All things in life are temporary. If going well, enjoy it; they will not last forever. If going wrong, don't worry; they can't last forever either.


Often when we lose hope and think this is the end, GOD smiles from above and says, "Relax, it's just a bend, not the end!"

Sts. Peter & Paul: A Solemnity (June 29) & its Traditions

As we move further in this long season of Ordinary Time, our liturgy is marked with green vestments and a chronological reading of Matthew's Gospel. We look for moments that break us from this routine. Typically, the feast days and solemnities sprinkled throughout this season cause the liturgical color to change and for us to be moved from our routine to focus on something or someone significant in our tradition.



One such solemnity is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, celebrated annually on June 29. Peter, the first Pope, and brother to Andrew the Apostle, was martyred in Rome on Vatican Hill, upside down on a cross, feeling unworthy of dying in the exact way Jesus Christ died. After his religious experience on the way to Damascus, Paul traveled the world preaching the Gospel to Jews and Gentiles alike. Much of our New Testament bears his authorship for letters to those various communities and he died by the sword in Rome.

It is uncommon for saints to be celebrated together unless they were martyred simultaneously, like Sts. Perpetua and Felicity who are honored on March 7. However, Peter and Paul are celebrated together because they played essential roles in forming the Church. Peter is regarded as the foundation on which the Church is built, as he was given the keys to the kingdom by Jesus (Matthew 16:18). Meanwhile, Paul spread the message of Christ's crucifixion to the world (1 Corinthians 1:23). Both saints initially tried to avoid their callings — Peter by denying Jesus during his

arrest, and Paul by persecuting early Christians. However, their relationship with Christ redeemed both, and their stories serve as an example that we, too, can be forgiven, renewed, and sent out like them.

A unique tradition occurring annually on June 29 is when the Pope blesses the new pallium given to the recently appointed Archbishops. The pallium is then placed on the Archbishop in his diocese by the Nuncio (the Pope's ambassador), at a diocesan liturgy, bringing together the metropolitan area. The pallium is a wool scarf with six black crosses sewn into it. The Archbishop wears three nails representing the three nails pounded into the hands and feet of Christ on the cross. It symbolizes the lamb the Good Shepherd carries on his shoulder just as the Bishop cares for the flock entrusted to them.

The pallium is made of lamb's wool, blessed on the Feast of St. Agnes, Jan. 21. The pallium represents jurisdiction over a territory, the metropolitan area. For the Archdiocese of Chicago, Cardinal Cupich wears the pallium every time he celebrates Mass within his metro area, which includes all of Illinois. The pallium symbolizes the Archbishop's union with the Pope and sharing papal authority in their local jurisdiction.

As we prepare to mark the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, two central figures in the early Church and pillars of our faith tradition, let us look to them as guides on our path as disciples. We are never too far from reconciliation with the Lord for denying him or too far from encountering his risen presence in our day-to-day life. Let us continue, as they did, in serving God's people through our thoughts, words, and actions.

Are You Living Our Mission to be the Light of the World?

On the memorial of St. Anthony of Padua, I shared a side note — How was I named after St. Anthony? After having four daughters, my parents thought the boys might get lost somewhere; they prayed to St. Anthony, and I was born with the name after him.



Have you ever experienced reading or listening to something, and it stays with you for the entire week? In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus says "If salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?" (5:12). Bishop Robert Barron responds to this by saying "That question ought to bother us as much today as it did Jesus'

audience long ago." He means that a weak Christianity is a disaster for the world, for it depends upon the Christian Church to become what it was meant to be.

It is a strong message. Humanity tends to stay in its comfort zone and somehow creates an invisible fearful fence thinking, "All those who were my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine." Therefore, we keep our Christian identity private.

Yet, at the end of this weekend's first reading, Jeremiah says, "But the Lord is with me, like a mighty champion; my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." My question for us is how are we actively living our mission "To Be the Light of the World" zealously in our lives? The first step might be to be aware of God's holy presence in our lives and attentively listen to His voice.

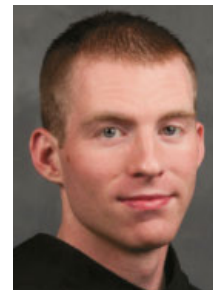
Young Adult Theology on Tap

Who is Fr. Theodore? He was ordained on Sept. 5, 2020 as a priest in the Benedictine order.

He explains: “My vocation story is fairly ordinary. I lived a comfortable suburban life in Buffalo, N.Y., and lived to party. I still maintained a faint faith but realized, with the help of a nonreligious friend, that my faith meant nothing unless I lived it. I decided to enter the Catholic Church.

“Being a member of the Church has engaged me in worthwhile risks. I dated, tried a new career, and finally realized that the religious life would fulfill me the most.

“I entered the novitiate of Marmion Abbey in July 2012 and took the name Theodore (the Studite) when I made a temporary profession of vows in 2013. I made solemn (permanent) vows in the summer of 2016. I have cast my lot with this house, these men, and trust that what the Gospels promise, the monastic experiment can be accomplished.

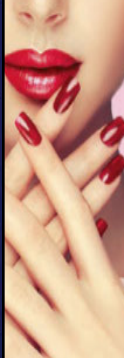
