an opportunity and a window to put life in perspective. The following story is powerful. Take time this Holy Week to connect the pieces of our lives with the Paschal mystery—the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Allow the Lord Jesus to heal those parts of our lives that ache for fullness, healing, new life and a deeper trust in God.

Project: Humility

A group of high school students were assigned to do a service project at a community outreach center. The center was located in a neighborhood several miles away from their school.

When they arrived for their orientation, they encountered a homeless man asleep on the sidewalk in front of the center, located in an old, run-down building. The students snickered and made cruel jokes about the man, the building and the neighborhood. When they went inside the center, there was a note at the front desk: Back in 10 minutes. Have a seat.

The students took seats in the waiting area. A few minutes later, the homeless man wandered into the center. The students smirked as he fixed himself a cup of coffee. But their whispers turned to stunned silence when the homeless man removed his shabby overcoat. Despite the worn sneakers he wore, the students recognized immediately that this was not a vagrant.

"Welcome. I'm Tom Gallagher, the director of the center."

The students realized that Mr. Gallagher had heard every one of their vicious jokes. They just sank into their chairs, never more embarrassed in their lives.

"Let this be your first lesson in community service," Mr. Gallagher said quietly. "You can't truly reach out to people if you judge them or make fun of them. A person's appearance has little to do with character. We are all human beings who will need the help of one another at some point in our lives."

It is not always what I do, but what I allow the Lord to do through and in me. We also need each other. Islands are a wonderful place to visit, but we are in this journey of life together. The following words of Pedro Arrupe, S.J. says it best as we begin Holy Week:

"Nothing is more practical than finding God, that is, than falling in love in a quite absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you do with your evenings, how you spend your weekend, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything."

May we take the time to put life into perspective this Holy Week. Fall in love with God. Make the time to journey to the Cross with Christ and together may we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus—from death to eternal life. Palm Sunday Reflections

Most of us know today as Palm Sunday, although officially in the Church it is called Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, and to many Church leaders it is simply Passion Sunday, which comes from the Latin name for it, *Dominica Passionis*. We have reflected on this day previously how the liturgy begins with great joy and becomes more and more somber with the reading of the Passion.

During the procession of the palms Jesus arrives in Jerusalem to great tumult and rejoicing as the people cry out "Hosanna... blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, hosanna in the highest." As the Mass progresses we get an overview of what is to occur during this holiest of weeks, including the institution of the Eucharist, the passion and death of the Lord, the prediction of His Resurrection, and then His Resurrection itself.

Imagine the confusion of the Twelve Apostles. Jesus has been spending time with them in the recent weeks prior to the Passion trying to get them to understand that His time of suffering was near and approaching, and that is the reason He must go to Jerusalem. And here is the crowd welcoming and praising and laughing and celebrating His presence.

We are not much different in many ways, but now is the time for us to really embrace and understand the sacrifice the Lord made for each of us, and the incredible gift He has given us. In the coming days it is our final chance to truly rededicate ourselves to being His disciple.

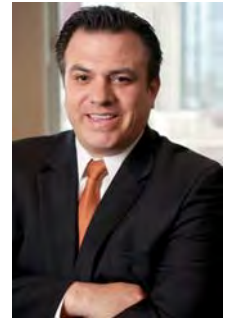

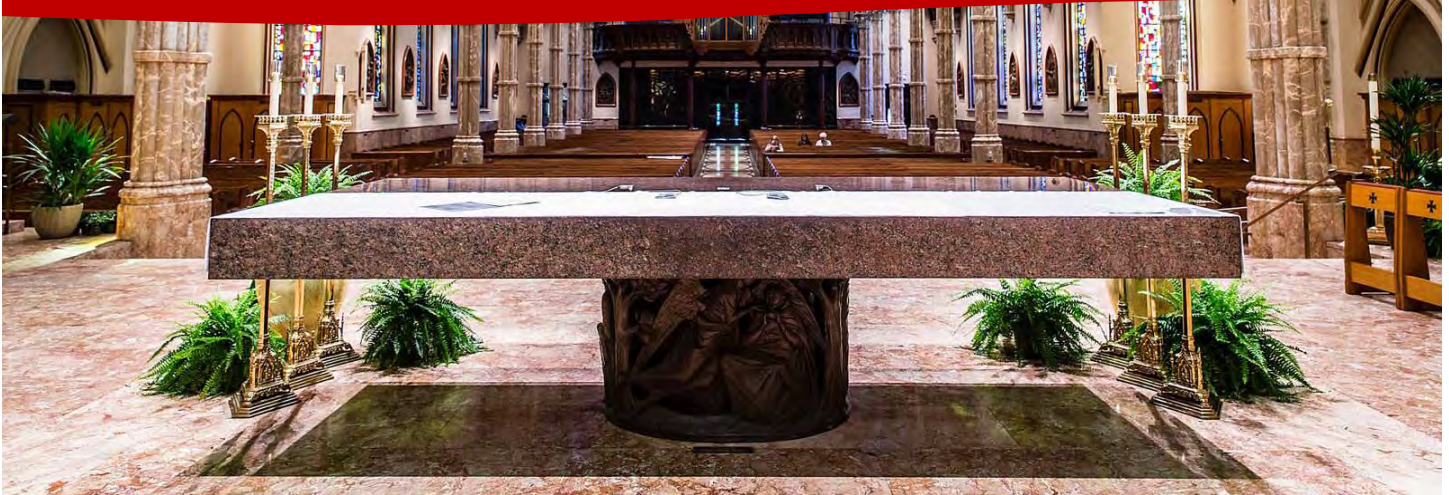

Tenebrae—April 12—7:30 p.m.

The word “tenebrae” is Latin for “darkness” or “shadows”. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to recreate the important aspects of the passion story. The Tenebrae service begins with the cathedral lit and with many candles on a centrally-placed candelabrum. As the chants and readings progress, candles are gradually extinguished. In the darkened cathedral, all the lights and candles are extinguished until only a lone candle remains. Towards the end of the service, the Christ candle is hidden, typifying the apparent victory of the forces of evil over good. At the very end, a loud noise is made (the *strépitus*) symbolizing the earthquake at the time of his death (Matthew 27) and his resurrection.

The hidden candle is then restored to its place, symbolizing the triumph of good over evil.

Music will be provided by the Choirs of Holy Name Cathedral.
