Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

We celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity this weekend. Father – Son – Holy Spirit, has also been termed Creator – Redeemer – Sanctifier. No matter the language, the essence of the Holy Trinity speaks of relationships and being a life-giver. Do we seek to

bring life, hope and joy to all we meet? The Trinity is a relationship of love and unity. Does my life seek to be rooted in life-giving relationships?

The Holy Trinity speaks of balance. Does my life have a balance between work, play, prayer and relationships? Specifically, are God, prayer, family and friends core Gospel values? Is Sunday liturgy a priority with my family, or do other “more important” events or work take a front-row seat? Work and other commitments are important, but a relationship with God (rooted in prayer), family, Faith Community and friends hold life together. Balancing all the responsibilities and areas of life is a lifelong quest. The following story powerfully connects with the Feast of the Holy Trinity in ways we may have never imagined. Enjoy...and pass it on...

Last week, I took my children to a restaurant. My six-year-old son asked if he could say grace. As we bowed our heads he said, “God is good. God is great. Thank you for the food, and I will even thank you more if Mom gets us ice cream for dessert. And liberty and justice for all! Amen!”

Along with the laughter from other customers nearby, I heard a woman remark, “That’s what’s wrong with this country. Kids today don’t know how to pray. Asking God for ice cream! Why I never!”

Hearing this, my son burst into tears and asked me, “Did I do it wrong? Is God mad at me?” As I held him and assured him that he had done a terrific job and God was certainly not mad at him, an elderly gentleman approached the table. He winked at my son and said, “I know God thought that was a great prayer.” “Really?” my son asked. “Cross my heart,” the man replied.

Then, in a theatrical whisper, he added (indicating the

woman whose remark had started this whole thing), “Too bad she never asks God for ice cream. A little ice cream is good for the soul sometimes.”

Naturally, I bought my kids ice cream at the end of the meal. My son stared at his for a moment and then did something I will remember for the rest of my life. He picked up his sundae and, without a word, walked over and placed it in front of the woman. With a big smile he told her, “Here, this is for you. Ice cream is good for the soul sometimes, and my soul is good already.”

We sometimes need to reach out to a hurting world in ways that reflect God’s presence in our midst. Ice cream is good for the soul! I hope God sends you an ice cream carrier today!

At the same time, the Holy Trinity is best lived out through action instead of words...keep reading...

Four clergymen were discussing the merits of various translations of the Bible. One liked the King James Version because of its simple, beautiful English. Another liked the American Revised Version best because it is more literal and comes nearer to the original Hebrew and Greek. Another liked the New American Bible translation because of its up-to-date vocabulary. The fourth minister was silent. When asked to express his opinion, he replied, “I like my mother’s translation best.” The other three expressed surprise. They did not know that his mother had translated the Bible. But he assured them, “She translated it into life every day, and it was the most convincing translation I ever saw.”

“Jesus, God and Holy Spirit. Holy Trinity,” stained glass at Song Vinh Church, Vietnam.

The Great Commission, when Jesus sent the disciples to baptize, contains one of the first direct references to the Trinity in Scripture.



Although it took the Church several hundred years more to fully describe the relationships among Father, Son, and Spirit; the truth of God’s nature as Three-in-One is seeded throughout Scripture. While the Great Commission points forward to the doctrine of the Trinity; it also gestures back to the Old Testament promises.

The Spirit bears witness to our adoption as children of God. The relationship between parents and children who are full heirs is only one metaphor by which we speak of the three mysterious love of the Trinity. There is no limit to the ways we can speak of the profound mystery of the Three-in-One. The three persons are a communion of love that interweave each other in endless patterns of saving activity. On this Feast of the Holy Trinity, talk with Jesus about the ways you see “outsiders.” What could turn your heart to see them more truly as God’s beloved children?

