Dear People of God,

Summer is moving much too quickly! Life moves much too quickly and we often procrastinate. The following (author unknown) is truly profound. Read it & pass it on.

Tombstones Don't Talk Back

Too many people put off something that brings them joy just because they haven't thought about it, don't have it on their schedule, didn't know it was coming or are too rigid to depart from their routine.

I got to thinking one day about all those people on the Titanic who passed up dessert at dinner that fateful night in an effort to cut back. From then on, I've tried to be a little more flexible.

I cannot count the times I called my sister and said, "How about going to lunch in half hour?" She would stammer, "I can't. I have clothes on the line. My hair is dirty. I wish I had known yesterday. I had a late breakfast, it looks like rain," and my personal favorite: "It's Monday." She died a few years ago. We never did have lunch together.

Stewardship

"I will give you the keys to Heaven."

In last week's Gospel, we heard the story of the Canaanite woman (a Gentile) who appealed to Jesus for help, and her prayer and plea were answered. Part of the message of that is that the Kingdom of God is open to and offered to all peoples.

This week we hear Jesus say to St. Peter in the Gospel from Matthew, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." An important part of the Vatican flag is two keys. Those keys, of course, represent the keys to the kingdom to which Jesus makes reference. Were you aware that one key is gold and the other silver. Interpretation is that the gold key represents spiritual power and the silver key represents worldly power.

We are also fond of images and more showing Saint Peter at the gates of Heaven deciding who is admitted and who is not. Nevertheless, the keys are reinforced in the Acts of the Apostles, and it is perhaps not that Peter opens the gates of Heaven, but Peter (and Paul as well) through his ministry and explanations make it clear that heaven (the kingdom) is available to all, Jews and Gentiles.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1023) states, "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They are like God forever, for they 'see him as he is,' face to face." Pope Francis has spoken on this more than once. Recently, he stated, "The Lord has redeemed all of us, all of us with the Blood of Christ. However, we must meet one another doing good."

Our call is clear.

We conclude our four week series inviting you to reflect on the liturgy, specifically God's presence in our celebration of Mass.

The Concluding Rites

As the strains of the communion hymn fade, the final section of the Mass begins. By this point, our thoughts may be wandering and it may seem this short section is an inconsequential afterthought to the more important Liturgies of the Word and Eucharist. Far from this, the Concluding Rites are powerful and stand as a personal challenge to each of us.

Blessed

The tumultuous world we live in, with the demands of our daily lives, violence in our city and world, division and animosity in our socio-political sphere, can quickly drag our souls down after we leave the Mass each week. The blessing offered by the priest, always with reference to our triune God (the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit), offers us one more source of strength and grace for our daily lives. We have been fed by the Word, fed by the Body and Blood, now we are fed by a blessing. Blessings are found throughout scriptures and our Catholic traditions. These are moments when words of prayer and offerings of grace are made. Whether it is the beautiful blessing found in the earliest words of Genesis (22:17) offering hope for the future and fulfillment of God's promises, Numbers (6:24-26) offering God's peace, or the blessings we hear in the Beatitudes, the final blessing of Mass invites you to encounter God in hope.

We Choose

We are a faith that believes in free will. We have to choose to accept the blessing, accept God's grace. Moses spoke of this to Israel (Deuteronomy 15-20). With God's blessing comes the choice to live that blessing in the world, to follow the teachings we heard, to grow in holiness, to fulfil our call to discipleship.

That Who We Consume, Must Become Who We Are


The final words of the Mass are the dismissal. The root of the word Mass comes from the Latin word for "mission." The Mass blesses us and sends us on a mission. After hearing the living Word of God, consuming the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist we are sent to the world.

We must become He who we consumed for the world. We are called to be Christ for the world. St. Teresa of Avila wrote, "Christ has no body but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours." We are called to become Christ for the world through our words, actions, and prayers. We are called to manifest God's mercy, grace, and compassion to all those we encounter. The Mass sends us out as witnesses to the world. "To be a witness means to live in such a way that one's life would not make sense if God did not exist," wrote Madeleine L'Engel.

You have a singular call to live as a disciple that no one else can fulfil. You are called to go out to share the Good News of salvation with others. You are called to love your neighbor and your Lord as you are loved. The Mass is God offering you the guidance, grace, and Eucharist to sustain you as you fulfill that call.
