# Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. What is the real meaning of the Eucharist? Let me share a story. As a child and teen, I spent many hours playing basketball, football, baseball and softball. I also had a dubious "honor" of spending time in both the emergency room at Resurrection Hospital and Lutheran General Hospital for X-rays or an occasional "stitching job" on various parts of my body and head. Since my earliest childhood, my brother, Adrian, and I would "team up" and revel in the competition. Yet, there was only one "sport" I thoroughly enjoyed as a youngster in which my mother did not have to light candles at church as a way of keeping me out of emergency rooms. It was the sport of birdwatching.

We have all seen Crows, Blue Jays, Robins, Herring Gulls, the feisty activity of the House Sparrow and the irritating presence of Canada Geese (especially on golf courses or at parks). However, on a hot July afternoon when I was ten years old in Park Ridge and tired of playing basketball, my two boyhood friends, Norman and Alan, convinced me to take a hike into the woods and explore the whole new world of birdwatching. At first, I thought my buddies were joking. I was a "jock" - not a birder. Who in their right mind would don a pair of binoculars and head into the forest? Due to a boredom level that reached beyond serious, I agreed to placate my friends and hike into the woods in search of rare and exotic birds. Well, our two hour venture into the woods proved enjoyable. I was hooked. That particular hot July afternoon in 1963 launched a love for nature and birds that has stayed with me to the present day.

As I sat at my desk in my previous two assignments returning many messages, I always noticed Cardinals, House Finches, Blue Jays, Black Capped Chickadees, Downy Woodpeckers and the ever present House Sparrows feeding on sunflower seeds, thistle, seed and suet. The birds flocked to the feeders outside the rectory because they were being nourished and fed. As long as the feeders are full, the swell of activity is constant and continues to grow in numbers.

The thought one day struck me as I gazed outside my office window enjoying the variety of species. There is a parallel between those feeders and why we gather every Sunday as the Body of Christ—The Lord's People—to be nourished and strengthened by His Word and fed at the Lord's Table with the bread of life and the cup of eternal salvation. The Liturgy—which means the "action of people" - does not end with the closing song. We are challenged to be Christ to all our sisters and brothers. The Eucharist challenges us to become what we have received. Yes, the Lord gives us the gift of Himself and we are fed at His table. Why? Because the Lord loves us and bends to touch us first. However, as we are nourished and strengthened in the breaking of the bread and sharing of the cup, our lives are a blessing to be shared with all. We must walk through the exit doors after Mass to now live what we have received.

We gather as the Body of Christ every weekend knowing God's grace is entwined with our freedom. Birds are nourished at feeders and will continue to flock as long as food remains. We gather every weekend to be strengthened and nourished by the Lord's Word and fed around the Lord's Table in order to go forth and "feed" our sisters and brothers— especially the poor, homeless and have-nots in our city, country and world. The Lord has promised to be with us and always be our hope, joy and eternal food. We need to "flock" together as "church" - as God's people to realize we are a pilgrim people—to be nourished, strengthened and commissioned to reach out to others in His Name. We are fed by the Lord, but the Eucharist also means we feed each other.

Our Faith Community is extremely active and does a wonderful job of reaching out. We must continue to be fed around the Lord's Table even when all the pieces of our lives may not always connect. In turn, having been strengthened by His Word and the Bread of Life we become Christ to others in many different ways. This is what it means to be "Christ." We are the Body of Christ if we do and care that others may have life.

I truly thank God for all of you as I soon begin my second year as your Rector. My prayer is that all of us will continue seeking the Lord in the years ahead. We need to be nourished by His Word and fed at His table with the Bread from Heaven. For life is a mystery to be lived and not a problem to be solved.

Have a blessed, restful and safe summer. And by the way, feel free to give me a call if you spot a rare bird!





# Lead With Your Heart



Dear Cathedral Family,

It's no secret that music is a deep love of mine and often times where words fail, music speaks. I find that simple statement to be truer and truer as I journey through my life of discipleship with Christ. When I was studying to become a priest, the song "Lead With Your Heart" by The Tenors served as a mantra for me. Lead with your heart. It is a statement simultaneously simple and profound. I challenged myself then to make that mantra the very core of my ministry as a priest, for, I believe, it is at the core of an authentic life of discipleship. I find myself listening to that song once again, and the mantra within resonates as loudly now as it did then.

I am not some great theologian. I am not some great administrator. I am not someone seeking to climb any sort of ladder in the Church; what I am is what we all have been baptized to be, a disciple of Christ—a disciple of Christ who leads with love. I pray that in my three years at the Cathedral as a companion and brother on this journey of life and faith, as we have waded through the messiness of life together, my love for you has been evident. If God called me to be present as we celebrated the joyful moments of the sacraments, if God called me to be present at the bedside of your loved one or preside at the Mass of the Resurrection for a cherished one who entered eternal life, if God called me to accompany you through a trial or rough patch in your relationship with Him or with others, if God called me simply to greet you after a Mass I celebrated, I hope I led with my heart. For those times when I didn't lead with my heart but with a heart clouded by my own ego, I apologize.

I am thankful to be called to be a priest so that I can serve as an instrument of that love and to lead every moment with a heart full of that unqualified love. It's a shame that at times our fellow disciples on life's journey feel like God's love is only given to some and not others because they don't fit some kind of mold. Rather, I have found, it is precisely in the face of the immigrant and refugee, the victim of gun-violence, those who love differently than we think they should, those that don't fit in in our community, that we truly learn how to love and lead with our hearts. I am tremendously grateful for those experiences at the Cathedral that have stretched me and challenged me to grow in love. But, I am also grateful for those moments when I have been able to show to those who don't feel loved that indeed they are, and they are most welcome in our community of love called—Church.

Each of you at Holy Name Cathedral has touched my heart in ways that you will never know. I leave with a heart full of thankfulness and full of God's unqualified love that has been mediated through you. The first assignment of a priest sets the tone for his ministry, and I am grateful that I can always point back to you at Holy Name Cathedral and tell others how you taught me to be a priest. You will always have a place in my heart...and I challenge you, as again I challenge myself, always in every moment of every day, LEAD WITH YOUR HEART!
