

## Reflections from Our Rector\_



Dear People of God,

A Blessed and Happy Father's Day to all our Dads — and to all men who love in a fatherly way. What does it mean to love in a fatherly way? To love another person is to see God's face and to ensure our lives mirror God's love for us to others. The love of Jesus reflects

God's love for each of us. Again, with Jesus as our point of reference — what does it mean to love in a fatherly way on this Father's Day?

I share with you a beautiful story that a parishioner gave to me. Enjoy and pass on ...

I grew up in the fifties with practical parents —

A Mother, God love her, who washed aluminum foil after she cooked in it, then reused it. She was the original recycle queen before they had a name for it ...

A Father who was happier getting old shoes fixed than buying new ones.

Their marriage was good, and their dreams focused. Their best friends lived barely a wave away. I can see them now: Dad in trousers, a tee shirt, and a hat; Ma in a house dress, lawn mower in one hand, dishtowel in the other.

It was the time for fixing things — a curtain rod, the kitchen radio, the screen door, the hem in a dress. Things we keep. It was a way of life, and sometimes it made me crazy — all that re-fixing, re-heating, renewing. I wanted just once to be wasteful.

Waste meant affluence. Throwing things away meant you knew there'd always be more. But then my Father died, and on that clear summer's night, in the warmth of the hospital room, I was struck with the pain of learning that sometimes there isn't any "more."

Sometimes, what we care about most gets used up and goes away ... never to return. So ... while we have it ... it's best we love it ... and care for it ... and fix it when it's broken...and heal it when it's sick.

This is true ... for marriage ... and old cars ... and children with bad report cards ... and dogs with bad hips ... and aging parents ... and grandparents. We keep them because they are worth it and because we are worth it.

Some things we keep. Like a best friend that moved away — or a classmate we grew up with. Some things make life meaningful, like parents we know who are special ... so keep them close!

I realize the official start of summer occurs this week! Months and seasons change, too, and so do our lives. At the beginning of this great season, reflect upon these words by Max Lucado from his book In the "Eye of The Storm."

With one decision, history began, Existence became measurable.

Out of nothing came light.

Out of light became day.

Then came sky...and earth.

And on this earth? A mighty hand went to work.

Canyons were carved. Oceans were dug.

Mountains erupted out of flatlands. Stars were flung.

A universe sparkled.

Look to the canyons to see the Creator's splendor.

Touch the flowers and see his delicacy.

Listen to the thunder and hear his power.

Today you will encounter God's creation. When you see the beauty around you, let each detail remind you to lift your head in praise. Express your appreciation for God's creation. Encourage others to see the beauty of his creation.

And have a Blessed and restful Father's Day!

Jesus Christ and his Apostles, Wooden Panel Sculpture, Notre Dame Cathedral, Paris.

Within his many disciples, Jesus picks out twelve for a special role. They are ordinary people, and not yet saints, but they are entrusted with the



most serious of all human tasks, matters of life or death — eternal life or death. We do something similar in the temporal order when we chose twelve ordinary people to deal with matters of life or death when they sit at a murder trial.

The twelve Apostles are Jesus' first clergy, his first priests and bishops, and Peter is his first pope. Even Judas Iscariot was a bishop. But these special people do not remove from the rest of us the task of being missionaries and evangelists; they remind us of our task. They show us in a special way what we all are called to be, just as the special sacred place inside a church building sacrifices all places, and as the special sacred time of the Mass sacrifices all times. Priests do not offer the Mass in place of us but with us.



## John the Baptist's Birthday is Saturday — Here's How We Know

eginnings and endings constantly mark our world. We celebrate birthdays and anniversaries and commemorate death dates and tragic events. And in our liturgical tradition, we celebrate everything. Most of our feast days associated with saints are celebrated on the day the saint has died, marking



their entrance to the promise of eternal life made in the waters of baptism. We have a lot of feast days. We have a lot of saints. But birthdays are one thing we rarely celebrate as part of our Catholic tradition. Only three birth dates are part of and formally celebrated in the whole liturgical calendar.

