

Dear People of God,

How do I "see" in life? What is my perspective or lens I use to filter a situation? A relationship? We always need to keep life in the Gospel in perspective. It is also important to view life from the other person's perspective. The following wonderful

three stories challenge our suppositions - and remember, things aren't always as they appear.

Seeing Eye Dog

A buddy of mine was flying from Seattle to San Francisco. Unexpectedly, the plane stopped in Sacramento. The flight attendant explained there would be a delay, and if the passengers wanted to get off the aircraft, the plane would reboard in 30 minutes.

Cathedral Exterior Update

Why is the left parking lane shut down on Superior? Is that a cherry picker parked next to the Rectory? The short answer is yes, we are doing some greatly needed maintenance to the exterior of our Cathedral home.

Holy Name Cathedral was constructed in 1874. In the past 150 years, the exterior has endured a century and a half of Chicago weather. So now we are taking a comprehensive look at the building. Contractors are completing an assessment of our exterior façade through a visual survey and a sounding survey to determine how every section has held up. In addition, they are creating 3D scans of the decorative elements on the façade. Because our Cathedral home is built of limestone, samples will be taken to examine the underlying backup masonry to discover any further damage that 150 years may have had on the building.

The Countless Gifts, Wonders and Joys of the Priesthood

■his weekend, Cardinal Blase Cupich ordained five men to the Priesthood of Jesus Christ in service to the Archdiocese of Chicago. The five men range between 30 and 35 years old and come from Barrington, Burr Ridge, Crystal Lake, Mexico and Puerto Rico. For some, the path to ordination was clear and



well-defined; for others, the call to serve came after a job in the private sector. Regardless of the age of these new priests when they felt the call, we celebrate with them that what God has begun in them has been and will continue to be brought to fulfillment.

For the Diaconate Ordination, a central aspect is handing the Book of the Gospels, which I reflected on last week. In Priesthood Ordination, there are many aspects to the rite, including the laying on of hands by the concelebrating priests, symbolizing the unity of the Priesthood; the anointing of hands with sacred chrism, the handing on of the chalice and paten, and the kiss of peace.

One aspect of my Priesthood that is special to me is the celebration of the Mass. From my First Communion in May 2003, when I felt the call to be a priest, the Mass has been the foundation which I have built my life around. In the Rite of Ordination for a Priest, after the newly ordained has had their hands anointed with Sacred Chrism, the bishop hands him a chalice with wine and water and a paten with a host on it as he says, "Receive the oblation of the holy people of God. Understand what you will do, imitate what you will celebrate, and conform

your life to the mystery of the Lord's Cross."

By virtue of their office, the priest is to teach, govern and sanctify the people of God through their ministry. Whether preaching, teaching, ministering, accompanying, or simply being present, the priest brings God's love, mercy, forgiveness, and joy to the people he is entrusted to serve. And this aspect of the Ordination Rite is truly beautiful.

Each time a priest celebrates Mass, he receives the gifts of bread and wine from the people of God. And these gifts of bread and wine symbolize humanity's work and suffering. The wheat seeds must be sown, watered, harvested, ground, and baked to make the bread we offer. The grapes must be planted, pruned, harvested, pressed, and fermented to make wine. Our work, along with our daily suffering, are offered with the bread and the wine at every Mass, at the hands of the priest, for the world's sanctification.

The priest stands in the person of Jesus Christ every time he celebrates a Sacrament. The priest prays for us and with us at the altar at every Mass he celebrates that we attend. He prays that God may bless our gifts and ourselves to bring his love to the world. Let us continue to pray for priests, those who have ministered to us throughout our lives and have passed to the next life, that they may enjoy heaven forever. And for those who currently minister to us that they may be faithful and authentic shepherds to God's people; and those who have been called by name by God, that they may answer without fear, and know they will be supported in their journey to the altar. The Priesthood is a gift from Jesus to the Church, so at every Mass, as we always do, let us thank God, for it is right and just.


Cathedral Tours After 8:30, 10:30, 12:30 Masses Today

A Simple Way to Give a Gift



Called to Share Our Gifts

Today, we celebrate the great feast of the Ascension of our Lord. that glorious moment when Jesus, 40 davs after His resurrection, was lifted up quite literally into heaven, as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. It is recounted



in both our first reading, from Acts, as well as the Gospel passage, from Matthew. It must have been an extraordinary thing to witness.

But the first reading tells us that the apostles were not permitted to simply bask in the moment for very long. "While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

In other words, "Don't just stand there, do something!

This verse is a call to each one of us Christian stewards this very day. We have been given every grace and blessing through the Mass and all of the sacraments, through the Word of God, the rich teachings of our faith, and even our talents and our material possessions.

And like those first apostles, we are not meant to just stand here but to do something with these gifts — in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. We are called, just as much as the first apostles "to be [His] witnesses... to the ends of the earth," not with our own power, but through the power of the Holy Spirit in us.
