

Reflections from Our Rector_



Dear People of God,

Our Lenten journey to the cross with the Lord has begun. The ashes were marked on our foreheads last Wednesday, reminding us to commit ourselves to a season of repentance, change, and prayer. Will this Lenten Season come and go like any other

40-day period? Or can the Lenten Season allow me to probe my heart and look for an area of my life that needs change, healing or growth?

Erma Bombeck, the well-known author, wrote the following reflection after she found out she was dying from cancer. Bombeck's honest self-evaluation allows us to look within our hearts and change - while there is still time!

If I Had My Life to Live Over

I would have gone to bed when I was sick instead of pretending the earth would go into a holding pattern if I weren't there for the day.

I would have burned the pink candle sculpted like a rose before it melted in storage.

I would have talked less and listened more.

I would have invited friends for dinner even if the carpet was stained or the sofa had faded.

I would have eaten the popcorn in the "good" living room and worried much less about the dirt when someone wanted to light a fire in the fireplace.

I would have taken the time to listen to my grandfather ramble on about his youth.

I would have shared more of the responsibility carried by my husband.

I would have never insisted that the car windows be rolled up on a summer day because my hair had just been teased and sprayed.

I would have cried and laughed less while watching television and more while watching life.

I would've never bought anything because it was practical, wouldn't show soil, or was guaranteed to last a lifetime.

Instead of wishing away nine months of pregnancy, I'd have cherished every moment and realized that the

wonderment growing inside me was the only chance in life to assist God in a miracle.

When my kids kissed me impetuously, I would never have said, "Later. Now go get washed up for dinner."

There would have been more frequent "I love you" and "I'm sorry."

But mostly, given another shot at life, I would seize every minute, look at it and see it...live it, and never give it back.

Never sweat the small stuff...

Don't worry about who doesn't like you, has more, or doing whatever. Instead, cherish our relationships with those who love us (including the Lord).

I would add the following questions: "Is there someone I need to forgive? Is life making me bitter or better? Do I participate in the Liturgy every weekend? Can I spend ten minutes a day in prayer this Lent as a way to grow, heal, and forgive?"

And at the same time, keep life in perspective and balance. Change begins today - one day at a time! Keep reading ...

A group of 40-year-old buddies debated where to meet for dinner. Finally, they agreed on the Ocean View restaurant because the servers were attractive.

Ten years later, at 50, the group discussed where to meet for dinner again. Finally, it was agreed they meet at the Ocean View restaurant again because the food there is very good, and they have an excellent wine selection.

A decade passed, and the group gathered again at 60. They were still debating where to have dinner. Finally, they agree on the Ocean View restaurant because they can eat there peacefully while enjoying its beautiful view.

Ten years later, at 70, the group again debated where to eat. Finally, they agreed on the Ocean View restaurant because it is wheelchair accessible and has an elevator.

Ten years later, at 80, the group once again discussed where they should meet for dinner. Finally, the group agreed on Ocean View restaurant because this would be their first time there.

Our Lenten journey has begun — may we not be left behind!

In today's Gospel, Jesus invites all to choose a change in lifestyle. It is not imposed but failure to accept it will have disastrous consequences.



"Repentance," metanoia, is a change of mind and heart, a lifelong process of transformation. Jesus is not asking for a temporary foregoing of something pleasurable, like giving up chocolate for Lent. The metanoia to which Jesus invites us is both a turning away from whatever inhibits the full flourishing of the divine intent for creation and a turning toward the source of divine love. There is no better time to begin turning than now. Good intentions to make better lifestyle choices in the future become empty rhetoric in light of Jesus's urgent invitation: "this the time." the kairos. Kairos means the opportune time, the right time, as distinguished from chronos, simple chronological time.

In the Gospel, the Spirit drives Jesus into the desert, where choices are clearer. In biblical tradition, the desert symbolizes the place where these two forces meet. The desert can be a place of danger, where wild beasts dwell, or where revolutionaries hide out.

A Different Type of Election Day at Holy Name Cathedral

cathedral in the diocese is known for many liturgical celebrations that are important to the life of the diocese. Examples include the priesthood and diaconate ordinations when men are ordained to serve God's people. Another example is the Chrism Mass, where the oils we use for our Sacraments. Chrism. Oil of



the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens, are blessed by the Bishop and distributed to the parishes. While they don't occur frequently, the installation Mass of a new bishop (or bishop ordination) when a new shepherd takes leadership of his diocese is a unique and profoundly moving liturgical celebration for the diocese. One event that is often overlooked but just as important is the Rite of Election. This event takes place at the beginning of Lent each year and is essential to the life of the local Church.

Holy Name Cathedral is hosting the Archdiocesan Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion this weekend and next weekend. At this liturgical celebration, those desiring to be baptized into the Church at this upcoming Easter Vigil, as well as those seeking to be fully initiated or completing their Sacraments of Initiation, come before the Bishop to reaffirm their intention to be admitted to the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation. "Within the Rite of Election, the bishop celebrant or his delegate declares in the presence of the community the Church's approval of the candidates" (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, #122). The whole Archdiocese is represented

in this liturgical event as people from Cook and Lake counties come together to be accepted by the Church in preparation for the Easter Sacraments. As we call out each catechumen's and candidate's name during the rite, their name echoes throughout the Cathedral, joining with the names of so many found worthy to participate in the Paschal Mystery of Christ, the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, through the Sacraments.

After the Rite of Election and until Holy Saturday, we call the catechumens "the elect" because they have been "elected" to participate in the Sacraments of Initiation at the Great Vigil of Easter (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). As the Bishop says, "The Church in the name of Christ accepts their judgment and calls you to the Easter Sacraments" (RCIA, #132). Those who will be fully received or initiated will continue to deepen their desire to encounter Christ more fully through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church.

We, as a Cathedral Parish, have a duty to pray for our brothers and sisters who will be baptized into the Church on Holy Saturday, at the Easter Vigil, because they will soon call the Cathedral their mother Church as well, no matter the parish they belong to in the Archdiocese. Specifically for our Holy Name Cathedral Parish, we have 16 catechumens seeking all three Sacraments of Initiation and 11 candidates seeking full reception or initiation into the Church. Let us then be mindful during this Lenten season to pray for those preparing to enter in Christ's passion, death, resurrection, and ascension, and celebrate with them the joy of Easter when they conquer sin and death with our Lord, the same victory we share in by our baptism.




Burning of the Palms


Filling Your Spiritual Backpack

Have you heard? There is an incredible new movie coming theaters on Friday, March 8. Directed by Alejandro Monteverde, and starring Christiana Dell'Anna, John Lithgow, and David Morse, "Cabrini" is based on the true story of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, patron saints of immigrants.



Despite tremendous odds, Mother Cabrini established many schools, orphanages,

and hospitals in the U.S. and beyond. She lifted up the poor, the orphan, and the immigrant fighting misogyny, bigotry, and the status quo.

We will be holiding a group discussion on March 11 about the movie and this remarkable woman, the first U.S. citizen canonized as a saint. At Holy Name Cathedral, we have a bronze statue of her in our courtyard and a firstclass relic from her in our reliquary.


