Reflections from Our Rector_



Dear People of God.

The Lenten Season provides a "speedbump," allowing us to slow down and put the pieces and meaning of our lives into more precise focus. However, this is easier said than done. Our lives are too busy and cluttered! How do we step away from the hustle

and bustle and rekindle our spirits? Keep reading...

An older, tired-looking dog wandered into my yard. I could tell from his collar and well-fed belly that he had a home and was well cared for.

He calmly approached me, and followed me into my house, slowly curled up in a corner, and fell asleep.

He went to the door an hour later, and I let him out. The next day, he was back. He greeted me in my yard, walked inside, resumed his spot in the hall, and slept for about an hour. These visits continued off and on for several weeks.

Curious, I pinned a note to his collar: "I would like to find out who the owner of this wonderful, sweet dog is and ask if you know that almost every afternoon, your dog comes to my house for a nap."

The next day, he arrived for his nap with a note pinned to his collar: "He lives in a home with six children, two under three years old. He is trying to catch up on his sleep. Can I come with him tomorrow?"

And speaking of children and the busy pace of our lives, how do we respond to the other end of the spectrum our beloved elderly? Keep reading...

A frail, older man went to live with his son, daughterin-law, and four-year-old grandson. The older man's hands trembled, his eyesight was blurred and his step faltered. The family ate together at the table. But the grandfather's shaky hands and eyesight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor and milk would spill on the tablecloth. The son and daughter-inlaw became irritated with the mess.

"We must do something about Father," said the son. "I've had enough of his spilled milk, noisy eating, and food on the floor." So, they set a table in the corner. The grandfather ate alone apart from the rest of the family.

Since the grandfather had broken a dish or two, they

served his food in a wooden bowl. When the family glanced in grandfather's direction, sometimes he had a tear in his eye as he sat alone. Still, the only words the couple had for him were sharp admonitions when he dropped a fork or spilled food.

The four-year-old watched in silence. The father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor one evening before supper. He asked the child sweetly, "What are you making?" The boy sweetly responded, "Oh, I am making a little bowl for you and Mama to eat your food in when I grow up." The four-year-old smiled and went back to work.

The words so struck the parents that they were speechless. Though they spoke no words, both parents knew what must be done.

The husband took the grandfather's hand and gently led him back to the family table that evening. He ate every meal with the family for the remainder of his days. And neither husband nor wife seemed to care any longer when he dropped a fork, spilled milk, or the tablecloth soiled.

I've learned I don't have to be one, even when I have pains.

I've learned that you should reach out and touch someone every day.

People love the human touch — holding hands, a warm hug, or just a friendly pat on the back.

I've learned that I still have a lot to learn.

"Jesus Christ and Nicodemus" by Matthias Stom, Hessian Museum Darmstadt, Germany

Today's New Testament readings broaden our understanding of believing in Jesus, the Christ. In today's Gospel, light and darkness is central to



Jesus's teaching. Coming to the light is presented as a conscious choice, one that can be difficult to make. Just as Earth gradually comes into full light between its turn at the spring equinox and the summer solstice, so our coming to the Light is a gradual process.

We may feel tempted to distance ourselves from the people to whom Jesus refers when He talks to Nicodemus. Surely, we would choose light over darkness given the choice. But think about the experience of emerging from darkness into light — when we are not accustomed to it, the light is painful and blinding. Jesus only is what He is, and His light – pure and radiant. This light can seem blinding at first, confusing us as we strive to turn more fully toward a life of faith. But as our eyes grow used to its brilliance, it enables us to travel farther and faster than we ever could without it.

Prepare the Way for Jesus at Our Communal Penance Service

■he Sacrament of Confession/ Reconciliation is one of the Church's seven sacraments and one of the Sacraments of Healing (the other being Anointing of the Sick). Though baptized and original sin removed from us, we tend to sin and concupiscence, and our



human condition is prone to fall. Confession allows us to recognize our failings and seek forgiveness from God.

The Church invites us to go to confession at least once a year, and due to this invitation, parishes make it easy for the faithful to offer communal reconciliation services on a weeknight during Lent and Advent. A communal reconciliation service is not a group confession where everyone says their sins for everyone to hear. It is a time to come together as a community to pray and ask for forgiveness, to recognize the common desire for forgiveness and the reality that we all sin and need healing. Since every time we sin, we sin against God, our neighbor, and ourselves, a communal reconciliation service allows these three transgressions to be healed. We gather as sinners, and in this season of Lent, aware that with Christ's passion, death, and resurrection, we are forgiven of our sins and set free from the chains that bind us.

A communal reconciliation service includes:

- Songs
- Scripture readings from our Lenten season
- An examination of conscience
- Individual confession

Like any Sacrament, we cannot be forced to receive it, so some people may wish to come to the service but not participate in the individual confession when you can confess your sins to the priest and receive absolution. If you do not go to individual confession at a communal reconciliation service, you do not receive absolution from your sins because you did not confess your sins to a priest. The benefit of attending a communal penance service is that we gather as sinners together, aware of God's mercy. We can reflect with each other through song and scripture about God's immense love and mercy that we will experience in confession. More priests are present in the communal service, so practically, the lines are typically shorter than on a Saturday morning in the lower level of the Cathedral when only one priest is in the confessional.

Holy Name Cathedral will have our Lenten Communal Reconciliation Service on Wednesday, March 13, at 6:00pm. All are welcome to join us as we come together as a community to sit in the quiet of this penitential season, preparing for the holiest days of our liturgical year. We will have six priests available for confession. Let us prepare the way for the saving actions of Jesus by preparing our hearts and souls through the confession of our sins and basking in the glory of God's unending love and mercy.


