

Message from our Rector



Dear People of God,

Am I sometimes too quick in judging others? Do I expect life always on my terms? Life is truly a mystery to be lived and not a problem to be solved. May we always hold a profound trust in God who is our hope, joy, strength and destiny and keep reading.

Don't we all?

"I was parked in front of the mall wiping off my car. I had just come from the car wash and was waiting for my wife to get out of work. Coming my way from across the parking lot was a homeless man. From the looks of him, he had no car, no home, no clean clothes and no money. There are times when you feel generous but there are other times that you just don't want to be bothered. This was one of those 'don't want to be bothered' times. 'I hope he doesn't ask me for any money,' I thought. He didn't.

He came and sat on the curb in front of the bus stop, but he didn't look like he could have enough money to even ride the bus. After a few minutes he spoke. 'That's a very pretty car,' he said. He was ragged but he had an air of dignity around him. His scraggly blond beard kept more than his face warm. I said, 'thanks,' and continued wiping off my car. He sat there quietly as I worked. The expected plea for money never came. As the silence between us widened something inside said, 'ask him if he needs any help.' I was sure that he would say 'yes' but I held true to the inner voice. 'Do you need any help?' I asked. He answered in three simple but profound words that I shall never forget.

We often look for wisdom in great men and women. We expect it from those of higher learning and accomplishments. I expected nothing but an outstretched grimy hand. He spoke the three words that shook me. 'Don't we all?' he said. I was feeling high and mighty, successful and important, about a homeless man in the street, until those three words hit me like a twelve gauge shotgun. Don't we all? I needed help. Maybe not for bus fare or a place to sleep, but I needed help. I reached into my wallet and gave him not only enough for bus fare, but enough to get a warm meal and shelter for the day.

Those three little words still ring true. No matter how much you have, no matter how much you have accomplished, you need help too. No matter how little you have, no matter how loaded you are with problems, even without money or a place to sleep, you can give help. Even if it's a compliment, you can give that. You never know when you may see someone that appears to have it all. They are waiting on you to give them what they don't have. A different perspective on life, a glimpse at something beautiful, a respite from daily chaos, that only you through a torn world can see. Maybe he was more than that. Maybe he was sent by a power that is great and wise, to minister to a soul too comfortable in himself. Maybe God looked down, called an Angel, dressed him in tattered clothing, then said, 'Go minister to that man cleaning the car, that man needs help.' Don't we all?"





Our Cathedral, Our Home

Did You Know?

We share a common heritage with generations of parishioners who came before us and supported Holy Name Cathedral for nearly 170 years. It is now our turn. Once a year, we ask all of you to help us care for our home as the downtown Chicago's Faith Community.

Our annual Gala is our sole fundraiser for the Cathedral. As a self-funding parish, we count on both parishioners and visitors who join us for our 2,000+ masses each year. As you can imagine, it takes significant resources to ensure the Cathedral is a safe, "warm-in-the-winter and cool-in-the-summer" haven for prayer and reflection during the 5,100 hours we are open to everyone.

Holy Name Cathedral is a busy parish with 30 lay ministries and groups offering spiritual, service, and social programs, all designed to journey with you as Disciples of Christ. We offer over 600 hours of faith formation for children and adults, baptize over 200 babies, and celebrate 200+ weddings each year. Our Ministers of Care make over 30,000 visits to bring the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist to hospitalized and homebound Catholics.

Many of our ministries focus on the needs of our neighbors, surviving to live on the margins of our society. Each year, we provide 22,000 meals for the homeless, 9,000 weekend meals for food-insecure schoolchildren, and offer programs to assist with joblessness, issues facing unwed mothers, and with government agencies.

The Cathedral Parish is also a place of warmth and fellowship with social programs designed for a range of age groups and personal interests. Our Young Adults group has over 1,000 members with our ACT II membership at 600 people. We celebrate the culture and heritage of our diverse parish with groups like the Cathedral Filipino Network and welcome visitors like the Chicago Marathon runners for special blessings and a pre-race pasta dinner.

We are blessed to have a dedicated group known as the Gala Committee whose members donate their time, talent, and treasure over eight months to plan and deliver our Gala. This year, our Rector gave us a stretch goal to raise 75% more funds. We offer a very special thank-you to our Honorary Co-Chairs, Arlene Wymer and Joanna Norcross, for their leadership and time as well as their generous donations for the décor and dinner. Raising Funds To Care For Our Home

The Holy Name Cathedral Gala does not just happen. It unfolds from many discussions, the sharing and debate of ideas, and the giving of time and talent. The 2018 Gala Committee is made up of 18 parishioners who have been meeting since March 19 to make this year's Gala happen!

The committee is as diverse as all who call the Cathedral their home parish. Several members are new parishioners who have never attended the Gala, like Elizabeth Kuroski who wanted to "help where I can." Morgan Funk, a Young Adult, heard about the Gala at a New Parishioner reception from Mark Teresi, the HNC staff member leading the Gala. Her conversation with Mark prompted her to join the committee the next day! JoAnn Bridge supported similar events in Pennsylvania, where she lived before coming to Chicago and joining Holy Name ten years ago.



The committee also includes some veterans. Mary Canavan is a long-time parishioner who has attended all but one Gala. She was asked to join the committee nine years ago and has served on it ever since. Arlene Wymer, who joined Holy Name 10 years ago, has attended eight Galas and

has served on the committee for six years. Arlene is co-chairing this year's Gala with Joanna Norcross, who is new to the parish but had attended last year's Gala and wants to support Fr. Greg's work here at Holy Name Cathedral.

Dan Aregoni has been on the Gala Committee for four years, always generous with his time, ideas, and donations of wine for the evening. "The first day I walked into the Cathedral 30 years ago, I felt the presence of God and the power of the Holy Spirit. From that point on, it was my place called home. It is in my DNA!"

Fr. Greg's goals for the Gala are to build community, highlight the Cathedral, have fun, and raise lots of money! The funds raised "allow us to serve our parishioners as well as the community" states JoAnn. Mary says the challenge is "helping people understand the critical importance" of the financial support from the Gala. The Gala marketing sub-committee initiated the new Bulletin stories about our 30 ministries and groups as well as sharing the "Did you Know" facts to help everyone understand the costs of caring for our Cathedral home.

Each Committee member has personal goals for the event. Morgan wants to "reinstate the silent auction and have it be a big success." The silent auction "will introduce items in a larger range of values and affordability. There will be something for everyone to bid on! We also have a few new surprises up our sleeves this year, that will be fun and very exciting for those in attendance!"

The Committee hopes activities at the Gala such as the silent auction and the wine pull, will encourage people who have never attended the Gala before to join in. After all, it's for a good cause. As Arlene says "I feel I should pass my blessings on; I remember all belongs to God, not me."
