

# Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

As many of you are aware, the Archdiocese has reached an agreement to sell the land across State Street, just west of Holy Name Cathedral to JDL Development, an experienced local development firm. A transaction of this size and complexity takes months to complete and you may see signs of activity on the site from time-to-time as the buyer works to finalize its plans and complete certain site studies. The transaction is targeted to close in 2018.

There are two aspects of the development that directly affect Holy Name Cathedral. First, the buyer has an obligation to provide 225 parking spaces in the new development specifically dedicated for the use of the Cathedral. Second, there will be an open park space located across the street from the Cathedral, incorporated into the design of the new development. That space will be permanently dedicated as open green space. In both cases, the Cathedral will have a say in determining the design and functionality of the spaces.

Once the project is underway we will temporarily lose access to parking at the site. We are working with owners and operators of other local lots to identify and provide alternative parking during this time. However, we expect parking to remain as it currently is until construction begins in 2018.

We are excited about the potential of the new development, both in terms of the amenities it will provide to the Cathedral and parishioners, and the vibrancy it will bring to the neighborhood. As this process evolves, I will update you on its progress via future bulletins and on our Cathedral website. In the meantime, I ask for your prayers, patience and support. I am happy to answer any questions that you may have. Please feel free to contact me (312) 787-8040. Thank you for your continuous support and my prayers are with you.

P.S. Summer is moving much too quickly. This season is a wonderful opportunity for fun, relaxation and exercise. I share the following . . . . . Please try it!

## Exercise for People Over 60

Begin by standing on a comfortable surface, where you have plenty of room at each side.

With a 5-lb potato bag in each hand, extend your arms straight out from your sides and hold them there as long as you can. Try to reach a full minute, and then relax.

Each day you'll find that you can hold this position for just a bit longer.

After a couple of weeks, move up to 10-lb potato bags. Then try 50-lb potato bags and eventually try to get to where you can lift a 100-lb potato bag in each hand and hold your arms straight for more than a full minute. (I'm at this level).

After you feel confident at that level, put a potato in each bag.

# Stewardship

## Who Guides You?

Today's readings remind us of the fact that it is God who guides us, and it is God who influences our decisions through the Holy Spirit. Jesus tells the Parable of the Weeds and the Wheat, which is relatively clear to us in terms of the facts. However, there is an important point within it that we must acknowledge. When the decision is made to allow the weeds to grow with the wheat, it is clear the separation will occur later, not at that moment. When the decision is made as to what will be harvested and kept and what will be destroyed, that is a decision made by God.

It is somewhat a reflection of another point made in scripture. Today's Gospel comes to us from the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 13; however, in just a few chapters prior to that (Chapter 7) we are told "Stop judging, that you may not be judged...for as you judge, so will you be judged." There is no question that there are "weeds" among the flock, but it is not our place to identify them and sort them out. That is the work of God.

As Catholics and Christians we must take care not to be self righteous and judgmental. Before we call into question someone else's walk with God, we need to scrutinize and take care of our own. Stewardship is what we do, not what we necessarily think others should do.

As we engage in Renew My Church, the mission appeal helps to reinforce our Archdiocesan commitment to greater outreach to the poor and to becoming a true mission-oriented church. We grow in vitality as we recognize and support the Church around the world.

Through the Missionary Cooperation Plan the Archdiocese is able to foster mission vitality and inspire discipleship in our parishes. The appeal not only provides much needed support for missionary efforts in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, Latin America, and Pacific Islands, but it also offers a way for our own parish communities to become engaged in bringing Christ to the world. *Ad genes* missionaries go to the peripheries to evangelize in remote, struggling, and persecuted communities, the poorest of the poor. They form priests, educate adults and children, offer medical care, provide safe homes, administer the Sacraments, and more.

On Saturday, July 22 and Sunday, July 23 we will welcome Bejoy N. D'Cruze OMI, Bishop of Sylhet Diocese in Bangladesh. Sylhet is a new Diocese erected in 2011. They now have their own house which was blessed and inaugurated in November, 2016. Before that they lived for five years in the rental Muslim Houses. As a new Diocese they are involved in education, healthcare, catechetical and pastoral activities among the poor peoples of Tea plantations and other indigenous groups. Bishop Bejoy is without a Cathedral and a Pastoral Centre. It is predominantly a Muslim country and he still moves freely even though there are death threats from fundamentalists. Please consider giving to this Mission Appeal to help carry out the mission and ministry among the poor people of Sylhet Diocese. Please continue to keep them in your prayers.



**Bishop Bejoy Nicephorus D'Cruze** was born on February 9, 1956, at Tuital, in Nawabgonj sub-district under the district of Dhaka.

He was ordained a priest on 20 February 1987, and appointed Bishop of Sylhet on 8 July 2011. His installation took place in Moulvibazar on 30 September, 2011.

His Episcopal ordination was earlier as Bishop of Khulna diocese on May 6, 2005. Bishop D'Cruze is also now Chairman, Episcopal Commission for Christian Unity and Interreligious Dialogue, Catholic Bishops' Conference of Bangladesh (CBCB).
