Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

With this letter I write to you about the development that should disturb us greatly, both as citizens and as disciples of Jesus, the Lord of life.

Recently, two bills have been introduced in the Illinois House and Senate. The first, House Bill 2495 and Senate Bill 1942, both identical pieces of legislation, seeks to strip unborn persons of any protection—or even consideration - under the law and declare abortion to be a “fundamental right” and matter of health care. The end result is that an abortion could be obtained at any stage of pregnancy, including last term, for any reason and without any regulation. The law would no longer guarantee any modicum of humanity or compassion for any unborn person in Illinois, even if they are partially born. This legislation also repeals the Abortion Performance Refusal Act, which protects doctors, nurses and hospitals who refuse to permit, recommend, perform or assist in abortion. In so doing, rights of conscience, especially religious objections, will be lost.

The second piece of legislation House Bill 2467 and its identical Senate Bill 1594, repeals the Illinois Parental Notice of Abortion Act. This law, upheld unanimously by the Illinois Supreme Court just six years ago, has the common-sense purpose of ensuring that parents would be part of the life-altering decision of their minor child in the case she seeks an abortion. This effective law has reduced abortions performed on minors by fifty-seven percent.

As citizens of a state and people of faith who care about the common good I urge you to join me and my brother bishops in an effort to defeat this radical departure from current law and practice in our state. Please reach out your State Representative and Senator to urge defeat of these bills. 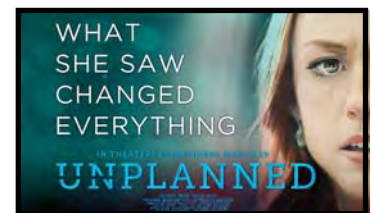

Parking at Holy Name Cathedral

The former Cathedral parking lot, located at State and Superior, is now permanently closed. Over the next four years, the new One Chicago Square (OCS) complex will be built.

In the interim for the next 2-3 years, until we have access to our new parking lot in OCS, the Archdiocese has arranged for the following parking lots to be used:

WEEKENDS

Our primary parking lot will be the **Loyola University Self-Park Lot**, located at 20 W. Chicago Avenue, between State and Dearborn Streets. The entrance for this lot is on Chicago Avenue and the exit is at the back of the parking lot on Pearson Street.

The Loyola lot will be open on Saturdays from 7:30am to 9:00pm and on Sundays from 6:30am to 9:00pm. This lot will be monitored by Cathedral Security.

Since we need to turn these parking spaces for our many Mass attendees, we ask you to respect a **two-hour parking limit**. Use of this lot is limited to attendees of Cathedral Masses and Cathedral programs.

If the Loyola Lot is full, there are two other parking lots where the Cathedral will provide 3 hours of validated, free parking.

You can validate your ticket in the Vestibule of the Cathedral, before or after Mass.

Option #1: One West Superior Self-Park, located on the SE corner of Dearborn and Superior (additional entrance on west side of State Street).

Option #2: Fordham Self-Park, located on the north side Huron Street between Wabash Avenue and State Street.



WEEKDAYS: After 6:00pm Monday-Friday, you may use either the One West Superior or Fordham Parking Lots for 3 hours of validated, free parking. Validation information will be provided by the Cathedral program coordinator.

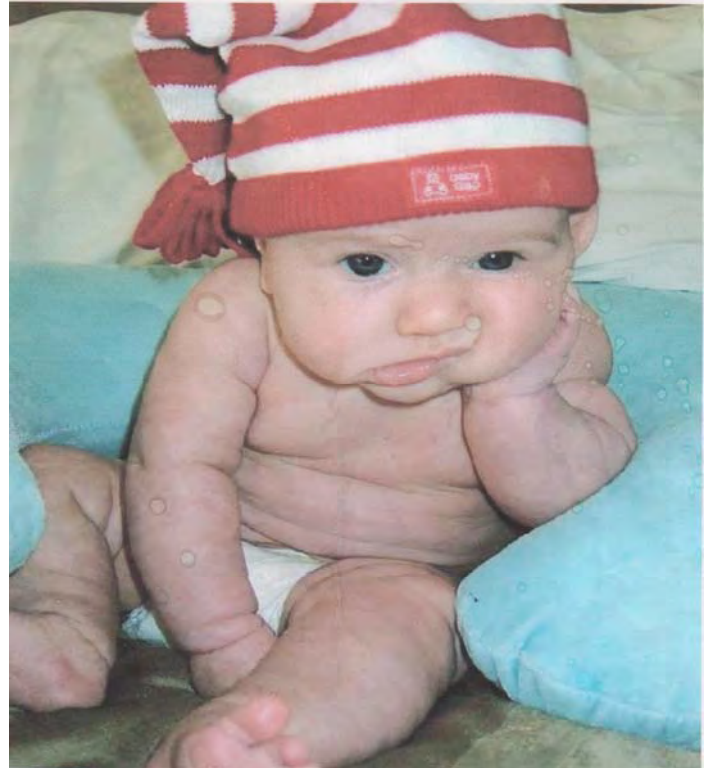
