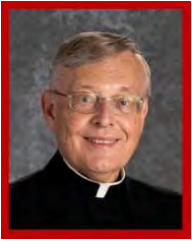

Message from our Rector

ILLINOIS TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP



Dear People of God,

I would like to encourage you to take the time to learn more about the Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship. It is an opportunity for all of us to help support underprivileged students afford a Catholic education.

WHAT ARE TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS?

The Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program, “Invest in Kids,” provides a 75% Illinois state income tax credit to individuals and corporations that contribute money to a non-profit Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO). The SGOs award scholarships to eligible students from low income families.

Donors will use money already owed to the state (taxes) and donate it to a needs-based scholarship instead, all while receiving 75% state tax credit. So what this means is that you can reduce the amount of the Illinois State income tax that you owe by 75% of your donation. Another way to think about it is that you will get a 75% deduction on this donation, rather than your standard charitable deduction.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR DONATING?

Individual and corporate donors can reserve tax credits through mytax.illinois.gov by following these steps:

1. Create a MyTax.Illinois account on mytax.illinois.gov. Anyone applying for a scholarship tax credit is required to have an account. If you do not have one, the first step is requesting a Letter ID from the Illinois Department of Revenue.
2. Apply for a tax credit on mytax.illinois.gov. Donors will need to provide the following information:
 - Region to which he/she plans to donate.
 - Name of SGO to which he/she plans to donate (the Archdiocese is partnering with Empower Illinois).
 - Amount he/she plans to donate.
3. Donate to the SGO within 60 days of receiving your application approval and the Contribution Authorization Certificate.
 - Designate the donation to Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools.
4. Provide a certificate form the SGO to use tax credit when filing a 2018 return in 2019.

INTERESTED IN DONATING?

The Archdiocese is here to guide you through the process. Please contact them at tcs@archchicago.org or 312-534-2617 to speak with the Tax Credit Scholarship Office at the Archdiocese.

I hope you will consider taking advantage of this program. It's a wonderful opportunity to help families afford a Catholic education while getting a tax benefit.





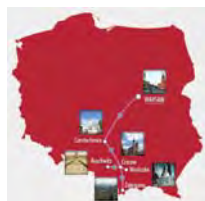

Serving at the Table of the Lord

Many parishes that have schools connected with them have grammar school-aged children who become altar servers, or acolytes as they are sometimes called. While the FXW School resides on our campus, it is not a parish school. Therefore, Holy Name Cathedral masses has few children serving as altar servers. Seminarians can and do assist at Mass when their schedules permit. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) are trained to perform the functions of altar servers for Sunday liturgies in which seminarians are not available.

Four years ago, Cardinal Cupich requested the official formation of the Adult Altar Server Ministry. Fr. Brad Zamora, our Liturgy Director at the time, asked Stephanie McIntyre to coordinate the training of lay people to serve at Cathedral masses celebrated by the Cardinal and other special liturgical masses. Stephanie is a lifelong parishioner who attended school at Holy Name when we had a parish elementary and high school.



Besides ministry training, Stephanie coordinates the scheduling of the fourteen Adult Altar Servers at different Masses throughout the year. Serving as an Altar Server offers "humbling and grace-filled encounters with Christ," states Stephanie. And an unexpected smile from Cardinal Cupich is always heartwarming! Each selected member of this ministry is also mandated as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, as they may be called upon to assist with the distribution of the Holy Eucharist during Mass.

Serving at the Cardinal's Mass has some unique tasks, such as assisting the Master of Ceremonies with the Order of the Mass, preparing and presenting the thurifer to the Cardinal, or carrying the Cardinal's crosier or miter. Each server is assigned to their specific task for the Mass.

Stephanie's motivation in this ministry is "being able to love and serve others through the Mass. We all have gifts and talents that we bring in our encounter with Christ. Working together, in this ministry, brings more to that encounter." The Altar Servers, who wear white robes, are affectionately nicknamed "Angels," because they serve Christ at the altar.

Along with our other liturgical ministries, Stephanie states that "the Adult Altar Server Ministry allows parishioners and visitors alike to see where men and women of various ages, ethnicities, and economic structures, can serve Christ at the altar."

Did You Know?

As the seat of the Archdiocese of Chicago, Holy Name Cathedral is home to many special liturgical masses. As Director of Liturgy, Fr. Marek Smolka normally performs the Master of Ceremonies (MOC) function to oversee every detail of the Order of the Mass. Our Adult Altar Servers work closely with the MOC, led by Stephanie who selects and assigns each Altar Server a very specific function. The Thurifer gets the Thurible (incensor) prepared and ready when needed. For the Cardinal, the Altar Servers for the Crosier (hooked staff) and the Miter (the Cardinal's headdress) ensure they are prepared and "at the ready." Others manage the Cross and the Candles throughout the mass. Fr. Marek Smolka oversees the HNC Altar Server Ministry.

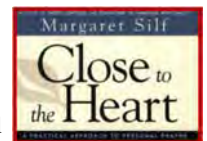
