

Message from our Rector



Dear People of God,

Fall is here! So much has happened and the pace of our lives moves at a speed where we may not know if we are coming or going. Our lives are hectic, but ultimately we do make the time to do those things we want to do that are life-giving, nourishing and needed to refuel the mind and soul.

As I reflect this weekend regarding Stewardship, it is important to realize the sharing of Time, Talent and Treasure are truly “taking a step in faith.” The following comment was made at a meeting last month and has a profound impact upon all of us. “Show me your checkbook and calendar and I will tell you what is really important to you!” What a terrific statement! What is our honest response? Does my calendar and checkbook reflect a life rooted in the real meaning of Stewardship? How do I spend my Time, Talent and Treasure? All is a gift from God and the need to “give back” with the intention of “giving forward” is at the heart of the Stewardship way of living in the footsteps of the Lord.

There is story about a man who was exploring some caves by the seashore. In one of the caves he found a canvas bag with a bunch of hardened clay balls. It was like someone had rolled up some clay and left them out in the sun to bake. They didn't look like much, but they intrigued the man so he took the bag out of the cave with him.

As he strolled along the beach, to pass the time, he would throw the clay balls one at a time out into the ocean as far as he could throw.

He thought little about it until he dropped one of the balls and it cracked open on a rock. Inside was a beautiful, precious stone. Excited, the man started breaking open the remaining clay balls. Each contained a similar treasure. He found thousands of dollars worth of jewels in the 20 or so clay balls he had left, then it struck him.

He had been on the beach a long time. He had thrown maybe 50 to 60 of the clay balls with their hidden treasure into the ocean waves. Instead of thousands of dollars worth of jewels in the 20 or so clay balls he could have had tens of thousands, but he threw it all away.

Sometimes, it's like that with people. We look at someone, maybe even ourselves, and we see the external clay vessel. It doesn't look like much from the outside. It isn't always beautiful or sparkling, so we discount it; we see that person as less important than someone more beautiful, stylish, well-known or wealthy.

But we have not taken the time to find the treasure hidden within ourselves or another person by God. There is a treasure hidden in every one of us. Scripture says we are fearfully and wonderfully made. I don't think the author means just our physical bodies. I believe the author means our spiritual selves, which are sometimes hidden from others by the “earthen vessel.”

If we take the time to get to know that person, and if we ask God the Father to show us that person the way God sees them, then the clay begins to peel away and the brilliant gem begins to shine forth.

Stewardship is realizing we are “earthen vessels” and “taking a step in faith” to make the Lord Jesus present to all we meet for generations to come. Share the gift of yourself—and let the Lord Jesus surprise you in ways you never imagined!



Building a New Home for a New Ministry

Many of us can relate to Carl Casareto's story. He moved to Chicago from Los Angeles in 2014. A father of three young adult children, he was finding his way upon his arrival in the city. Joining Holy Name Cathedral opened up new possible connections as well as discovering new ways to enrich others' faith journey. Initially, Carl went through Parish Leadership discernment and joined the Faith Formation Commission whose mission is to help our fellow parishioners grow in discipleship by deepening our Catholic faith.



About a year ago, Fr. John Boivin invited Carl to join a steering committee to explore the creation of a Men's Ministry. Carl shares, "I was moved by the concept of a parish-based community of men who came together in fellowship with the objective of enriching each other's faith journey. I had been involved with similar groups in Los Angeles primarily focused on semi-annual retreats, and the concept of a group participating in a more expanded menu of activities is intriguing."

This exploration led to the group formation process, including early events, information gathering, and outreach over the last year. "The Ministry offers an opportunity for men in the parish to gather and apply a faith-based focus to the implications and opportunities of activities in our daily lives. Through speakers, artistic presentations and group discussion, we've addressed a variety of topics, including, ethical conduct in the work environment, effective service, the benefits of forgiveness, being open to the influence and calling of the Holy Spirit, and maintaining a meaningful prayer life in a hectic schedule."

Carl personally finds one of the most significant benefits of this ministry is "knowing we all face similar challenges on our life journey. I gained both insight and a sense of support from group activities that have helped me maintain a faith-based focus in my daily encounters."

"There is a commonality of challenges in maintaining a spiritual focus across a wide variety of vocations...we are all busy and overcommitted to a large extent. It is sometimes difficult to find the time and energy to attend meetings. The thing that keeps me coming back is that I always feel better and more connected to Christ when I'm walking home after the meeting."

The Men's Ministry is in its infancy and welcomes all who would like to join. As Carl reflects, "This is the kind of group that benefits from a deep flavor of experiences. Our challenge to date is growing the group to gain insight from a greater number of life experiences and perspectives."

Fr. Boivin has shepherded this new ministry in its formation and launch. Ken Ortega will now assume staff support going forward. Want more information? Email Ken at kortega@holynamecathedral.org. We would love to see you at their next event!
