### Reflections from Our Rector\_



#### Dear People of God,

Our Lenten journey to the Cross continues with the Lord. However, the Cross of Christ does not end in death and defeat, but is a victorious Cross of life — life so abundant we call it eternal.

Why Lent? Why these 40 days? Lent is an opportunity to see life through a

different lens. We all get into ruts. At times our life goes into a slump. Lent is a splendid time to squarely face ourselves in the mirror and see our life through the eyes of Christ — the Lord's perspective.

The following story beautifully illustrates how our perspective can help us see life in a fresh way.

One day a father of a very wealthy family took his son on a trip to the country with the firm purpose of showing his son how poor people can be. They spent a couple of days and nights on the farm of what would be considered a very poor family.

On their return from their trip, the father asked his son, "How was the trip?"

"It was great, Dad."

"Did you see how poor people can be?" the father asked.

"Oh yeah," said the son.

"So, what did you learn from the trip?" asked the father.

The son answered, "I saw that we have one dog and they had four."

"We have a pool that reaches to the middle of our garden, and they have a creek that has no end."

"We have imported lanterns in our garden, and they have the stars at night."

"We have a small piece of land to live on and they have fields that go beyond our sight!"

"Our patio reaches to the front yard and they have the whole horizon"

"We have servants who serve us, but they serve others."

"We buy our food, but they grow theirs.

"We have walls around our property to protect us; they have friends to protect them."

With this the boy's father was speechless. Then his son added, "Thanks, Dad, for showing me how poor we are."

Too many times we forget what we have and concentrate on what we don't have in life. What is one person's worthless object is another's prized possession. It is all based on one's perspective. Makes you wonder what would happen if we all gave thanks to God for all we have been provided by Him, instead of worrying about wanting more.

I would also like to close with four "food for thought" sayings my dear mother shared with her children when we were growing up.

- Treat everyone with respect and kindness.
- · Say "yes" whenever possible.
- · Always keep a sense of humor.
- It's not about you always help and serve others.

Lent is the time to put our life into perspective — and let the Lord Jesus take us by the hand and guide our journey.

### In the Church, There are Only Winners in This Election

cathedral in the diocese is known for many liturgical celebrations that are important to the life of the diocese. Examples include:

- · Priesthood and diaconate ordinations, where men are ordained to serve God's people;
- The Chrism Mass, where the oils we use for our Sacraments (Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens) are blessed by the Bishop and distributed to the parishes;
- And the unique installation masses of new bishops where a new shepherd takes leadership of his diocese.

However, the Rite of Election is one celebration often overlooked or is relatively unknown. This event takes place at the beginning of Lent each year and is vital to the life of the local Church.

Last weekend and this weekend. Holy Name Cathedral hosted the Archdiocesan Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion. Those desiring to be baptized into the Church at this upcoming Easter Vigil, and those seeking to be fully initiated or complete their Sacraments of Initiation, come before the Bishop to reaffirm their intention to be admitted to the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation. "Within the Rite of Election, the bishop celebrant or his delegate declares in the presence of the community the Church's approval of the candidates" (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, #122).

The whole Archdiocese is represented in this liturgical event as people from Cook and Lake counties come together to be accepted by the Church for the Easter Sacraments. As each catechumen's and candidate's name is called in the rite, their name echoes throughout the Cathedral, joining the names of many before them found worthy to participate in the Paschal Mystery of Christ.

After the Rite of Election and until Holy Saturday,

the catechumens are called "the elect" because they have been 'elected' to participate in the Sacraments of Initiation at the Great Vigil of Easter, Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, as the Bishop says, "The Church in the name of Christ accepts their judgment and calls you to the Easter Sacraments" (RCIA, #132).

As a Cathedral parish, we must pray for our brothers and sisters who will be baptized into the Church on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil because they will soon call the Cathedral their mother Church, no matter where they belong in the Archdiocese. During this Lenten season, let us be mindful to pray for those preparing to enter in Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. We shall celebrate with them the joy of Easter when they conquer sin and death with our Lord, the same victory we share by our baptism.

parishioner whom I have known for three years approached me after Mass with her family and asked to have a beautiful statue of Mary blessed. As she held the statue, I gave a blessing with holy water, and she began to cry,



breaking the news, "Pray for me, Father. The doctor told me that I have cancer. I am so disappointed and lost. I have two young children." Together with her family, we prayed for her. I returned to the Rectory, heartbroken about the news.

Then, a seminarian friend texted me, "Please pray for my dad. He passed away because of a hit-and-run car accident this morning." Soon after, a friend asked me to pray for her husband because his cancer had returned.

My heart was aching heavily. I prayed to the Lord and gathered advice to respond to those calls and texts. Yet, prayer seemed empty, and advice seemed insufficient. With a heavy heart, I went to the chapel and celebrated Mass, praying for them.

There, a miracle happened. My heart found rest in knowing that God is in control and He will take care of them. St. John Vianney said, "Private prayer is like straw scattered here and there. If you set it on fire, it makes a lot of little flames. But gather these straws into a bundle and light them, and you get a mighty fire, rising like a column into the sky; public prayer is like that." And the Mass is our perfect public prayer in the Catholic Church. JMJ.


