"Come and See" (1995-1997) by Franco Vignazia, Chiesa di San Giovanni Battista di Coriano, Forlí, Italy

"Give me chastity, but not yet." This famous prayer of St. Augustine well captures the reluctance that most of us have to changing our



ways. Yet, we hear the exact opposite when the Ninevites instantly repent at Jonah's preaching and the fishermen immediately leave their nets to follow Jesus. There is an urgency regarding the time, and a totality of response is needed. In Ordinary Time in the liturgical year, it may seem more natural to settle into the ordinary ways in which we have been living out our discipleship. Instead, these Scriptures urge us to recognize that a new time presses upon us, requiring different responses than before. There is nothing ordinary about the invitation to follow Jesus more radically in this urgent time.

When we think the end is near, we lost some of our inertia toward change. But to turn around all of our global ills requires profound turning around of our patterns of living. Still, we find ourselves reluctant, praying with Augustine, "yes, but not yet."

On Word of God Sunday, Renew Our Call as Stewards

n Sept. 30, 2019, Pope Francis published a motu propio entitled Aperuit Illis, "He opened their minds." In this document, the Holy Father designated the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as the Word of God Sunday. It was published on Sept. 30, the Feast Day of St. Jerome, the person responsible for translating



the Hebrew Scripture into Latin. This enormous undertaking, which took Jerome over 15 years, drastically helped spread the Christian Scripture and message worldwide. And we know, following our Lord, who is the Word made flesh, and reading through the majority of the Scripture in our liturgy over the lectionary cycles, that many themes are found in our Scriptures: mercy, love, encounter, forgiveness, hope.

One theme found in the Word of God often overlooked is the theme of stewardship. Stewardship is one of the first themes found in the Scriptures, tracing its beginning to the story of creation. Stewardship is the sharing of time, talent, and treasure. After creating the world and all that is in it, God gave humanity the charge and care over all creation (Gen 1:28). From the early moments of humanity, we have been tasked to care for the world and others.

Continuing to learn about our faith in the Scriptures, we hear proclaimed in the first Letter of St. Peter: "As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one

another as good stewards of the multifaceted grace of God." (1 Peter 4:10). Each of us have unique gifts. St. Paul says in his first letter to the Corinthians that these gifts belong to the one body, and though we are many parts, we are one body in Christ (1 Cor. 12:12). The Word of God then inspires us, calls, and an even challenges us to be good stewards of the gifts we have received from God.

As we celebrate Word of God Sunday this weekend, let us renew our call as stewards of the gifts God has given us and share them. Here at Holy Name Cathedral, we take up various tasks through Worship, Service and Evangelization to empower our sense of stewardship, of making the Word of God come alive for us in word and deed. Being a good steward may mean sharing your time as a volunteer for a Cathedral ministry. It may mean increasing or beginning to contribute to the Sunday collection at Mass. It may mean offering your talents for a project the Cathedral is undertaking. Whatever the Lord is moving in your heart, the Word of God inspires us to continue His mission and the mission of the Cathedral of "forming a community of disciples who inspire, nurture, and join people on their faith journey to encounter and grow in Jesus Christ."

As Jesus says in the Gospel of Matthew, whatever you do in secret, your father in heaven will repay you in secret (Matthew 6:3-4). We, as Christians, have a duty to share our time, talents, and treasures on this journey of life. May today be the day we begin to take that call to heart and put the Word of God into action.


Included in this bulletin is the Statement of Operating Activities for Fiscal Year 2023. This report details our operating income and expenses and shows a deficit of \$426,859. Operating expenses include staff and clergy salaries, building maintenance and operating costs, ministries to serve our communities, and the beautiful music that supports our worship.

Currently, the average weekly donation to the Sunday offertory collection is \$20 and for that we are very grateful. We are asking you to prayerfully reflect on your current giving to the Sunday offertory collection and consider increasing it to the best of your ability, by 5% if possible. If you are a parishioner who currently does not donate to the Sunday offertory collection, we ask that you consider becoming an active contributor.

If every parishioner participates in the Sunday offertory collection and donates an amount to the best of their ability, we are confident this deficit can be eliminated. By eliminating the deficit, we can focus all our energy and attention on growing our existing ministries and offering new ones that fulfill the spiritual needs of our faith community and beyond.

Holy Name Cathedral's Ministry of Care is dedicated to engaging fellow Catholics in prayer, reflection, and support so these individuals feel the comfort of faith when faced with a serious illness or chronic disease. Ministers of Care (MOCs) visit Catholics while they are undergoing treatment in a healthcare facility or facing an illness that has them homebound. Ministers comfort these individuals by offering conversation, a listening presence, the comfort of prayer, and sharing the Eucharist. Through the compassion extended by Ministers of Care, individuals in need of care experience the nearness of God and a connection to their faith community as they journey on the road to recovery. Ministers of Care visit people in their homes or at one of our local healthcare facilities.

Ministers of Care serve weekly or twice monthly for approximately two hours each time. Comprehensive training and continuing education are provided to those who serve in the Ministry. Just click on the QR code to


