Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



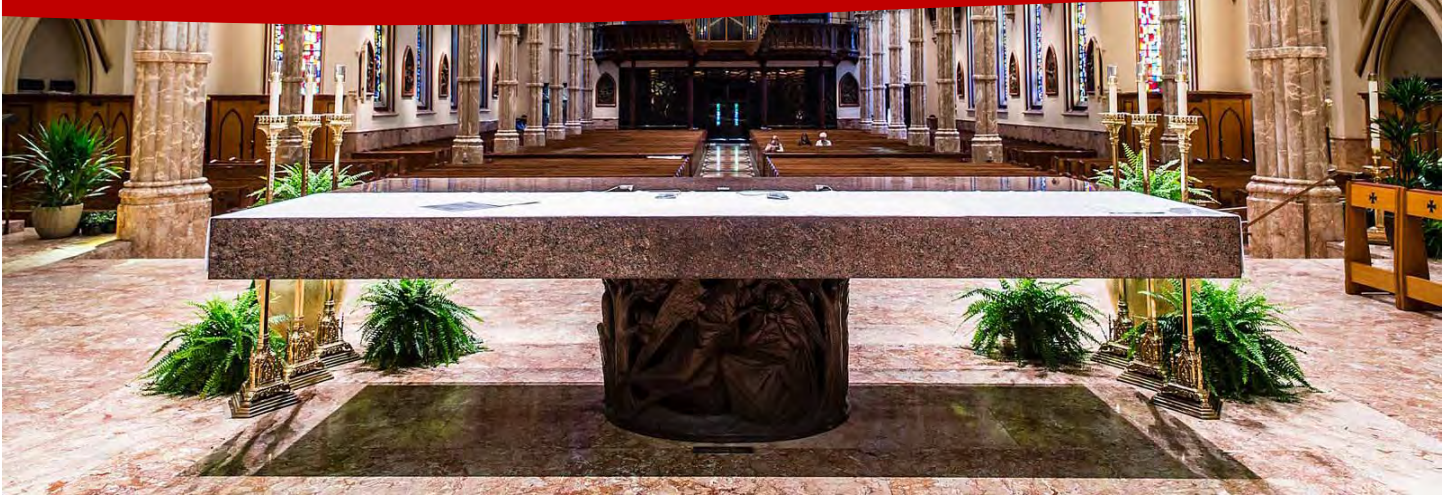
