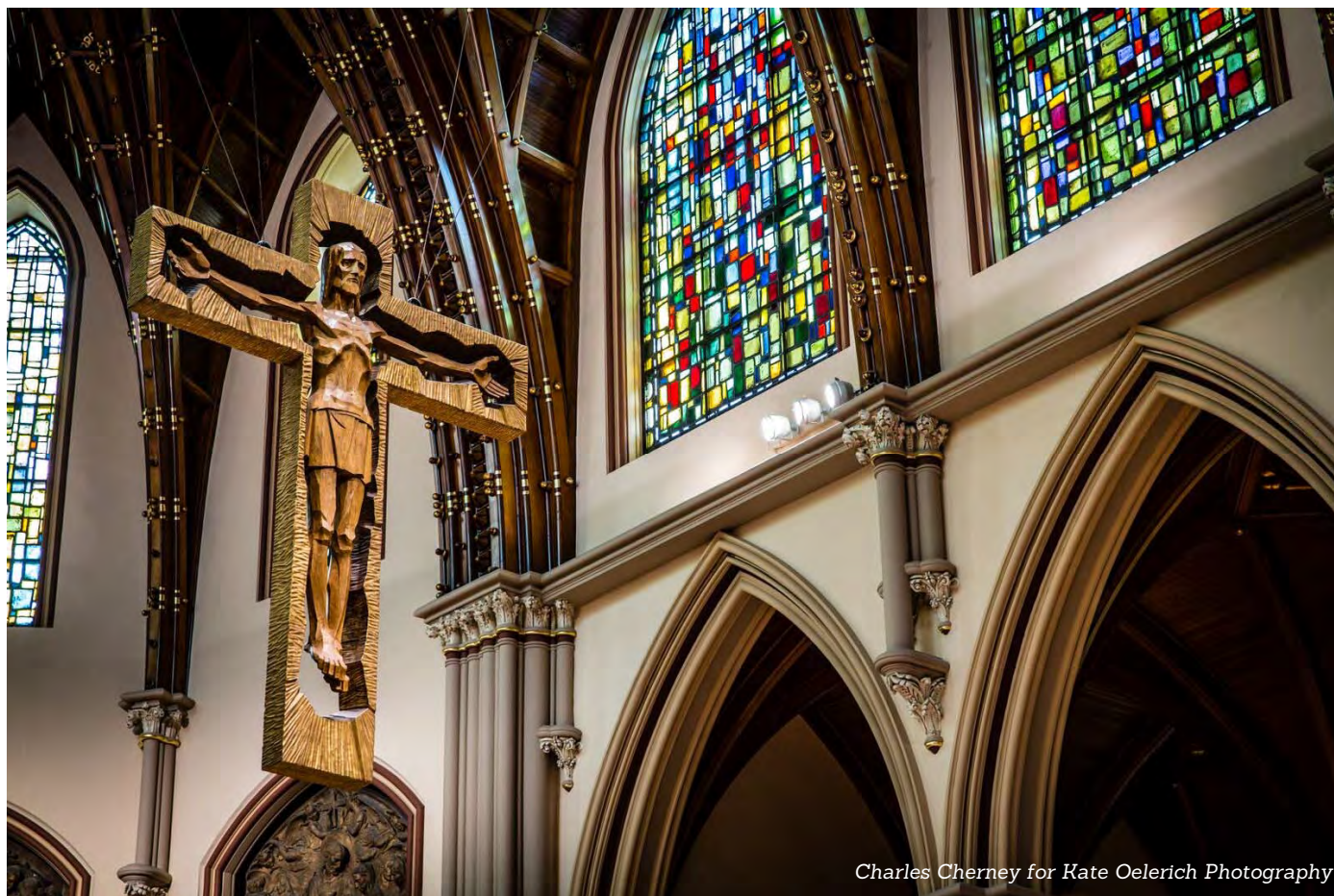

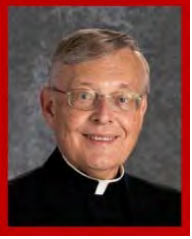

The Pope himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, in 1991, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day.

The Sacrament of the Sick will be celebrated with a special Liturgy for the Sick on Monday, February 11 at 12:10 pm Mass.

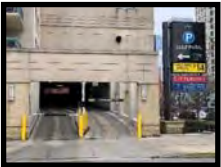
Parking Option #1: Loyola University Self-Park Lot



The Loyola Lot is at 20 W. Chicago Avenue, on north side of the street, between State Street and Dearborn Avenue, just past Dunkin' Donuts. All cars will enter through two lanes on Chicago Avenue. The exit is at the back of the lot on Pearson Street. You will be able to see the Starbucks sign on the red and green building.



Parking Option #2: One West Superior (OWS) Self-Park



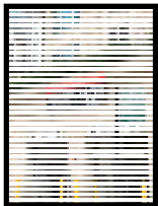
There are two entrances for One West Superior (OWS) Parking.

Entrance #1 & Exit for all cars, on Superior Street, just east of Dearborn and across the street from Bella Luna restaurant.

Entrance #2 (no exit here), on the west side of State Street, between Superior and Huron Streets. It is to the right of ChiroOne and FlyWheel. It is to the left of the former Roy's Restaurant.

There is no charge for this service.

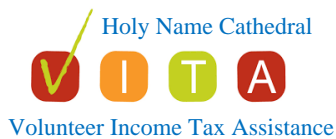
Can you help prepare taxes?
