What's your Saving Grace?

Our First Reading from Second Kings, features Elisha. You may recall that Elisha was plowing in a field when the prophet Elijah called him to follow him. Something happened at that moment and Elisha chose to do it, which is what brought him to this point in his journey (as reported in today's Holy Scripture). We often address the fact that each of us is called as well. Our calling, like Elisha's and like those of Christ's Apostles, is really not that much different.

Christ said, "Follow Me," and the Apostles basically dropped everything, ceased pursuing what they were doing — in some cases with good jobs and vocations — and followed Christ. We are called to follow the Lord from the moment of our Baptism, but how many of us take that calling seriously?

It is not just a question of hearing the call; the key is whether we are listening for it? It is there, but we must be aware of it in order to respond.

Elisha's call and our calls are signs of God at work. God has a plan for each of us. We are the means by which God's work is continued in our parishes, in our communities, and in the Church. God's ministry on earth will be carried out and accomplished. None of us is the entire ministry; we can all be replaced. However, by the same token in God's eyes we are absolutely necessary. Are we ready to respond? Are we ready to be disciples of the Lord?







Welcome Fr. Marek!



My name is Fr. Marek Smolka and as of July 1 I am your new Associate Pastor and Director of Liturgy.

I was born in Poland in a beautiful, small village called Czarny Dunajec located in the southern part of Poland, close to Zakopane.

I am the youngest of my parent's two children. All of my family members live in the south suburbs.

I finished my elementary school in Poland, and during my years in elementary school, I always desired to attend Catholic School. So, in 1999, I entered the Salesian Catholic High School. After one year of study there, my parents decided to move to the United States of America. In 2000, I moved with my family to the United States and continued my high school education. I graduated from Gordon S. Hubbard High School located on the South Side of Chicago in 2003. After high school, I decided to continue my education at Moraine Valley Community College in Palos Hills by taking general courses before moving on to the University to get a degree in secondary education. In 2006, I became a certified catechist for the Archdiocese of Chicago. As the years passed I realized that God was calling me to the priesthood. In 2007, I applied to St. Joseph College Seminary located at Loyola University Chicago where I began the seminary formation program. In 2010, I graduated from St. Joseph College Seminary and applied to Mundelein Seminary. I was ordained to the priesthood in 2014 and since then, I have been ministering as the Associate Pastor at St. Francis Borgia Parish in Chicago.
