

Reflections from Our Rector_



Dear People of God,

It is hard to believe July is half over! I hope you are taking the time to create memories with family and friends and take the time to attend Mass!

I share with you a beautiful story given to me. Enjoy and pass it on ...

Our 14-year-old dog Abbey died last month. The day after she passed away, my 4-year-old daughter Meredith cried and talked about how much she missed Abbev. She asked if we could write a letter to God so that when Abbey got to heaven, God would recognize her. I told her that I thought we could do so, and she dictated these words:

Dear God.

Will you please take care of my dog? She died yesterday and is with you in heaven. I miss her very much. I am happy you let me have her as my dog even though she got sick.

I hope you will play with her. She likes to swim and play with toys. I am sending a picture of her so you will know she is my dog when you see her. I really miss her.

Love. Meredith

We put the letter in an envelope with a picture of Abbey and addressed it to God/Heaven. We put our return address on it. Then Meredith pasted several stamps on the front of the envelope because she said it would take lots of stamps to get the letter all the way to heaven. That afternoon she dropped it at the post office. A few days later, she asked if God had gotten the letter yet.

I told her that I thought He had.

Yesterday, a package wrapped in gold paper appeared on our front porch addressed 'To Meredith' in unfamiliar handwriting. Meredith opened it. Inside was a book by Mr. Rogers called, 'When a Pet Dies.' The letter we had written to God in its opened envelope was taped to the inside front cover. On the opposite page were the picture of Abbey & Meredith and this note:

Dear Meredith.

Abbey arrived safely in heaven. Having the picture was a big help, and I immediately recognized her.

Abbey isn't sick anymore. Her spirit is here with me just like it stays in your heart. Abbey loved being your dog. Since we don't need our bodies in heaven, I don't have any pockets to keep your picture in, so I am sending it back to you in this little book for you to keep and have something to remember Abbey by.

Thank you for the beautiful letter and your mother for helping you write it and sending it to me. What a wonderful mother you have. I picked her, especially for you. I send my blessings daily, and remember that I love you very much. I'm easy to find. I am wherever there is love.

And I conclude this midsummer article with more "food for thought."



The Gospel reminds us that the fruitfulness of the earth and our own lives should not be taken for granted. Matthew describes Jesus as teaching a parable about planting

The Spirit is Alive with the Exciting Changes in the Church

■he Catholic Church is on all seven continents. Yes, even in the Antarctic, the Catholic Church is there for those who serve the Argentinian research base in Esperanza Bay. With the Church worldwide, endless news stories are essential to be aware of at the universal, national and local levels.



Since October 2021, the Universal Church has been engaged with the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, otherwise known as the Synod on Synodality. Synod comes from two Greek words, 'syn' and 'hodos,' meaning "on the journey with." This Synod focuses on listening to each other as we walk together on the journey of life and faith. Since the Second Vatican Council, the Universal Church has undertaken 15 other General Synods, the most recent being the Synod on Young People in 2018.

A Synod is an opportunity to gather representatives worldwide to focus on a common topic. Other themes for past Synods have been Marriage and Family Life (2015), Formation of Priests (1990), and Evangelization in the Modern World (1974). Since the first Synod in 1967, the body of consultors typically consisted of bishops and priests worldwide. Pope Francis has widened that participation to include laymen and laywomen.

This Synod is so groundbreaking that the delegates appointed by the Vatican, around 400 in total, including men and women, ordained, consecrated, and lay people, all have the power to vote on the Synod proceedings. Cardinal Cupich has been named as a delegate for this Synod, along with Cardinal Joseph Tobin from Newark, N.J., Cardinal Wilton Gregory from Washington, D.C., and Cardinal Robert McElroy from San Diego, Calif. The United States will have around 20 delegates at the Synod. This Synod represents an exciting time for the Church, with a wide variety of delegates bringing their experience

of the Church and walking with others to address growing issues we face today.

The Church in the United States has embarked on a three-year Eucharistic Revival, culminating in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July 2024. This year (2023) is designated the "Parish Year" for the revival. Parishes are encouraged to address the shocking reality that a 2019 Pew Research Survey revealed that seven in 10 people believe the Eucharist is a symbol and not the Real Presence of Jesus contained in the Eucharist. For 2,000 years, Catholics have professed Christ present in the Eucharist, and countless people have died defending this belief. This revival aims at rediscovering the wondrous mystery of the Eucharist and the power it should have in our life. As I say at every Mass, in the words of St. Augustine, reception of the Eucharist should allow us to "see what we believe in, and become what we receive."