This Saturday, June 24, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity (the birth) of John the Baptist. We celebrate the other two nativities (births) of the Nativity of the Lord on Dec. 25 and the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Sept. 8. And each of these three nativities has meaning behind them. Dec. 25 is nine months after March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation, when Gabriel announced to Mary that she would be the Mother of God. Sept. 8 is nine months after Dec. 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, where we profess Mary was Immaculately Conceived without the stain of original sin in the womb of her mother, Anne.

So what about June 24? There is no precise date of John's

conception, but we find our answer in Scripture. After the Angel Gabriel visited Mary, she went in haste to her cousin Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, who was in the sixth month of her pregnancy (Luke 1:36). So we know John the Baptist, the cousin of Jesus, is six months older than Jesus. June 24 and Dec. 25 are six months apart.

But there is also another reason for these dates of the nativity of Jesus and John the Baptist. The Gospel of John notes that John the Baptist said, "He must increase, I must decrease" (John 3:30). For those who are into astrology, the summer equinox is June 21, the calendar day with the most extended amount of sunlight. After June 21, the days get a little shorter every day. Dec. 21 is the winter equinox, with the shortest amount of sunlight. After Dec. 21, the days begin to get longer. John the Baptist must decrease, the natural true light of the world starts to get shorter, and Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, must increase his light in a world covered in darkness.


John the Baptist is a central figure in our faith because he teaches us how to prepare the way of the Lord. He called people to conversion and knew when he was in the presence of the Lord. As we prepare to celebrate his birth this week, let us take this opportunity to prepare the way of the Lord in our own lives, seeing the areas where we need to decrease so the Lord's love, mercy, faithfulness, and joy may increase. Everything we do as Catholics has meaning, even the births we celebrate yearly. The greatest gift we can offer John on his birthday is to change our ways because we know the Lord is near.

## Join Us For Our New Salon — "Catholicism after the Scientific Revolution"

#### Saturday, June 24 at 2pm in Rectory

In the 18th and 19th centuries, philosophy, science, and art revolutions took Europe by storm. The Enlightenment was marching forward and large groups of regular people were interested in the new developments. Gatherings called salons opened in bars and homes where experts and artisans were

connected with everyday folks to discuss the issues of their time.

Holy Name Cathedral will present its twist on this old tradition. Join us at our own Salon, as we explore the new and fascinating ways Catholicism is continuing to contribute to the human endeavor, and bring about the greater glory of God. This series is hosted by James Keene from Holy Name Cathedral's Evangelization group.

Our first Salon will be Saturday, June 24 from 2:00pm to 4:00pm in the Rectory and our topic will be "As Below, So Above? Catholicism after the Scientific Revolution."

Since the 17th century, the relationship between physics and the Catholic Church has often been contentious and confused. However, as both of these institutions developed, their rivalry became less clear, and seemingly contradictory positions between them have been examined more recently with increasing scrutiny. Kevin Kadowaki, with his newly minted Ph.D. in the philosophy of physics, will explain the ways these two outlooks on the cosmos interact, and how they most often do not.

Future sessions include Joe Malham, visual artist, iconographer, and aesthete; speaking on Unorthodox Iconographers on July 29 and David Keene, anthropologist and Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago, speaking on "In Service of the Living: the Recovery of Human Remains for the Canonization of Saints" on August 26.

Who is Fr. Theodore? Let him explain: "My vocation story is fairly ordinary.

I lived a comfortable suburban life in Buffalo, NY, and lived to party. I still maintained a faint faith but realized, with the help of a nonreligious friend, that my faith meant nothing unless I lived it. I decided to enter the Catholic Church.

"Being a member of the Church has engaged me in worthwhile risks. I dated, tried a new career, and finally realized that the religious life would fulfill me the most. I entered the novitiate of Marmion Abbey in July 2012 and took the name Theodore (the Studite) when I made a temporary profession of vows in 2013. I made solemn (permanent) vows in the summer of 2016. I have cast my lot with this house, these men, and trust that what the Gospels promise, the monastic experiment can be accomplished.

Fr. Theodore was ordained a priest on September 5, 2020. He continued:

"Monastic life, my friends and community have fostered a stronger internal drive to pursue God, who continues to do the good work he has begun in me. I wake up every day eager to live this life and develop a good zeal for our work."