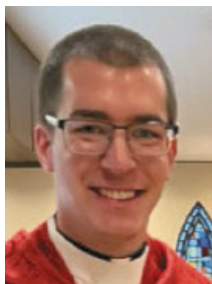

Celebrate Corpus Christi with Our Procession of Faith

Next weekend, we are blessed to observe the sacred Feast of Corpus Christi, a time when we honor the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity contained in the Eucharist. This profound tradition, dating back to 1264 when Pope Urban IV added the feast to the General Roman Calendar, is a testament to our deep reverence for the Eucharist. St. Thomas Aquinas penned the Eucharistic Hymn, *Pange Lingua*, as a beautiful tribute to this feast. Yet, a person, a beacon of inspiration, guided Pope Urban during his time as an Archdeacon long before his Papal election.



Juliana of Liège, or Cornillo, was a Norbertine canoness regular who lived in modern-day Belgium. Tradition tells us she worked tirelessly to have the Church dedicate a feast solely to the Eucharist. Juliana was born around 1192/3, and the first Corpus Christi Feast was celebrated in 1246 in the diocese where Juliana lived. She is known as the Apostle of the Eucharist for her tireless efforts to promote Eucharistic devotion. Blessed Pope Pius IX canonized her in 1869.

Much can be written on the Eucharist, its theological development, piety, devotion, and more. What this feast celebrates at the mid-point of the calendar year (depending on the date of Easter) is that Jesus remains with us in the Eucharist. After the cold days of winter when we celebrated the Incarnation of Christ at Christmas, after the Lenten journey to the cross and the empty tomb, and finally, after the descent of the Spirit, God remains with us in the Eucharist.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is a day to step away from our daily routines, just as is every feast of our Church, and to ponder God's awesome mystery. It is a time to reflect on the fact that Jesus kept his promise that he will be with us always, even to the end of time, and also to celebrate that fact as we receive him every time we approach the altar. But how often do we fail to remember this reality? How

frequently do we neglect the call to be changed by this meal or this encounter? In honor of this feast, on Saturday, June 1, following the 5:15pm Mass, we will have an Eucharistic Procession around the block of Holy Name Cathedral.

Processions, whether for Corpus Christi or a particular saint's feast day, are an external sign to others of the belief and faith that those in the procession have for the Eucharist or specific saint. The Corpus Christi procession's meaning dates to the 14th century, when reception of the Eucharist was sparse. By bringing the Eucharist to the streets, people would see the Eucharist and be blessed by it as it processed across the local towns. Processions today are a devotion to our belief in the Eucharist amid this dark and broken world; God continues to call us, love us, and change us through the gift of the Eucharist. We should remember that we encounter the Risen One, both in our reception of and in devotion to the Holy Eucharist.

Celebrating Corpus Christi reminds us of God's love for us as we celebrate the Real Presence in the Eucharist – the fact that God remains with his people. May we continue to “see what we believe in, and become what we receive” (St. Augustine) so that the world may continue to be sanctified by Jesus, who is working in us and through us. Because what difference does it make if the bread and the wine change at Mass, and we don't?

Blest Art will be visiting Holy Name Cathedral on behalf of the Christian families in Bethlehem, Palestine. Their mission is to support those families in the Holy Land.

For centuries, the Christians in and around Bethlehem have earned a living by carving religious olive wood art to sell to visiting pilgrims. Fewer pilgrims are journeying to the Holy Land today, making it difficult for those Christians to support their families. As a result, there has been a dramatic rise in Christian emigration from the Holy Land. Now, less than 1% of the population in the Holy Land are Christians.

Blest Art Inc helps the struggling Christian families of Bethlehem by marketing their artwork in the United States. Due to this work many Christian families maintain their livelihood and their ancestral homes in the land of our Lord.

When Blest Art comes to Holy Name Cathedral, they will have hand-carved nativity sets, statues, crosses, rosaries, and many other pieces of beautiful olive wood art. You are invited to stop by their display and to consider purchasing a piece of art from the Holy Land. In doing so, you will help support the many families who depend on this form or art for their living. Your purchase will make a difference in the lives of many Christian families. 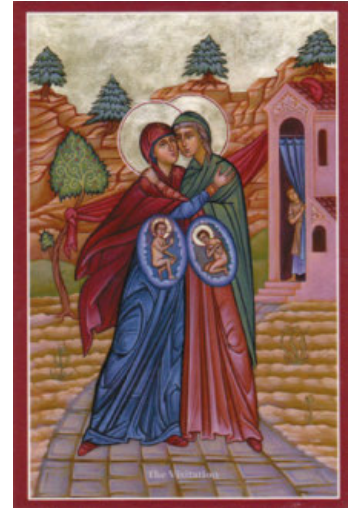
Rosary in the Courtyard

