

### Reflections from Our Rector\_



Dear People of God,

Our Advent journey continues, but we can become so carried away with tasks we need to accomplish this Advent Season that we may miss the ride! As many of you know, I always enjoy terrific one-liners. I keep the following posted on the mirror in my bedroom:

"No one can go back and start a new beginning, but anyone can start today and make a new ending."

Advent is about waiting, preparation and joyful anticipation. The Advent Season is about beginnings, endings and seeking God unexpectedly on His terms. Advent is darkness giving way to light and birth -Christmas morn! Do we see the light of God already shining within us to be shared year-round with others especially the poor and homeless?

Paula D'Arcy has written outstanding books, which I highly recommend. Her book, Seeking with All My Heart, poignantly captures the image of light in the following way. She quotes the following:

In her book Word Painting, Rebecca McClanahan writes: "In 1998, scientists recorded the first sighting of what they termed 'deep light,' a mysterious light that emanated from the ocean floor. The discovery of this light, which was too faint to be perceived by the human eye and could be accessed only through a special camera, seemed to suggest that undersea objects produced their radiance independent of the sun.

That is a beautiful description. It was a scientific acknowledgment that the very light that sustains life lies within. But it is not only valid for undersea objects on the ocean floor. We are supported in the same manner. It is a choice for us whether we'll live out of that knowing, living at the edge of our lives, aware that light is there, producing radiance from within. We decide whether the faint light within is brought to its most total brilliance. The light is simply there, waiting. Having a life is an unbearable gift. So much rests on our own choices.

How do we make the light of God within us visible to others? Judith Ackerman shares this touching story.

It was November 29, 1963, the day after Thanksgiving,

in Youngstown, Ohio, where I managed the Santa Photo Shop at our largest department store. Soon after opening, we had a long line of harried parents - their faces touched with sadness over President Kennedy's assassination a week earlier – while their young children couldn't wait for their turn to see Santa. The line stretched from Santa's Throne through the toy department to the elevator doors. The parents were impatient to get on with their shopping. Santa was doing his best without shortchanging any child.

At one point, the elevator doors opened, and a young boy in a wheelchair exited, pushed by an elderly gentleman, his grandfather, I assumed. The man looked at the long line and said, "Should we come back another day, Johnny?"

The boy's disappointment was obvious, but before he could respond, a young girl spoke up at the end of the line: "You can get in front of me." This happened repeatedly, as one child after another gave up a place in line. I heard no complaints from the parents as their children chose to wait a bit longer for their turn. I sincerely hope those children got an extra gift from Santa that year. I'm sure they each earned a smile from God.

Keep an eye out while Christmas shopping in the malls. You might run smack-up against the spirit of the season! Daylight continues to grow shorter in the next ten days. Yet, may our lives always remain light and hopeful for others. For the darkness gives way to light and hope - Christmas morn!

### Our Lady of Guadalupe, Deepen our Faith and Pray for Us

■he Blessed Virgin Mary is arguably one of the most well-known women in history. She is even shown honor in all three major monotheistic religions. For us as Christians, if it were not for her "Yes!" to the angel Gabriel when he brought her the news that she was to be the mother of the Son of God, we would



not be in the sacred time of Advent to prepare for His coming among us.

A fascinating reality of our devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary throughout the Universal Church is her numerous and different apparitions throughout the centuries. From Lourdes to Fatima, to Knock, to Tamil Nadu, India, to Champion, Wisconsin (the only approved American apparition site for Mary), in each of these apparitions, she takes the local customs and culture to be her own.

On Tuesday, Dec. 12, the Universal Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. In 1531, on the hill of Tepeyac near present-day Mexico City, the Blessed Virgin first revealed herself to a poor indigenous peasant named Juan Diego. Our Lady asked that a church be built on the apparition site. Initially reluctant, Juan came to believe after his uncle was miraculously cured. He brought roses to the bishop and requested that a church be built. As Juan Diego opened his tilma (cloak), the roses poured out, and the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe as we know it today was imprinted on the fabric.

The tilma, to the present day, is still intact and enshrined above the main altar at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City, the most visited Catholic shrine in the world and the third most visited sacred site in the world. Over the past 400 years, scientific analysis cannot explain how the image was imprinted on the tilma. At its core, it is a miracle. No paint, stitching, or embroidery is there; nothing can explain how the image got there or how it has stayed visible for so long.

What is remarkable about the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is the deep symbolism throughout the tilma. In the image of Mary, her eyes are cast downward, showing us she is human. She wears a blue mantle and a rose-colored robe with fur cuffs and Aztec flowers which all point to her royalty. We know she is pregnant based on the placement of the black band around her waist. She stands on the moon and before the sun, symbolizing Aztec gods. Her placement on top and before them shows her God is more significant. Throughout this image, Mary uses Aztec symbols so that Juan Diego and the Aztec people understand that the God she worships is greater than the Aztec gods they falsely worship.

As we continue our Advent journey, let us look to Mary as our guide. In these dark days of winter, we look for a light. We look for peace and comfort. The light we seek is Jesus of Nazareth. Mary, throughout history, always points us to her Son, who is what we are searching for. May Tuesday's celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe deepen our faith in the One who sets us free as we join our voices in the Advent anthem: Come. Lord Jesus!

There were displays of first-class relics, and Lisbon is home to some beautiful churches. The main events involved celebrating Adoration and Mass with Pope Francis. Some people even go to see him up close.

We visited the birthplace of St. Anthony of Padua. Here, we celebrated the Eucharist, created our own third-class relics, and walked around Fatima singing "Ave Maria" as part of a nighttime candle-lit vigil. One priest, who was a part of my group, even said special graces are bestowed on those who attend WYD. Through the intercession of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, patron of WYD and the Mediatrix of Graces Herself, our Mother Mary, the Lord offered me very tangible graces. I felt called to go on this pilgrimage to prepare for a "New Morning" in my life.

While in Lisbon. I felt called to become closer to Jesus in Adoration, be more involved in Holy Name Cathedral, and learn about Divine Mercy through the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I learned to slowly but surely trust that God's plan is better than my own and to gradually let go of anxieties about the future. I became a Young Adult Leadership team member and a Frassati small group leader. These experiences and many more that I didn't list were all new to me and usually would be overwhelming, but it didn't feel like that. Overall, the experience was invaluable, and I look forward to returning to the next WYD in Seoul, South Korea. I hope you also join me.


