

Wanting more for her son, Victor, Norma found a CRS-sponsored program that teaches young mothers how to give their children a healthy start. Now Norma is a mother monitor. "I'm proud to share my experience and the lessons I learned with other women."

**Caldo de Frijol Recipe 4-6 servings**

- 1 T fair trade olive oil
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 c water or vegetable broth
- 1 green chili diced
- 2 tomatoes, diced
- 3 15 oz. cans black beans, drained & rinsed
- 2 t ground cumin
- 2 t chili power
- 1/2 t salt
- Cilantro, minced



In a large pot, sauté onion and garlic in oil until brown. In a blender, combine 1 c water/broth and 2 cans of beans. Blend until smooth. Add onion mixture. Stir in tomatoes, chili, remaining beans, water/broth, and spics. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cover, and simmer for 15 minutes. Serve with cilantro. Donate money for meat to your Rice Bowl.




## Holy Name Cathedral Interim Parking Plan

On Monday, March 18, construction will begin on the new One Chicago Square (OCS) complex and our current parking lot (State & Superior) will close. The Archdiocese has arranged for three alternative parking lots for weekends and two for weeknight activities. These will be used over the next 2-3 years until we are able to move into new, expanded parking spaces on the OCS lower level floors.

On weeknights (M-F) after 6pm and all day on weekends :

**Option #1: One West Superior Self-Park**, located on the corner of Dearborn and Superior (2nd entrance on State St.). Validated parking for weeknights (M-F) after 6pm & weekends; 3 hour maximum free parking

**Option #2: Fordham Self-Park**, located on Huron between Wabash Ave and State St. Validated parking for weeknights (M-F) after 6pm & weekends; 3 hour maximum free parking



**On Weekends Only:** There will be a 3rd option at the **Loyola University**, located at 20 W. Chicago Avenue, between State and Dearborn. The entrance for this lot is on Chicago Avenue and the exit is at the back of the lot on Pearson.

This lot will be open on Saturdays from 7:30am to 9:00pm and on Sundays from 6:30am to 9:00pm. This lot will be monitored by Cathedral Security. Since we will need to turn these spaces for our many Masses, we ask you respect a **two-hour parking limit**. The use of this lot is limited to Cathedral Mass attendees and Cathedral program guests.

### **Validation Processes for Options #1 and #2:**

- ⇒ For weekend Masses: Will be done with validation machines (separate ones for each parking lot) located in the Vestibule of the Cathedral. There will be people in Vestibule to assist you in getting your ticket validated. Ticket validation for these public parking lots can be done at any time, before Mass or after Mass.
- ⇒ For weeknights (M-F) and weekend activities: The person/group sponsoring the activity will provide ticket validation process for their event.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** *If you exceed the 3-hour free validated parking period for Options #1 and #2, **you will be liable to pay for the entire time you parked.***