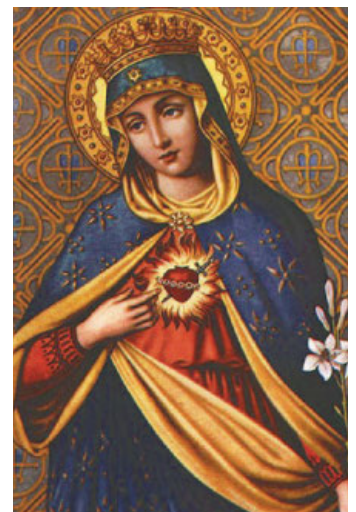
Visitation between Mary and Elizabeth, Friday, May 31

Topic: The Secret to Sanctity: Needing God



Father Joshua Caswell, SJC, is the Superior General of the Canons Regular of St. John Cantius. He was ordained a priest for the community in 2014 alongside his blood brother, Father Nathan Caswell. Celebrating a decade in the priesthood, Father Joshua's vocation is part of an extraordinary family story: both he and Father Nathan are priests, and their sister, Sister Mary Judith, OP, belongs to the Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist.

Their parents undoubtedly take great pride in their children's dedication to religious life. Canons Regular of St. John Cantius is a religious community of men dedicated to the restoration of the sacred. Living in imitation of Christ, and radical opposition to the values of the world; they work to restore the sacred in the Church and their own lives, seeking the sanctification of all.

Topic: Praying with the Mass

Bishop Bob Lombardo came to Chicago in 2005 at Cardinal George's request to establish a mission outreach to the poor on the west side. He has since overseen the creation of the Mission of Our Lady of the Angels and over \$15 million in renovations. He also serves as the Vicar for Vicariate III in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Bishop Bob, a Notre Dame graduate with an accounting degree, felt a strong call to become a Franciscan and a priest. He has done missionary work in Bolivia and Honduras, organized youth programs in Manhattan, and directed the Padre Pio Shelter in the Bronx. He is a founding member of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal and holds a Master of Divinity and a M.S. in Pastoral Counseling.

In Chicago, he founded and directs the Mission of Our Lady of the Angels and the Franciscans of the Eucharist of Chicago. He was appointed bishop by Pope Francis in September 2020 and ordained on Nov. 13, 2020. He continues to lead the Mission and the Franciscans of the Eucharist.

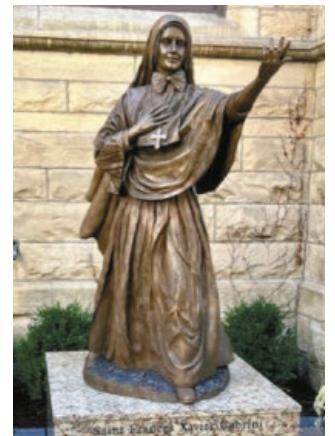

In the Footsteps of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini

Pilgrimage to Italy; Nov. 6-16, 2024

The first United States citizen canonized was St. Frances Xavier Cabrini. Mother Cabrini served Chicago so well, where she lived, worked, and died. A statue of St. Frances, identical to the one in our Cathedral Courtyard, will be dedicated and placed in the courtyard at the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls in Rome on her feast day of Nov. 13.



We invite you to witness this historic moment by joining our ten-day pilgrimage to Italy. We'll begin in Milan with visits to her birthplace in Sant'Angelo Lodigiano and other inspiring sites like Codogno, Assisi, the tomb of St. Dominic in Bologna, and, of course, ending in the eternal city of Rome. Mass and time for personal devotion will also be available. Fr. John Boivin will join us as chaplain and fellow pilgrim.

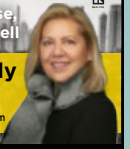
