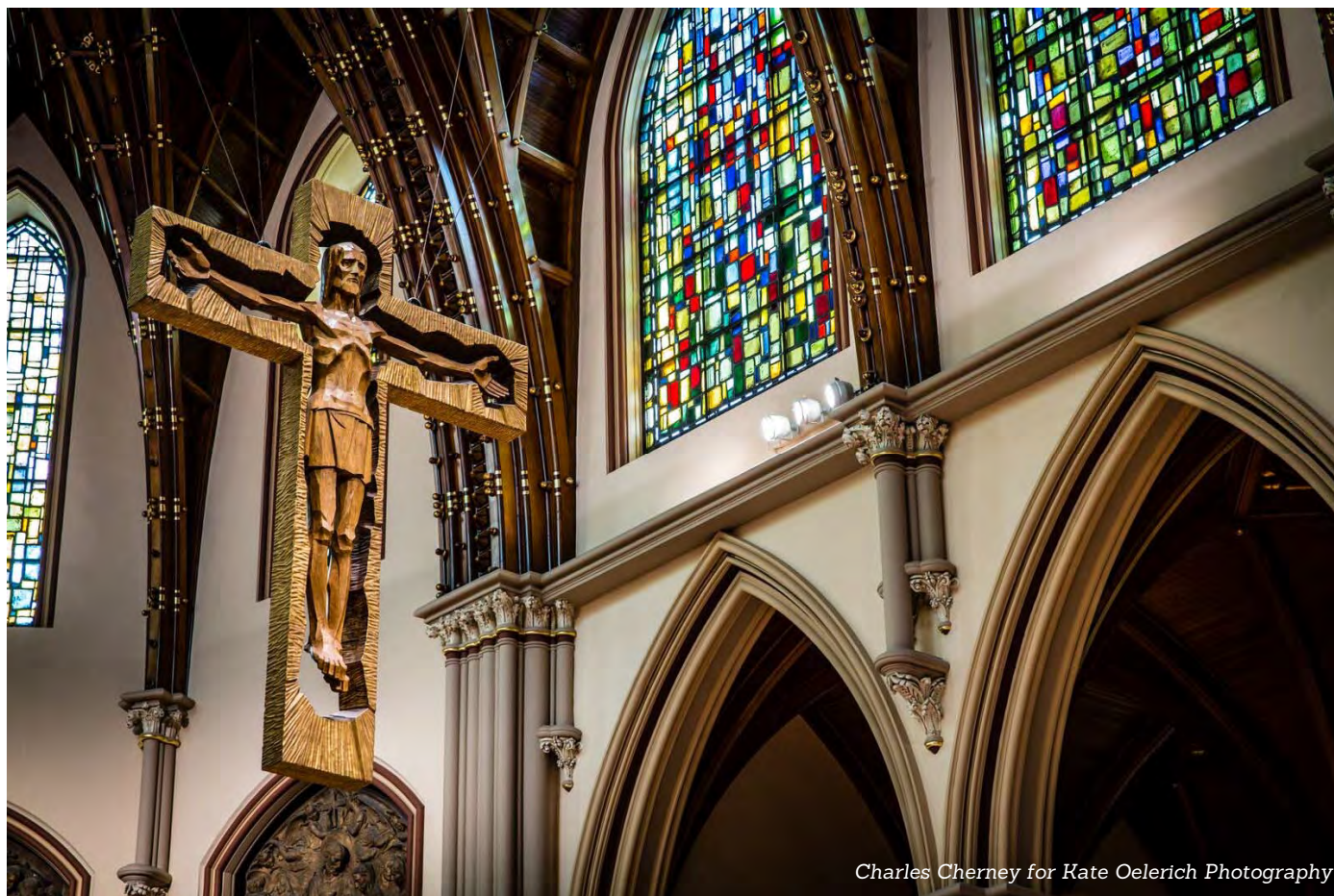

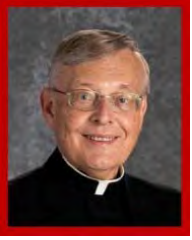

In one of his journal notations, Thomas Merton writes that we are always thinking that our life will be truly be happy “when.” We are not satisfied with what is currently our situation because we have it in our mind that our life won’t be happy until something else occurs:

when I get rid of that personality flaw of mine,
when I can finally have life as I have always dreamed it to be,
when I am truly successful,

Longing for promises and dreaming dreams is not a harmful deed as long as the present moment is not overlooked, as long as gratitude rises for what is already here, as long as I do not base my happiness on what is still wanting. Script and Scripture: Hollywood's Catechism and the Catholic Faith

Speaker: BRUCE LESPINASSE

Parishioner Bruce Lespinasse holds a B.A. in history & philosophy from Loyola University, Chicago. He taught high school history for several years and has given many lectures locally on film study. An active member of ACT II, he is presently focused on Adult Education endeavors such as this program.

In this presentation, Bruce addresses the question, "Has philosophy determined the tides of history, or was it the other way around?"

To this end, he will examine three "Theories" from the field of the philosophy of history:

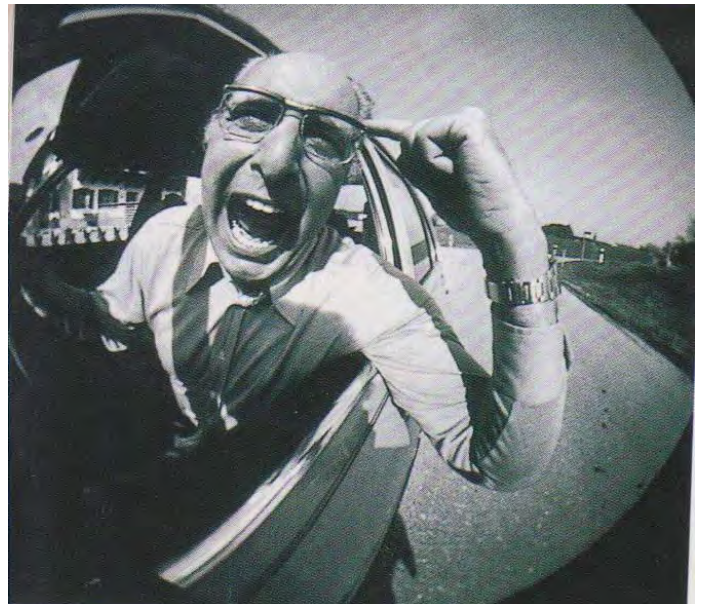
