

Message from the Rector



Dear Easter People,

Driving a car may appear easy, but tremendous concentration is needed. We need to keep our eyes on the road and know what is happening all around us. The rearview and side mirrors are important to provide views from other angles while driving.

The image of a car can be likened to our individual lives. We need to keep our “eyes on the road” of life. However, it is important to let our Lord Jesus do the steering. We are not always in control. We need to keep our hands on the wheel, but allow the Lord to grasp the wheel with us. Unfortunately, too many people spend their life only using the rearview mirror. What do I mean?

It is impossible to properly drive a car with your eyes riveted only on the rearview mirror. The car moves forward, but our vision in the rearview mirror focuses on what is only behind us. Too many people spend their entire life living in the past. Life moves forward, but some people cannot let go of past experiences. Why do you think the windshield of a car looking forward is so large and the rearview mirror is so small? Enjoy the full horizon of life moving forward and the rearview mirror of life in proper proportion. The Lord says, “I love you and I forgive you—let it go.”

We need to live a balance between the past, present and future. All are important. However, God is found in the present moment. Our individual past experiences are important, but living life only in the past robs us of the beauty and joy of the present moment and looking ahead. Life is a profound gift connecting the past, present and future. I share with you a reflection written by an individual on his 70th birthday some years ago. Enjoy and pass it on

Lord, you know better than myself that I am growing older and will someday be old. Keep me from the fatal habit of thinking I must say something on every subject and on every occasion. Release me from craving to straighten out everybody's affairs. Make me thoughtful, but not moody; helpful, but not bossy. With my vast store of wisdom, it seems a pity not to use it all but you know, Lord, that I want a few friends at the end. Keep my mind free from the recital of endless details—give me wings to get to the point. Seal my lips on my aches and pains. They are increasing and love of rehearsing them is becoming sweeter as the years go by. I dare not ask for grace enough to enjoy the tales of others, but help me to endure them with patience. I dare not ask for improved memory, but a growing humility and a lessening cocksureness when my memory seems to clash with the memories of others. Teach me the glorious lesson that occasionally I may be mistaken. Keep me reasonably sweet. I do not want to be a saint—some of them are so hard to live with—but a sour old person is one of the crowning works of the devil. Give me the ability to see good things in unexpected places and talents in unexpected people and give me the grace to tell them so. Amen.

And, by the way, this evening turn all your problems and concerns over to God before going to bed—God is going to be up all night anyway!







Accompanying People and Families Facing Mental Health Challenges

Beginning **Tuesday, April 3 at 6:30 p.m.**, Holy Name Cathedral Parish will host a five week series that will provide an overview of mental illness, faith-based supports for those who accompany people with mental illnesses and community resources that are available. Speakers will include, on various evenings, members of the Archdiocesan Commission on Mental Illness, a psychiatrist, a psychologist and a panel of family members who will speak from experience.

People with mental illness and their families may feel isolated from their faith community and thus isolated from God. If someone feels rejected by church they feel rejected by God. Isolation is often caused by the stigma associated with having a mental illness. The fear of being judged as inadequate or weak willed, or the misperception that God is punishing them because they did something wrong, or the communities misperception of what mental illness is and how it affects the individual and their families are powerful contributors to the isolation and loneliness that people feel. As a healing community we can support people with mental illness and their families and with unconditional non-judgmental love in the following ways: increase our awareness of mental illness and where to get help; offer prayers and support for individuals and families who are affected by mental illness; serve on parish communities for outreach to individuals and families; get involved in peer ministry; and work on the justice issues affecting mental health care.
