

Have a Cookie

On the Cover

"Jesus the Good Shepherd." Stained glass in Milan, Italy

We are most familiar with images referring to Jesus as the Resurrection and the Life or the Good Shepherd, but in today's Gospel. Jesus



uses the image of 'gatekeeping.' Jesus begins with a parable about a gatekeeper who knows Jesus and opens the gate for the sheep to enter the sheepfold. Since the sheep are familiar with Jesus' voice, they trust him and follow wherever he leads.

Jesus tells this parable explicitly for the Pharisees to identify his role as leader of God's people. When the Pharisees fail to understand Jesus' message, he becomes more direct: "I am the gate for the sheep" (Jn 10: 7). As the gate, Jesus offers safety as well as freedom on the path to salvation. This image opens a richness for reflection. As the gate, Jesus offers access to what nourishes and protects from harm. The risen Lord sustains us in our journey, accompanying us as we move toward the Father.



Listen to the Voice of Jesus, Look to the Blessed Virgin Mary

■his weekend throughout the world, we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday, given its name by the Gospel passage that is read, and because of this, a time to sit and reflect on vocations. A vocation is a call, coming from the Latin word vocare. Each of us has a call in life, a call to holiness, a general vocation



given to each baptized person to be holy and a saint. And through this call of holiness, there is a particular vocation, whether single life, consecrated life, or married life.

And the call-within-a-call fulfills us in our particular vocation. For me, the priesthood has brought a sense of joy, peace, and happiness, where nothing is more appealing than serving God and his Church. For my parents, who celebrate 38 years of marriage this June, my mother finds purpose as a registered nurse in pediatrics and my dad as an employee of the Catholic Cemeteries of Chicago. Vocations come in all forms and calls. But what is essential is that we listen to the voice of the One who calls us. And that is what Good Shepherd Sunday is all about, listening to the voice of Jesus.

To listen and hear the voice of Jesus, we must look to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Traditionally, the month of May is understood as the Month of Mary. During this month, various devotional practices occur, such as reciting the Rosary, creating a Mary altar in your home with a Marian image or statue, and May crowning.

Dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Mother has no precise beginning date but can be traced back to the early Church. Ancient Greeks and Romans had a month dedicated to a goddess associated with fertility, springtime, and new beginnings. When Mary said 'Yes" at the Annunciation, she put God's plan of salvation into motion, a springtime in human history. May is an expulsion of the winter months and a breaking forth of springtime with the flowers that bud and blossom in reaction to the rain showers of April.

At the end of the 13th century, a more formal way of honoring Mary was observed. And it grew as the Jesuits strongly promoted the practice of May dedicated to Mary in the 18th century. In 1587, the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary was composed with additional titles added over the years. In this litany, there are various titles to Mary, in Scripture, tradition and through popular devotion. As with Mary, who is full of grace, all of the titles associated with her, in one way or another, point to her Son, Jesus Christ.

And so, on this World Day of Vocations and Good Shepherd Sunday, what better model to look to than the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose whole life was dedicated to hearing the voice of her Son, the voice of her Savior. As we embark on this new month tomorrow, let us ask Mary to be our guide, to lead us to her Son, whose voice gives meaning and purpose to our lives, whose voice leads us to happiness and guides us to heaven, and desire more earnestly that she continues to pray for us, even at the hour of our death.

an you spot who's missing in this photo? It might be you if the Lord calls you to be a priest! Contact Fr. Tim Monahan at (312) 534-8298 if these words, "'The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me: He



has sent me to continue his prophecy, to bring good news, liberty, healing, and grace."

Before the Chrism Mass on Tuesday during the Holy Week, my Chicago classmates (missing Fr. Ryan who is taking his doctoral studies in Rome and Fr. Rob who was catching up with priest friends) had a short reunion. By the way, if you can locate where we had coffee and be the first person to send me an email, I will take you out for a cup of Cappuccino.

We shared some of our priestly experiences both in time of joy and struggles. Pope Francis, in his Holy Thursday homily, beautifully preached, "We [priests] too experienced an initial anointing, which began with a loving call that captivated our hearts and set us out on the journey; the power of the Holy Spirit descended upon our genuine enthusiasm and consecrated us. Later, in God's good time, each of us experienced a Passover, representing the moment of truth. A time of crisis which took various forms. Sooner or later, we all experience disappointment, frustration and our own weaknesses; our ideals seem to recede in the face of reality, a certain force of habit takes over, and difficulties that once



seemed unimaginable appear to challenge our fidelity."

I remember going to the hospital for an emergency anointing of a person facing imminent death. It was a busy day, and my mind went blank in finding consoling words for family members. When I anxiously approached the hospital room, the wife and her children greeted me and gracefully shared their love and appreciation for priests. The conversation continued with their lifelong encounters with their parish priests at baptisms, First Holy Communion, weddings, galas, etc. They were true "Veronica" and "Simon" for me on that heavy day.

On the World Day Prayer for Vocations, may the Lord send discerners the gift of understanding to discern their service in the Church, the priesthood, diaconate, or consecrated life; and to have courage responding to the Lord's invitation! JMJ.


