



Message from our Rector



Dear People of God,

Summer vacation is over. How quickly the early days of June lapse into the start of September! This time of year speaks of change and new beginnings. Summer will soon give way to fall and we will “see” the change of season through fallen leaves and days growing darker.

New beginnings and change are obvious for children in grammar school, high school and college. Changes also happen within parents who see their child begin a new school year - especially first grade! As a woman once shared with me - “In life, change is inevitable, but growth is optional.”

The Frances Xavier Warde School opens this Tuesday and the start of a school year for all children - everywhere - is exciting and growthful for children and parents. New beginnings are a time to listen - to reflect - to give thanks to God - a time to learn.

Things in Life I've Learned

I've learned . . . that the best classroom in the world is at the feet of an elderly person.

I've learned . . . that just one person saying to me, “You've made my day!” makes my day.

I've learned . . . that I feel better about myself when I make others feel better about themselves.

I've learned . . . that having a child fall asleep in your arms is one of the most peaceful feelings in the world.

I've learned . . . that one sincere apology is worth more than all the roses money can buy.

I've learned . . . that being kind is more important than being right.

I've learned . . . no matter how serious your life requires you to be, everyone needs a friend to act goofy with.

I've learned . . . that sometimes all a person needs is a hand to hold and a heart to understand.

I've learned . . . that life is like a roll of toilet paper. The closer it gets to the end, the faster it goes.

I've learned . . . that we should be glad God doesn't give us everything we ask for.

I've learned . . . that money doesn't buy class.

I've learned . . . that it's those small daily happenings that make life so spectacular.

I've learned . . . that it is best to give advice in only two circumstances: when it is requested and when it is a life threatening situation.

Along the same lines, Thomas Groome, author of *Educating for Life*, shares this profound story.

My friend Jan teaches first grade. At the beginning of the school year she introduces her students to a favorite activity that they will do regularly - “going exploring” outside as a class. She alerts them that when they return from their “walk about,” she will ask them what they saw and heard. On a few occasions, this elicits a few and obvious responses, but as the children learn the habit of “looking at life,” they begin to find the “details,” especially in nature, and their curiosity prompts them to investigate further.

By the end of the year, they know the names of every bird and insect, flower and weed, tree and bush in the neighborhood and what happens to each as the New England seasons unfold. While teaching appreciation for nature, Jan is also helping to form their powers of observation and contemplation - great gifts for life.

In life, we need to look, see and experience God's presence all around us. And by the way - enjoy these last few weeks of summer. GO BEARS!





Did You Know?

Holy Name Cathedral is launching a year-round Rites of Christian Initiation (RCIA) process, opening up the opportunity for inquirers to start throughout the year, rather than just a single starting point in September. Upon the point of inquiry and an interview, the team determines the best course of implementation for the individual. The program includes Spiritual, Formative, Communal, and Service aspects.



The Cathedral's RCIA program is led by Fr. Don Cambe and Dr. Ken Ortega. They are assisted by seven lay parishioners serving as team leaders who guide **Catechumens**

(never baptized) and **Candidates** (baptized in another faith, or Catholics seeking the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation) through the three new stages of the RCIA process. In addition, each person has a spiritual companion, or Sponsor, who walk the journey with them. The next cohort of RCIA begins on September 9.

Finding a Home in the Catholic Church

People considering Catholicism are often drawn in by our tradition of Holy sacraments, the ritual of the Mass, and the sense of community in the Catholic Church. Each year, dozens of people contact Holy Name Cathedral to learn more about the teachings of Christ and how to join the Church. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process through which adults learn about the teachings of the Catholic Church as handed onto us, and how to put these teachings into practice by living as part of the Catholic community, serving others and praying together.



After completing a five-year term on the Cathedral Parish's Education Commission (now the Faith Formation Commission), Richard Kaczmarek, now a 30-year parishioner, noticed after the 9:30a Mass homily, a large group of people were excused to go to the cafeteria to reflect upon and discuss the scripture readings and homily. He later learned

these people were part of the RCIA group, on their journey to becoming members of the Catholic Church. When the call came for parishioners to join RCIA as sponsors, Rich responded and began a twenty-three year journey to minister in the RCIA program.

Rich shares, "I thoroughly enjoyed being a friend and mentor to them on their spiritual journey leading to the reception of the Easter sacraments as the Vigil. To me, the Easter Vigil is the most beautiful of the Catholic rites as we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord and His victory over sin and death." After his first year as a Sponsor, Rich was asked to join the RCIA team to assist in designing and implementing the Cathedral's program.

Rich is pleasantly surprised most of the people who come into the RCIA program are in their 20's and 30's. "It is often portrayed in polls and other sources, that most young adults regard themselves as spiritual but not interested in becoming a member of any organized religion." Rich adds "It appears to me that young adults and others are searching for spirituality, but they don't want to do it alone. They want to be part of something much larger than themselves, which is why so many want to become part of the Holy Name Cathedral community."

Rich never regretted his decision to join the RCIA Ministry and says "I have thoroughly enjoyed participating in RCIA, which has enabled me to gain a greater love and appreciation for my faith. I have served in other ministries, but the RCIA is my favorite, by far!"
