## Message from the Rector



Dear Easter People,

The Lord is Risen! Alleluia! The death of Jesus is not the final word. Life so abundant we call it eternal—Resurrection. This is the Word of Good News! Joy. Hope. Promise. Empty tomb. He is Risen!

The Gospels do not explain Easter—Easter explains the Gospels. Our lives do not explain Easter—Easter gives meaning to our lives. Faith is the story we tell with our lives.

Resurrection means Jesus lives. Our Lord discovered what to die for and what to live forever for. We are invited to do the same. For Easter speaks of new life and hope always in the name of the Lord Jesus. We have so many choices in life and many demands are placed upon us. What are we choosing? What are we seeking? What are we finding in life? Easter is an opportunity to put life in perspective through eyes of “Easter faith.”

I share with you a reflection recently given to me. It connects beautifully the Easter journey with the Lord. Easter involves trust and surrendering . . . Keep reading . . .

### GOD’S ROSEBUD

A new minister was walking with an older, more seasoned minister in the garden one day. Feeling a bit insecure about what God had for him to do, he was asking the older preacher for some advice. The older preacher walked up to a rosebush and handed the young preacher a rosebud and told him to open it without tearing off any petals.

The younger preacher looked in disbelief at the older preacher and was trying to figure out what a rosebud could possibly have to do with his wanting to know the will of God for his life and ministry. But because of his great respect for the older preacher, he proceeded to try to unfold the rose, while keeping every petal intact. It wasn’t long before he realized how impossible this was to do. Noticing the young preacher’s inability to unfold the rosebud without tearing it, the older preacher began to recite the following poem . . .

“It is only a tiny rosebud, a flower of God’s design;  
But I cannot unfold the petals with these clumsy hands of mine.  
The secret of unfolding flowers is not known to such as I.  
GOD opens this flower so easily, but in my hands they die.  
If I cannot unfold a rosebud, this flower of God’s design,  
Then how can I have the wisdom to unfold this life of mine?  
So I’ll trust in God for leading each moment for my day.  
I will look to God for guidance in each step of the way.  
The path that lies before me, only my Lord knows.  
I’ll trust God to unfold the moments, just as He unfolds the rose.”

Jesus took a journey—a long walk—which ended not in death, but Resurrection. Jesus also took an inward journey trusting God, His Father. As we live our lives, we also make an inward journey. Paula D’Arcy beautifully reflects in her book:

### Gift of the Red Bird

“Why are we willing to make an endless outer journey, but are loath to make the significant one: the journey within. The journey may frighten us, yet it is this journey which holds the real treasure. There God’s spirit waits to reveal mysteries and beauty beyond our imagination: the secrets of what is holy, and the encounters with truth that change everything. It is the journey that opens the eye of the heart.”

Laugh, cry and dance together with God, trusting God to lead and guide us through this Easter Season—and all the days of our lives. For Jesus is the Son of God, died and risen to eternal life, to show us how to truly live.

## Congratulations, Jeff Greene!

Congratulations to Jeff Greene! On April 8, Most Rev. Andrew P. Wypych, will preside at the Rite of Institution into the Ministry of Reader and welcome him into that ministry at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, University of Saint Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. He is part of the cohort of 28 candidates who will become instituted Readers.

At the institution, Bishop Wypych will charge that Jeff be faithful in handing on the Word of God so that it may grow strong in the hearts of His people. Additionally, being an instituted Reader also means “taking on a special office within the Christian community.” Besides proclaiming the word in the liturgical assembly, an instituted Reader is responsible for:

- instructing children and adults in faith;
- preparing them to receive the sacraments worthily;
- bringing the message of salvation to those who have not yet received it.

This is an awesome responsibility. But it is a part of the continuing discernment process as (Jeffrey Greene) moves forward on his journey in formation and listens to God’s plans for him in future ministry.

During formation this year, Jeff is attending academic courses in Church History, Old Testament, New Testament, Ecclesiology and Mariology, Spiritual Theology, Christian Anthropology, and Worship and Liturgical Music. He also participated in a weekend retreat and will attend a candidates-only retreat prior to his institution as Reader. Additionally, elements of his formation include a Service to Charity field education experience, completed last summer; and this year he is engaged in Service of the Word field education. He attends monthly spiritual direction and is present for numerous formation sessions as he continues his journey on the Candidate Path toward the Order of Deacon in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Presently, there are about 500 active deacons in the Archdiocese of Chicago, with 60 men currently in the Institute for Diaconal Studies.

Please keep in your prayers Jeff and his wife, Amy, and all the candidates in formation, that they might continue to answer God’s call to serve His Church.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Risen Lord Jesus,

The news today seems to be dominated by death-dealing forces and foreclosed possibilities. This past year has brought us a plague of gun-violence, streams of helpless refugees in different parts of the world, struggles in our own nation around questions of immigration and racism, countless victims of natural disasters, and large numbers of people who are—in the words of Pope Francis—“discarded.” There seems to be scant room for hope and optimism.

Yet, we know by our own experience as believers and our common bonds of faith that this is not the full story of reality. There, indeed, is other news, the good news of our Easter faith. Christ has conquered all death and evil. Christ is risen!

When we profess our faith in the risen Lord, we do not deny the pain and suffering at work in our world. The risen Christ himself bears his wounds of his suffering, but he is risen. He has conquered sin and death, and our victory is certain. We hold a great hope in him who leads forward. But, it does not end there, for as St. Paul tells us, all of that we celebrate in these days has taken place so that we “might live no longer for ourselves but for him who died for our sakes and was raised.”

In the Archdiocese of Chicago, our commitment to *Renew My Church* means that we take our Easter faith seriously to the point that it becomes the source of new energy for communities and individuals who share our faith with the world and bring it hope the world cannot take away.

May our faith in the Risen Lord be alive in our hearts, and may we share that gift widely and generously with others.



### Accompanying People and Families Facing Mental Health Challenges

Beginning **Tuesday, April 3 at 6:30 p.m.**, Holy Name Cathedral Parish will host a five week series that will provide an overview of mental illness, faith-based supports for those who accompany people with mental illnesses and community resources that are available. Speakers will include, on various evenings, members of the Archdiocesan Commission on Mental Illness, a psychiatrist, a psychologist and a panel of family members who will speak from experience.

People with mental illness and their families may feel isolated from their faith community and thus isolated from God. If someone feels rejected by church they feel rejected by God. Isolation is often caused by the stigma associated with having a mental illness. The fear of being judged as inadequate or weak willed, or the misperception that God is punishing them because they did something wrong, or the communities misperception of what mental illness is and how it affects the individual and their families are powerful contributors to the isolation and loneliness that people feel. As a healing community we can support people with mental illness and their families and with unconditional non-judgmental love in the following ways: increase our awareness of mental illness and where to get help; offer prayers and support for individuals and families who are affected by mental illness; serve on parish communities for outreach to individuals and families; get involved in peer ministry; and work on the justice issues affecting mental health care.
