Parking Lot Update

Dear People of God,

As you may have recently seen, the development plan for the parking lot across the street from the Cathedral was recently approved by the City's Plan and Zoning Commissions. These important approvals keep the development on track, with construction currently anticipated to begin this fall. Once a more firm date is set, we will let everyone know.

Since our parking lot will be closed during the construction period, I am delighted to announce that Loyola University, our wonderful neighbor, has agreed to let us utilize their parking lot on Chicago Avenue, directly north of our present lot. While the lot is somewhat smaller than we what we have now (90 spaces vs. 190), it is convenient to the Cathedral and we will be able to accommodate the demand for many during the weekend Masses. The lot will be available to us from Saturday at 7:00am through Sunday evening at 10:00pm. We anticipate that the lot will be patrolled by our parking attendant to assist with traffic flow, especially between crowded Masses. Additionally, we are working to secure spaces in the surrounding parking garages to supplement the Loyola University lot, and we will update you as those plans are finalized.

I'm grateful to Loyola University for their willingness to assist us on the weekends to ensure that our Mass attendance will not be impacted. We anticipate that this arrangement will be necessary for 18-20 months, until our 225 new parking spots within the development will be available to us.

Stay tuned for more later this year and keep the entire project in your prayers.



Liturgy

Many of us, perhaps, remember a time when this sacrament was celebrated only for those who were dying. However any illness of serious nature can be a legitimate reason to celebrate the sacrament. What’s more, the sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after the anointing but becomes ill once again, or if, during the same illness, the person’s condition becomes more serious. Any person over the age of reason (age seven) preparing for surgery is encouraged to contact one of the priests to receive the sacrament.

This sacrament will be celebrated with a special Liturgy for the Sick

on Saturday, February 10th, at 5:15 p.m. Mass.


