Paul is clear that we must not conform to 'this age.' (Romans 12: 2). We must put aside the old ways of competitive calculation that



belong to the Adamic humanity. Just as God is always improvising and doing something new and surprising to save all, we must also renew our minds to discern and follow God's creative, novel acts. Not conforming to the world but renewing the mind enables the psalmist and compels Jeremiah to follow God's will and share God's words despite opposition and ridicule.

This is precisely what Peter is unable to do in Matthew 16. Having just confessed Jesus as the Messiah, Peter fails to change his thinking further when Jesus talks about his suffering and sacrifice at the hands of the powerful. Unable to discern and follow God's will in ways that will please God, Peter risks becoming a stumbling block rather than a rock on which the Church is built.

# Replacing our Ciboria, an Important Part of Liturgical Life

**O**ur liturgy has many objects that assist us in our worship. Ritual books, the altar, bread and wine, candles, and sacred vessels that contain the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ after the priest consecrates them. These liturgical objects help us practically in our worship, and each object helps point to a deeper reality of what our worship invites us to be drawn into — an encounter with the living God.

One of these objects is the ciborium. The ciborium is a sacred vessel, blessed before it is used during liturgies, for the distribution of Holy Communion, and to reserve the consecrated hosts in the tabernacle for sick visits and other pastoral needs. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, “sacred vessels should be made from precious metal” (GIRM, 328). Our current ciboria are silver and have been used daily for over 15 years.

The use of precious metal for the sacred vessels points to what it contains. Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist, and because we believe that, we would want a vessel worthy of that reality. Precious metal does not break easily if dropped and has durability due to constant usage. Spiritually, the ciborium could be seen as the manger, the feeding trough Jesus laid in as a baby, signifying the world coming to him to feed off his life-giving body. It also can be seen as the cross, from which Jesus was nailed to for us to be set free from sin and death. Ultimately, the ciborium is a vessel that reminds us we come together from different walks of life and backgrounds and are fed the same meal to sustain us on life’s journey to help us become more like Jesus Christ.

As with other items we use constantly in our lives, things are worn down and begin to need replacing. Our ciboria are one such object in our liturgical life. The Cathedral annually hosts numerous significant events such as Ordination Masses, Chrism Mass, the joyful celebrations



of Christmas and Easter, and daily and weekly Masses. After more than 15 years, as we have gathered together as the Church to celebrate the saving actions of Jesus Christ contained in the Eucharist, we now need to replace our current ciboria with new ones. The new ciboria will be gold plated, replicating a similar design as we currently use.

Towards the end of this calendar year, we will install a new tabernacle, which becomes the appropriate time to look for new ciboria. To financially support this need, the Worship and Stewardship Pillar Advisory Councils are working together to make this possible by offering individuals and families the opportunity to engrave a ciborium in honor or memory of a loved one. You may find all of the details of this opportunity on Page 10 on the Stewardship page of today’s bulletin.

Next year, in 2024, the Cathedral parish will celebrate 175 years as a Faith Community. And in 2025, the Cathedral will celebrate 150 years as the seat of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The gift of these new ciboria and tabernacle will remind those who come to worship here that everything we say and do is done for honor, the praise, and the glory of the Most Holy Name of Jesus for decades to come.

## Filling Your Spiritual Backpack: Sr. Thea Bowman

**Sunday, Sept. 17, after the 5:15pm Mass**

Born Dec. 29, 1937, in Mississippi, Sr. Thea Bowman became Catholic at age nine and entered the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration at age 15. Sr. Thea began a unique ministry of breaking down racial and cultural barriers through lively gatherings



that combined singing, gospel preaching, prayer, and storytelling, rooted in African-American Catholicism.

She died in 1990 after a six year fight with breast cancer. The U.S. Bishops endorsed the sainthood cause for Sr. Thea, and was granted the first step of the process by the Vatican.

## Leave a Golden Legacy with Ciboria Engraving

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life, and Church regulations call us to hold it in the highest honor and give it the greatest care. In the coming months, Holy Name Cathedral will be dedicating a new tabernacle as the sacred dwelling place for the Blessed Sacrament. This newly designed tabernacle incorporates the historic art and architecture of our beautiful Cathedral.



As we dedicate a new tabernacle, we will also purchase new ciboria. The ciborium — *Ciboria is the plural of ciborium* — is the sacred vessel used for distributing Holy Communion and reserving the consecrated hosts in the tabernacle. Holy Name Cathedral's new ciboria will be gold-plated and available for engraving.

Memorialize a loved one or honor someone special with an engraved ciborium. Fourteen new ciboria will be available for engraving for use at daily and weekend Cathedral Masses, as well as all highly attended Cathedral Masses, including Holy Thursday, Easter, Christmas, the Chrism Mass, and Ordination Masses.

The requested donation for each engraved ciborium is \$2,000. Those who order an engraved ciborium will be invited to a special blessing where they will have an

opportunity to see the engraving on the ciborium, and present it during the Mass.
