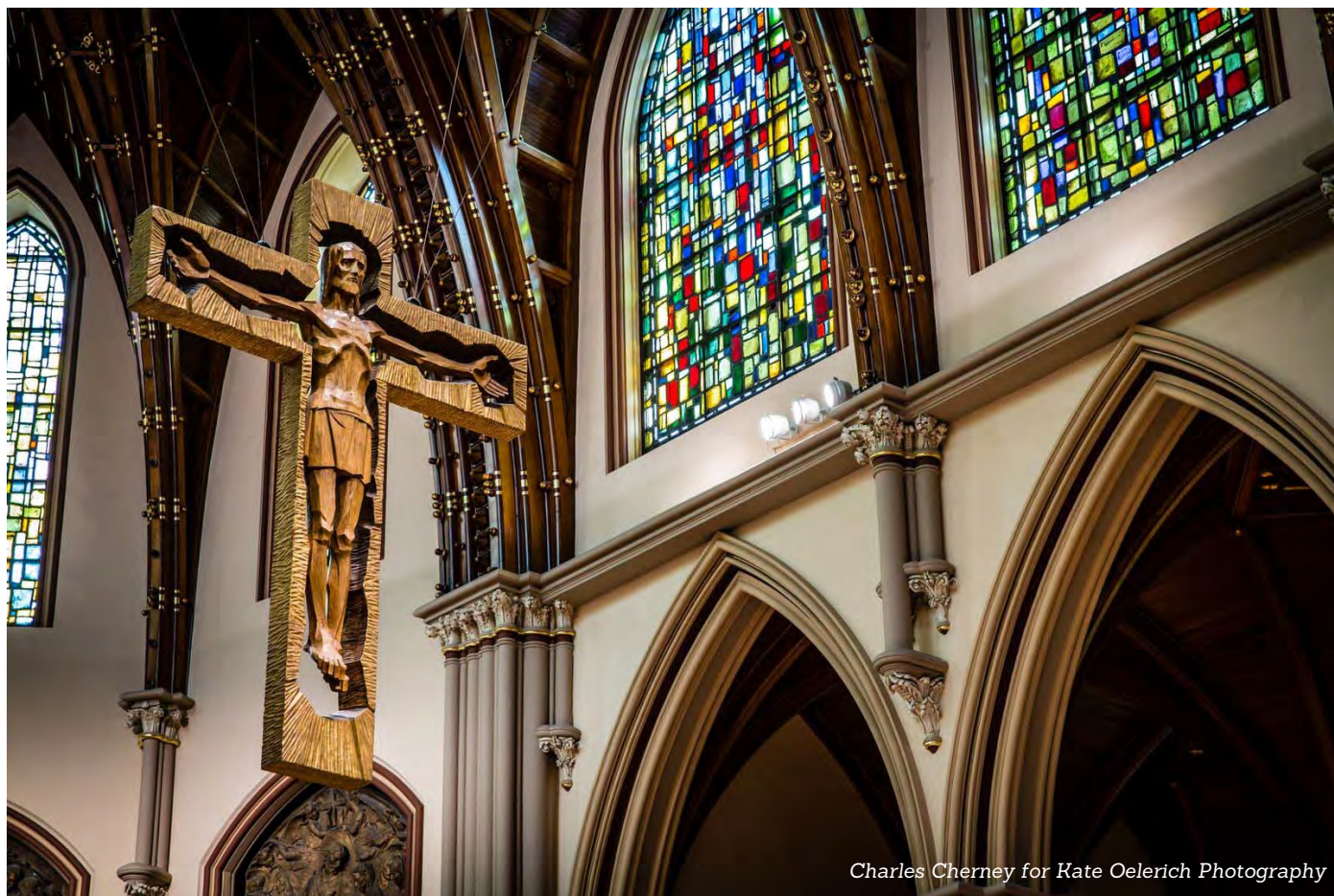

## Our Cathedral, Our Home

### Did You Know?

Ministers of Care (MoC) bring a variety of life experiences, but they all have one common set of capabilities. They bring the presence of Church to those who cannot come to mass. They are present for the patients they visit; listening, praying, and bringing the healing power of Christ by sharing the Holy Eucharist. It isn't about having answers. It is about being there for the patient in a way none of the medical staff can be.

