Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

Today we conclude Catholic Schools Week, a celebration of education, faith, values and tradition. We give thanks for our outstanding Children's Faith Formation program here at Holy Name Cathedral.

Catholic Schools aim to provide coming generations with reasons for hoping and living rooted in religious values that help love this world back into life. We are deeply blessed with an outstanding Catholic grammar school at Francis Xavier Warde.

Learning about our Catholic faith tradition and strong education together calls us to greatness in the Lord. Through the eyes of Christ, we are challenged to see the world differently.

Catholic Schools Week is a celebration of life. We also celebrate, in particular, our children, administration, and teachers.

I share with you two short reflections which beautifully connect faith with the conclusion of our celebration of Catholic Schools Week.

Want to see a miracle? Plant a word of love heart-deep in a person's life. Nurture it with a smile and a prayer, and watch what happens.

An employee gets a compliment. A wife received a bouquet of flowers. A cake is baked and carried next door. A widow is hugged. A gas station attendant is honored. A child is praised.

Sowing seeds of peace is like sowing beans. You don't know why it works: you just know it does. Seeds are planted, and topsoils of hurt are shoved away.

Don't forget this principle. "Never underestimate the power of a seed." — Max Lucado, author of "The Applause of Heaven"

And Carl Jung (psychologist) poignantly adds:

"An understanding heart is everything in a teacher and cannot be esteemed highly enough.

One looks back with appreciation to the brilliant teachers, but with gratitude to those who touched

our human feelings.

The curriculum is so much necessary raw material, but warmth is the vital element for the growing plant and for the soul of a child."

I want to plant this seed; faith-based Catholic education roots our lives in the Jesus story and should permeate all the areas of our life. May our lives always reflect Gospel values as we connect the mystery of God with our daily living.

I conclude with a powerful story ... Great food for thought ...

Henry Nouwen (a great spiritual writer who died in 1996) told the story of a student who returned many years after graduation to sit in his office where many questions had been answered, and many problems had been solved. When the student entered, he told his professor that he didn't need anything; he came to visit, to be together. They sat for a while in silence and looked at each other.

One broke the silence by telling the other how nice it was to see each other. The other agreed, and then there was silence once again.

Then the student said, "When I look at you, it is as if I am in the presence of Christ." The professor remembers that he did not startle or surprise him and could only respond with, "It is the Christ in YOU who recognizes the Christ in ME." The student replied with the most healing words Nouwen had heard in many years. "Yes, Christ indeed is in our midst. From now on, wherever you go, or wherever I go, all the ground between us will be holy ground."



Come to Our Healing Mass and Receive an Anointing

Some may be thinking, why is there a Sacrament for the Sick? Because even in illness, the sick person assists us on our journey of discipleship. “By their witness, the sick show that our mortal life must be redeemed through the mystery of Christ’s death and resurrection” (Pastoral Care for the Sick, 3). People do not ask to be sick or have a chronic illness. But these crosses given to us by God allow us to draw more deeply into the life of Christ, into the paschal mystery, the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus of Nazareth.

Like the other Sacraments, Anointing of the Sick also gives grace. “The Sacrament gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace, the whole person is helped and saved, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against the temptations of the Evil One and anxiety over death.” (Pastoral Care for the Sick, 6) We then see that in this Sacrament, Christ continues to work and bring about Healing as he did in the Gospels. Christ is still with us in our hour of need, walking with us and giving us hope and peace. Celebrating the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is both personal and communal. “Personal” in the sense that the sick person is given the grace of the Holy Spirit; “Communal” in that the community can offer their prayers for the ill person. Often in our society,

the sick, physically and mentally, are pushed off to the fringes to be forgotten about. But this Sacrament brings the sick to the community center to be prayed for and with.

The change in the understanding that not only those on their deathbed can be anointed leads us to the question, who can receive the Sacrament? The answer is those facing imminent death, those gravely ill and before serious surgery, older people with a decline in their overall health, those with chronic illness, and those with mental illness. Also, one can receive the Sacrament of Anointing more than once.

As a priest, I often get called to the hospital to anoint those on their deathbeds. Unfortunately, there was a time I did not make it in time because the call came right as I began to celebrate Mass. On behalf of all priests, do not wait until the final moments to anoint you or a loved one. If a priest is called but cannot arrive in time before death has occurred, then the intention to be anointed will sustain the deceased as they stand before God. But, with the change in the overall understanding of Anointing being for the sick and not just for the dying, hopefully, more people will avail themselves of the Sacrament in time.

Join us on Saturday, Feb. 11, as we celebrate World Day of the Sick with a Healing

Mass at 9am. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be offered during the Mass to those who have examined themselves as needing this Sacrament of Healing.

We are human beings, too, and need time to recharge. A few weeks ago, I took a transitional deacon and some religious sisters on their first trip to Disney Epcot. What? I know, how can that be? Over the past six years, they only read books and study, making frequent visits to the library to get more books.



As we entered the Epcot Center, a woman approached us and asked, “Is that shirt from Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago?” With excitement, Sister Hoa responded, “Yes, it is. How do you know the Cathedral?” The lady said, “Whenever my family and I go to Chicago, we go there for Mass. It is a beautiful Cathedral. I bet you have visited there many times.” Sister An quickly answered, “Well, this is Fr. Ton. He is an associate there....” And from there, the conversation just naturally happened.

The encounter reminded me of St. John Paul II’s words in his 1990 encyclical, *Redemptoris Missio*, “The mission of Christ the Redeemer, which is entrusted to the Church, is still very far from completion. As the second millennium after Christ’s coming draws to an end, an overall view of the human race shows that this mission is still only beginning and that we must commit ourselves wholeheartedly to its service. It is the Spirit who impels us to proclaim the great works of God: ‘For if I preach the Gospel, that gives me no ground for



boasting. For necessity is laid upon me. Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel!” (1 Cor 9: 16). It is so true. The Lord has entrusted us with a mission to evangelize. He calls you and me to bring people to the Lord. How are we doing? Scan the QR code below to continue to read the Encyclical. JMJ

Join Our Lenten Program Caring for Our New Neighbors

Let us take our inspiration from St. Frances Xavier Cabrini. More commonly known as “Mother Cabrini,” she was an Italian missionary who spent much of her life working with Italian immigrants in the United States.

“This courageous sister dedicated her life to bringing the love of Christ to those who were far from their homelands and families,” Pope Francis said, adding that her witness can help us learn “to take care of our foreign brother, in whom Jesus is present, often suffering, rejected and humiliated.” After arriving in the United States, she set up orphanages, hospitals, convents and schools. Eventually, she became a U.S. citizen, died in 1917 and was canonized in 1946 as the first Chicago and American (U.S.) saint. Let us hear her call to assist a new group of asylum seekers who have come to the United States for a better life.

We invite our Faith Community to participate in showing love for our new neighbors, migrant families from Central and South America — approximately 370 individuals currently housed at the former Tremont Hotel, a few blocks from the Cathedral. We are organizing a Lenten program to provide immediate assistance to these families in collaboration with Fourth Presbyterian Church. There will be opportunities to assist with collecting clothing, providing meal programs, Spanish translation for social services, and developing special Lenten worship programs. There will be something for everyone — make this a part of your Lenten almsgiving. Please help us welcome our new neighbors in their time of transition as their long journeys bring them to their new home in Chicago.
