Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

We celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity this weekend. We also celebrate the marvelous graduating Class of 2023 from Francis Xavier Warde School. Congratulations and God's Blessings to the excellent Class of 2023. May you always walk with the Lord Jesus.

Again, we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. Father-Son-Holy Spirit, which also has been termed Creator-Redeemer-Sanctifier. No matter the language, the essence of the Holy Trinity speaks of relationships and being a life-giver. Do we seek to bring life, hope and joy to all we meet? The Trinity is a relationship of love and unity. Does my life seek to be rooted in life-giving relationships?

The Holy Trinity speaks of balance. Does my life have a balance between work, play, prayer and relationships? Specifically, are God, prayer, family and friends core Gospel values? Work is essential, but a relationship with God (rooted in prayer), family and friends holds life together. Balancing all the responsibilities and areas of life is a lifelong quest. The following story powerfully connects with the Feast of the Holy Trinity in ways we may have never imagined. Enjoy...and pass it on.....

Parachute

Charles Plumb was a U.S. Navy jet pilot in Vietnam. After 75 combat missions, his plane was destroyed by a surface-to-air missile. Plumb ejected and parachuted into enemy hands. He was captured and spent six years in a communist Vietnamese prison. He survived the ordeal and now lectures on lessons learned from that experience.

One day, when Plumb and his wife were sitting in a restaurant, a man at another table said, "You're Plumb! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down!"

"How in the world did you know that?" asked Plumb. "I packed your parachute," the man replied.

Plumb gasped in surprise and gratitude. The man pumped his hand and said, "I guess it worked!"

Plumb assured him, "It sure did. If your chute hadn't worked, I wouldn't be here today."

Plumb couldn't sleep that night thinking about that man. Plumb says, "I kept wondering what he had looked like in a Navy uniform: a white hat, a bib in the back, and bell-bottom trousers. I wonder how often I might have seen him and not even said, 'Good morning, how are you?' or anything because, you see, I was a fighter pilot, and he was just a sailor."

Plumb thought of the many hours the sailor had spent at a long wooden table in the ship's bowels, carefully weaving the shrouds and folding the silks of each chute, holding in his hands each time the fate of someone he didn't know.

Plumb now asks his audience, "Who's packing your parachute?" Everyone has someone who provides what they need to make it through the day. He also points out that he needed many kinds of parachutes when his plane was shot down over enemy territory – he needed his physical parachute, his mental parachute, his emotional parachute, and his spiritual parachute. He called on all this support before reaching safety.

Sometimes in the daily challenges that life gives us, we miss what is important. We may fail to say hello, please or thank you, or congratulate someone on something extraordinary that has happened to them, compliment them, or do something nice for no reason.

As you go through this week, this month, and this year, recognize the people who pack your parachutes – and give thanks to God and each of them!

The Precious Blood Returns to Holy Name Next Sunday

Three years ago, with the emergence of COVID-19, protocols were put in place by the U. S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local health departments to mitigate the spread of the virus. Changes to how we worshipped were also implemented, most notably no physical sign of peace and no reception from the common cup containing the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. On May 11, 2023, the CDC ended the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) Declaration, originally issued on Jan. 31, 2020. Many government protocols have expired with the end of the PHE. It is important to note that COVID-19 is still a potential threat to immunocompromised people, and we must continue to ensure their safety.

With the May 11 declaration, the Archdiocese of Chicago is allowing the Precious Blood to be once again offered to the congregation through a common cup. Here at Holy Name Cathedral, a gradual progression will take place. Initially, starting June 11, the Precious Blood will be offered every Sunday, at the 10:30am Mass, with two stations at the front of the Cathedral. If you have a desire to receive from the cup, please sit in the front section of the main aisle. With the return of the Precious Blood for the congregation, it should be said that for the past three years, and moving forward, only receiving the Sacred Host still is a valid, appropriate, and equal reception compared to receiving both the host and taking from the cup, due to one of our Catholic doctrines.

The Doctrine of Concomitance is a formal teaching and belief of the Catholic Church that says that Christ cannot be divided, since Christ is indivisible. Because of that, the substance of the Eucharist cannot be divided either. In other words, when a communicant receives the consecrated host, they receive the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ. Likewise, with those who only drink from the cup, they receive the fullness of Christ as well,



not just his sacred blood. One does not receive “more” grace or “more” of Jesus if they take Holy Communion under both species. Additionally, the practice of intinction — of dipping the host in the wine — is not allowed in danger of spilling the precious blood on the ground. If you choose to receive from the cup, please take a sip and hand the cup back to the minister.

As we prepare to celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi next weekend, and as the Church in the United States deepens its involvement in the National Eucharistic Revival, it is crucial to understand that receiving communion is meant to do something in us. It is not just something we do, instead, we receive someone who we should become. Receiving Holy Communion invites us to be in union with God and welcome him into our hearts and souls, asking for the grace to allow him to work in us and through us through our words and actions.

As we introduce the Precious Blood weekly at the 10:30am Mass with two stations at the front, remember it is a personal choice to receive or refrain from taking the cup. Either way, we are receiving the fullness of Jesus Christ, who died, so that we might live with him for eternity.

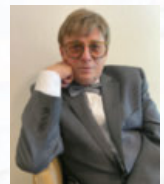