The Church in Chicago is moving into the "Building the New Reality" phase of the Renew My Church Initiative, which began in 2015. The Archdiocese of Chicago, comprised of Cook and Lake Counties, now has 220 parishes, a decrease from the 356 parishes in 2015. Recently, the Archdiocese redrew the Vicariate (regional) boundaries to balance the placement of parishes. The same thing is currently underway to redraw the deanery (local boundaries) to accommodate these changes. This new phase of "Building a New Reality" is meant to put into action the goals set by the Archdiocesan parish groupings, such as sharing resources, becoming more welcoming, deepening the worship experience and engaging the local community.

Many exciting things are happening on the Church's universal, national, and local levels. Often, we think the Church doesn't change. But in these three examples, we see the Spirit is still alive and at work in the Church, calling her people to listen, to walk with, and to allow Jesus to change us from within, so His love will be externally shared with those around us.

Vision 2025: Our Five-Year Strategic Plan

An Implementation Update

Vision 2025, our fiveyear strategic plan, is the culmination of a nearly two-year strategic planning process by Holy Name Cathedral begun in 2018. The plan defines our vision, mission and value statement (see graphic to the right) to guide us with clear goals and tactics for building and nurturing a thriving, vibrant Faith Community.

Initially presented to our Faith Community in the fall of 2020, Vision 2025 relies on the inspiration and guidance of the Holy Spirit. The leaders of this

strategic planning effort (the Strategic Planning Board, led by parishioner, Cheri McEssy) sought and received input from parishioners, parish staff, lay and ordained members of the Archdiocese of Chicago, and visitors through surveys, focus group discussions, interviews, and a planning retreat. Their candid, wide-ranging input facilitated the creation of a plan that addresses HNC's strengths. challenges, and opportunities as both a parish and seat of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Emerging from the pandemic, we are fully engaged in implementing Vision 2025. Our strategic plan is organized into seven key areas or 'Pillars,' each focusing on a critical priority for the

A dedicated Cathedral staff member leads the work to achieve the plan's goals for each of these Pillars. Their work is supported by a Pillar Advisory Council (PAC) with lay leaders who provide counsel and

oversight for implementing the Pillar's plans, including crucial milestone checkpoints.

Over the upcoming weeks, we will share the goals, key tactics, and progress that each of our Strategic Pillars has made since launching our five-year plan.

And the recent Parish Survey (aka the Disciple Maker Index) will be utilized by our Pillar Advisory Councils as well as the Parish Pastoral Council, the Strategic Planning Oversight Council, and the Finance Council to make adjustments and identify new opportunities for us to implement our Vision fully.

The life of the artist is well known to be peculiar, encompassing demands that most people find unusual in the pursuit of craft and creativity. Stewardship Reflection

Trusting in the Master Gardener

In today's Gospel from Matthew. our Lord shares the Parable of the Sower who scatters seeds on many different kinds of land. This



is a wonderful analogy for the stewardship way of life, demonstrating the slow and steady, yet powerful effect this lifestyle will have on those who fully embrace it.

In this parable, some of the seeds land on a path where birds carry them off before they can begin to take root. Other seeds land on rocky ground with little soil. As soon as things begin to heat up, they get scorched and die. Then there are seeds that land on soil cluttered with thorns which choke the seeds just as they are beginning to grow strong.

Finally, there are seeds that land on deep and healthy soil. These seeds produce abundant fruit.

This is where the stewardship way of life comes in. When we give the best of our time, talent and treasure to serve God and others, we create lives filled with that rare "good soil" needed for the Kingdom of God to thrive.

How does this happen? Stewardship living removes the "rocks" of mistrust from our lives as we develop an unshakeable faith that God will always provide for our needs. It clears away the "thorns" of worldly ambition that make us self-centered, fill us with needless anxiety and stifle our focus on God. Stewardship living requires a deep reliance on the Word of God and the sacraments which continuously nourish and fertilize the soil of our lives.

Let us deepen our commitment to this way of life, allowing the Sower to do His work in us, slowly and steadily. The Master Gardener will surely produce miraculous fruits through us.