Our MoC community visit any Catholic patient at Northwestern Hospital (Feinberg and Galter), Prentice Hospital, Shirley Ryan Ability Lab, Warren Barr Rehabilitation Center, and the homebound. They bring prayers and communion to patients every day of the week, 365 days a year.

Given the large local population of Catholics in Chicago and the surrounding area, this means our hospitals have a large number of Catholic patients. Our busy community of Ministers of Care make over 30,000 patient visits each year! We welcome anyone who would like to join the ministry.



Each new minister receives extensive training and orientation as well as a mentor to help them in their early ministry. Our last class in Spring 2018 welcomed 28 new ministers. Holy Name's Ministry of Care is supported by staff members, Fr. John Boivin and Lori Doyle, and collaborates with hospital chaplain, Fr. Bill Moriarity.

### Bringing The Comfort of Church to the Sick

Maybe you have been there...or a family member or close friend...in the hospital dealing with a difficult diagnosis, prognosis, or treatment plan. The medical attention is crucial but so is the support and comfort from others. The irony is that while you are surrounded by hospital staff 24 hours a day, one of the hardest parts of being in the hospital is a profound sense of loneliness.

Our Ministers of Care visit the sick, the grieving, the aged, the dying in hospitals, rehabilitation centers, and those homebound. We come together today at Mass as a faith community to pray, be attentive to the Word of God, and be nourished with Jesus, the Bread of Life. But the hospitalized and those homebound cannot come to church. And yet, the comfort of prayer and the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist can be some of the best medicine. Laura (nee Murphy) George knows this all too well.

As a survivor of a near-fatal car crash, she spent years in and out hospitals and rehabilitation centers rebuilding her life, learning to walk, caring for herself, getting a job, meeting and marrying the love of her life, Ed. Together, they joined Holy Name Cathedral about 20 years ago. As the daughter of two Irish Catholics, faith has always been a part of her life and she was happy to be back in church, attending Mass.



Then during a Sunday Mass, Monsignor Dan said something that shook her: "Do not see the cross you bear as an obstacle, but as an opportunity." Just as each one of us hears a message during a reading or homily that resonates, Laura knew she needed to do more with the life God had given back to her. But did that mean going to visit patients facing brain injuries? She asked herself "Am I worthy?" "Am I qualified?" "Would I know what to do?"

"I don't remember a lot of the time in the hospital, but my heart remembered. I realized my life experience gave me the ability to be present for patients. Often it is just having me show up that makes a difference. We talk, pray, and share the Eucharist." Laura discovered what our Ministers of Care learn. It is our presence and listening that patients need.

Rabbi Ed, a chaplain at Northwestern Hospital, observed, "Laura's visits and prayers have connected with patients in a way that surprises the nursing staff. One unresponsive patient with a severe brain injury suddenly engaged after Laura sat at her bedside just talking and listening..." Laura shares, "This patient struggled to talk, and I suggested we pray the Our Father. She didn't think she could do it. But deep down, it was still there, and she prayed out loud with me."

Laura wrote a book in which she shares her experience of bringing Christ and comfort to patients at the hospital as well as the hard part of being back in the hospital. "...Then I noticed similarities in patients sharing their stories. I thought...there has to be more people out there. What if they don't have someone to talk to?" We thank all of our Ministers of Care for all they do to be there for Catholic patients and welcome new ministers to join our giving ministry.



**WORLD YOUTH DAY SYMBOLS - The Icon of Our Lady Salus Populi Romani**

The Icon of Our Lady of Salus Populi Romani is the most venerated image of the Virgin Mary in Italy. The title "Protectress of the Roman People" dates back to the events at the end of the 6th century, when the inhabitants of Rome suffered from a plague.



Today, renowned for its graces, the Icon of the Mother of God is located in the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore. This is a place Romans visit on pilgrimage with many prayer intentions. Starting and completing apostolic journeys at "Saint Mary Major" is also a custom of Pope Francis.

For the first time Our Lady in this image appeared at World Youth Day in the year 2000, when a copy of the icon was placed on the Papal altar at Tor Vergata.
