

## Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

Christmas Day is over, but our Christmas Season continues. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. How appropriate to celebrate this Holy Feast on the heels of Christmas Day. Christmas is more than the birth of Jesus into the world. The celebration of Christmas and the Christmas Season is also about all of us. We are also the “Reason for the Season.” We make the Lord Jesus present by the love, care, hope, joy and spirit of love and forgiveness we show others.

2018 is quickly coming to a close. Where did the year go? How quickly our lives move from childhood to our “Winter Season” of life. The following story beautifully captures the “spirit” of a joy-filled life.

### Attitude of Gratitude

The 92-year-old, petite, well-poised and proud lady, who is fully dressed each morning by eight o’clock, with her hair fashionably coiffed and makeup perfectly applied, even though she is legally blind, moved to a nursing home today. Her husband of 70 years recently passed away, making the move necessary.

After many hours of waiting patiently in the lobby of the nursing home, she smiled sweetly when told her room was ready. As she maneuvered her walker to the elevator, I provided a visual description of her tiny room, including the eyelet sheets that I had hung on her window. “I love it,” she stated with the enthusiasm of an eight-year-old having just been presented with a new puppy.

“Mrs. Jones, you haven’t seen the room . . . just wait.” “That doesn’t have anything to do with it,” she replied. “Happiness is something you decide on ahead of time. Whether I like my room or not doesn’t depend on how the furniture is arranged . . . it’s how I arrange my mind. I already decided to love it . . . It’s a decision I make every morning when I wake up. I have a choice: I can spend the day in bed recounting the difficulty I have with the parts of my body that no longer work, or get out of bed and be thankful for the ones that do. Each day is a gift, and as long as my eyes are open I’ll focus on the new day and all the happy memories I’ve stored away . . . Just for this time in my life. Old age is like a bank account . . . you withdraw from what you’ve put in. So my advice to you would be to deposit a lot of happiness and joy in the bank account of memories. I am still depositing.”

Remember the seven simple rules to be happy:

1. Free your heart from hatred.
2. Free your mind from worries.
3. Live simply and for others.
4. Give more.
5. Expect less.
6. Forgive, forgive and forgive more!
7. Last, but most importantly, root life in God through faith in Jesus Christ.

And regarding the Holy Family . . . . .

Are you aware that if we died tomorrow, the company that we are working for could easily replace us in a matter of days. But the family we left behind will feel the loss for the rest of their lives. And come to think of it, many of us pour ourselves more into work than into our own family, an unwise investment indeed, don’t you think?





CFN celebrates the annual Feast of Santo Niño with the venerated statue of the Child Jesus of Prague. The devotion to the Child Jesus is ubiquitous and observed with reverence around the world. In the Philippines, Santo Niño de Cebu was a gift from Ferdinand Magellan in 1521 to the Queen Humamay, wife of Rajah (king) Humabon. This miraculous statue was later discovered blackened and covered with ashes after a coastal town was set on fire and razed by the Spaniards, who brought Christianity to the Philippines.



The image of the Santo Niño is the oldest surviving Catholic relic in the Philippines, along with the Magellan cross. At Holy Name, the Feast of Santo Niño includes Illinois and Indiana devotees, who bring their Santo Niño statues for blessings during the Mass.
