



Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

Happy Mother's Day! This Wonderful Day is dedicated to all Mothers and women everywhere who live in a motherly way—in a unique way with the hand of God touching all of us through a Mother's love.

In a very special way, I want to thank my Mother - now 95 years old - the best Mother in the whole universe for her unconditional love, ability to listen, great homemade chicken soup in time of illness, gift of humor, deep faith, always making God present through hugs and her willingness to be inconvenienced. I truly love you, Mom! And thank you for always being present in the good times and hard days of life.

I can only "see" mothering through the eyes of a son. What goes through the minds and hearts of all our mothers? I share with you a story that was given to me - read and share with family and friends.

The Worry Torch

Is there a magic cutoff period when offspring become accountable for their own actions? Is there a wonderful moment when parents can become detached spectators in the lives of their children and shrug, "It's their life," and feel nothing?

When I was in my 20s, I stood in a hospital corridor waiting for doctors to put a few stitches in my son's head. I asked, "When do you stop worrying?" The nurse said, "When they get out of the accident stage." My mother just smiled faintly and said nothing.

When I was in my 30s I sat in a chair in a classroom and heard how one of my children talked incessantly, disrupted the class, and was headed for a career making license plates. As if to read my mind, a teacher said, "Don't worry. They all go through this stage and then you can sit back, relax and enjoy them." My mother listened and said nothing.

When I was in my 40s, I spent a lifetime waiting for the phone to ring, the cars to come home, the front door to open. A friend said, "They're trying to find themselves. Don't worry - in a few years, you can stop worrying. They'll be adults." My mother listened and said nothing.

By the time I was 50, I was sick and tired of being vulnerable. I was still worrying over my children, but there was a new wrinkle. There was nothing I could do about it. I continued to anguish over their failures, be tormented by their frustrations and absorbed in their disappointments. My friend said that when my kids got married I could stop worrying and lead my own life. I wanted to believe that, but I was haunted by my mother's wan smile and her occasional, "You look pale. Are you all right? Call me the minute you get home. Are you depressed about something?"

Can it be that parents are sentenced to a lifetime of worry? Is concern for one another handed down like a torch to blaze the trail of human frailties and the fears of the unknown? Is concern a curse or is it a virtue that elevates us to the highest form of life?

One of my children became quite irritable recently, saying to me, "Where are you? I've been calling for three days, and no one answered. I was worried." I smiled.

THE TORCH HAS BEEN PASSED!

God has truly blessed my family through the love, care and patience of our Mother. Mom, I love you very much, and yes, I have inconvenienced you a thousand times.

A Blessed, Joyous and Peaceful Mother's Day to all our Moms and to all women who love in a motherly way.



In 1975 he co-founded Chicago's Haymarket Center whose mission is to help those affected by addiction issues in their recovery. Haymarket continues to grow and develop, following the principles of this humble man.

Fr. Mac began the Memorial Day Mass to recognize with gratitude our brave military who valiantly served their country and also to offer prayers for those past and present who struggle with alcohol and substance abuse. Fr. Mac died December 31, 2004 after 68 years of service. His Mass continues.





May Book Club Meeting Thursday, May 24th at 6:30pm

Book: Abuse of Discretion: The Inside Story of Roe v. Wade by Clarke D. Forsythe

Based on 20 years of research, Abuse of Discretion is a critical review of the behind-the-scenes deliberations that went into the Supreme Court's abortion decisions and how the mistakes made by the Justices in 1971-1973 have led to the turmoil we see today in legislation, politics, and public health.


