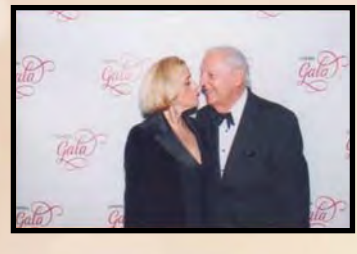
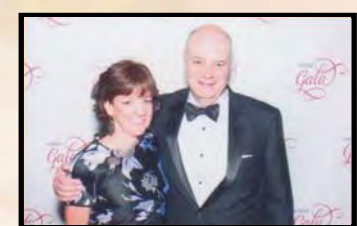

In the Gospel reading for World Mission Sunday, Jesus reminds us of His mission “to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many” (Mark 10:45). Through *Renew My Church*, we embrace this mission in which He calls us to serve others and give new life in Christ. French concert artist Olivier Latry, visits the Holy Name Cathedral, Chicago Illinois Tuesday, October 16, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. Famed concert artist and organist, Olivier Latry, titular organist of the **Cathedral of Notre-Dame** in Paris, France, will be making a rare Midwestern US, He is one of the world's most distinguished organists, having received international acclaim throughout his career. Among the repertoire for this concert, Mr. Latry will include an improvisation on a submitted theme.

Mr. Latry will perform his own work, as well as music by J S Bach and Maurice Duruflé. Mr. Latry is also renowned for his skills as an improviser, and is among the lineage of French organists/composers that included Louis Vierne, Charles-Marie Widor, Jean Langlais and Charles Tournemire.

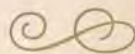

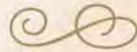

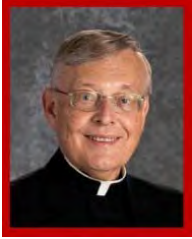

Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

Through the celebration of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, we welcome you to our home, Holy Name Cathedral. As the seat of the Archdiocese, we are uniquely both the Cathedral and a vibrant parish with over 7,000 registered households.

Many people are surprised to learn Holy Name Cathedral is a self-funded parish; meaning we depend entirely on donations, both from our parishioners and visitors, to care for our beautiful home and support our parish. Each year, we ask you to participate in our sole fundraiser to supplement our weekly collections.

I extend a warm invitation for you to join us at our Cathedral Gala on Friday, October 26, at the Four Seasons Hotel. The Gala represents ~15% of our entire annual operating budget and is vital to ensuring we fulfill our mission in our daily operations and our many outreach programs and ministries.

So, you may be asking, what does my Gala ticket purchase allow Holy Name Cathedral to accomplish? These are just some of the works your generosity provides for:

Making Disciples and Inspiring Witness

- The Mass you are attending is one of over 2,000 Masses we offer each year, as well as over 250 weddings, funerals, and other special masses throughout the liturgical year.
- Our doors are open for over 5,100 hours annually providing a place to pray, celebrate, find sanctuary, and build fellowship.
- Our liturgical music is well-known as a rich harmony with the word of God with our talented organists and many choirs.
- We offer over 600 hours of children and adult faith formation in addition to year-round Baptismal preparation to explore and strengthen the foundations of our faith.
- More than 150 Catholics are welcomed to our Faith Community through our RCIA and Adult Confirmation classes annually and over 200 babies are baptized at the Cathedral each year.

Caring for Our Neighbors

- Our Human Concerns Commission provides 22,000 dinner meals for the hungry in the Chicago area, as well as 9,000 weekend meals for school children without reliable access to food.
- Our Ministry of Care makes 30,000 visits to the homebound or hospitalized Catholics to bring them the healing Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist when they cannot come to Mass.
- We assist with over 400 tax returns resulting in \$150,000+ in refunds for those without access to basic financial advice.

Building Communities

- Creating a sense of belonging is paramount for our parish. Our Young Adults Facebook group has 1,000 active participants and we have 600 members in our busy ACT II group for those over 40 years old.
- Just this past weekend, we shared a special Saturday night Mass and blessings for hundreds of Chicago Marathon runners, along with an invitation to a pre-race pasta dinner.
- Each month, we open our doors to parishioners and guests for our Parish Life Commission's social programs including Coffee in the Courtyard after Mass, Lenten Fish Dinner and Pancake Breakfast.
- Our Women's Spiritual Ministry is offering its first Advent Evening for support during the holidays and our newly-formed Men's Spiritual Ministry just completed its initial three programs.
- The Cathedral welcomes tens of thousands of visitors every year, with our guests composing more than 50% of weekend masses, many of whom take our Docent-led Cathedral tours.

These essential works and programs are the very heart and soul of Holy Name Cathedral. We ask for your assistance in the stewardship of our home and Faith Community. Please see pages 8&9 of today's Bulletin for all of the details.

The Academy of St. Benedict the African is located in Englewood and has served the West Englewood community since 1901.

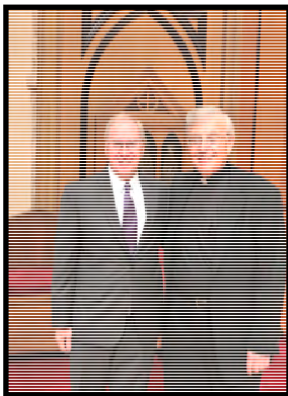
