

Message from the Rector



Dear People of God,

This Tuesday marks the 46th anniversary of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton.

The January 2014 *Columbia* magazine had a marvelous article entitled, “The Gospel of Life According to Pope Francis.” This article traces Pope Francis’ key pro-life statements beginning as Cardinal Bergoglio and including comments since his Papacy started in March 2013.

During his 15 years as Archbishop of Buenos Aires to the present time, Pope Francis has always defended the dignity of human life from the moment of conception to natural death. Pope Francis has consistently had primary concern for the most vulnerable and defenseless human beings including children (born and unborn), the disabled and the elderly. We have seen this lived out on live television—inviting children into the sanctuary and kissing the elderly and sick.

On Abortion

The moral problem with abortion is of a pre-religious nature because the genetic code of the person is present at the moment of conception. This means that a human being already exists. I separate the issue of abortion from any religious concept. It is a scientific problem. To not allow further progress in the development of a being that already has the entire genetic code of a human being is not ethical. The right to life is the first human right. Abortion means killing someone who cannot defend himself.

I share with you a small portion of the homily delivered by Cardinal Cupich at the Mass for Life celebrated at Holy Name Cathedral on January 14, 2018.

“God takes the initiative and calls us each by name. In a word, life is a personal invitation from God. Looking into the face of a new born child is one of the most powerful reminders of this truth. . . . The bedrock of our work of protecting the life in the womb must always be this respectful conviction that each of our names is known to God, each of our lives is an invitation by one who loved us before we ever did anything, like we love a new born baby, with no duty to prove ourselves or make life by our own wits and imagination It is a conviction that will still our hearts lest they grow weary and calm our voices lest they become cynical and harsh in our respect life efforts. We are confident in all we do, because God has reached out to us personally, inviting us to share his dreams and he will not disappoint us. . . . As we take hold of our children’s hand they remind us that God continues to take hold of us as we journey in life. And through the children he gives us, not only do we have joy of passing on to them what we have received, disciples calling disciples, but through them we touch the future God in every building.”

In a *Peanuts* cartoon, Linus is watching television. Into the family room storms Lucy. Putting her fist right into his face, Lucy demands that Linus change the channel to what she wants to watch.

“What makes you think you can just walk right in here and take over?” Linus wants to know. Lucy shouts back. “These five fingers! Individually, they are nothing. But when I curl them together into a single unit, they form a weapon that is terrible to behold!” Linus shrinks, “OK, what channel do you want to watch?”

As Lucy takes her place in front of the television, Linus turns away and looks at his own fingers, and says, “Why can’t you guys get organized like that?”

All of us together must take our fingers and not make a fist, but rather hold hands and reach out with open hands to a world in need of love and forgiveness. And, together, we must work and pray to bring an end to abortion.

I have dealt with women considering an abortion and shown compassion to women who have had an abortion.

The word “compassion” comes from the root meaning “to suffer with.” We must show compassion—and do not judge! We certainly pray for an end to abortion, but we must show compassion and not judge. God always forgives!

We are challenged to see the world differently through the eyes of Christ.

At the same time, the Church does offer forgiveness and healing for women who have had an abortion. Project Rachel is a sensitive, private, free and confidential experience with a network of specially trained priests and caring people who understand the painful road back from abortion. All life is sacred and a gift from God. May we pray for an end to abortion and love this world back into life.



The **Lector** is a proclaimer of the Word of God to those gathered for worship. Our goal for lectors at Holy Name Cathedral is that hearing the Word of God proclaimed by our Lectors will open wide the doors to Christ for the faithful because of the love of scripture that stems from their ministry.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist the priest in distributing the Eucharist to those gathered for worship. As an EMHC, you become an essential part of us opening wide the doors to Christ as people come forth to receive the Lord in the Eucharist.



The **Art and Environment Team** enrich our worship space to reflect the liturgical season. A core group of volunteers decorate the church in an effort to instill a more full participation in the liturgy by those assembled. Volunteers to help the team are always needed especially in unloading and placing plants and in watering.




Human Concerns


