Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

With our Season of Lent beginning its fourth week, I have spent time each morning in reflective prayer. The early morning is quiet and this Lenten Season I am making extra time to pray every day. I share with you several short pieces of reading that have touched my heart. As we continue our Lenten journey, may the Lord Jesus touch your heart. Go to the Lord Jesus just as you are—and let the Spirit of God transform, change and surprise you in ways you never expected!



“Your goal is not to live long; it’s to live.

Jesus says the options are clear. On one side there is the voice of safety.

You can build a fire in the hearth, stay inside, and stay warm and dry and safe

Or you can hear the voice of adventure—God’s adventure. Instead of building a fire in your hearth, build a fire in your heart. Follow God’s impulses. Adopt the child. Move overseas.

Teach the class. Change careers. Run for office. Make a difference. Sure it isn’t safe, but what is?”

And the late Bishop Kenneth Untener wrote in the “Little Black Lenten Book: (Diocese of Saginaw, Michigan):

“Sometimes we think of the sacrifices of Lent. The word sacrifice means to “make holy.” It’s a gift that we give to God as we take away anything that stands between us.

When we bring things to the altar—we call them sacrifices. It is a gift to God, and it’s the best gift we could ever give ourselves because it makes us holy, closer to God. It eliminates something between us and God.”

And our Lenten Season can also be a time of added stress—too much to do and not enough time to accomplish all these “important” tasks. The following story may put stress and our Season of Lent into better perspective.

A lecturer, when explaining stress management to an audience, raised a glass of water and asked, “How heavy is this glass of water?” Answers called out ranged from 20g to 500g.

The lecturer replied, “The absolute weight of water doesn’t matter. It depends on how long you try to hold it. If I hold it for a minute, that’s not a problem. If I hold it for an hour, I’ll have an ache in my right arm. If you hold it for a day, you’ll have to call an ambulance. In each case, it’s the same weight, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it becomes.” He continued, “And that’s the way it is with stress management. If we carry our burdens all the time, sooner or later, as the burden becomes increasingly heavy, we won’t be able to carry on.

As with the glass of water, you have to put it down for a while and rest before holding again. When we’re refreshed, we can carry on with the burden. So, before you return home tonight, put the burden of work down. Don’t carry it home. You can pick it up tomorrow. Whatever burdens you’re carrying now, let them down for a moment if you can. Relax; pick them up later after you’ve rested. Life is short. Enjoy it!”

Lent is a time of repentance and change. It is also a time to let go of life’s burdens and stress and invite the Lord Jesus to carry the load. It is never too late to change, but we have to know what to look for with the help and grace of God.



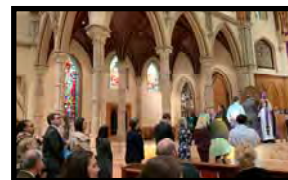

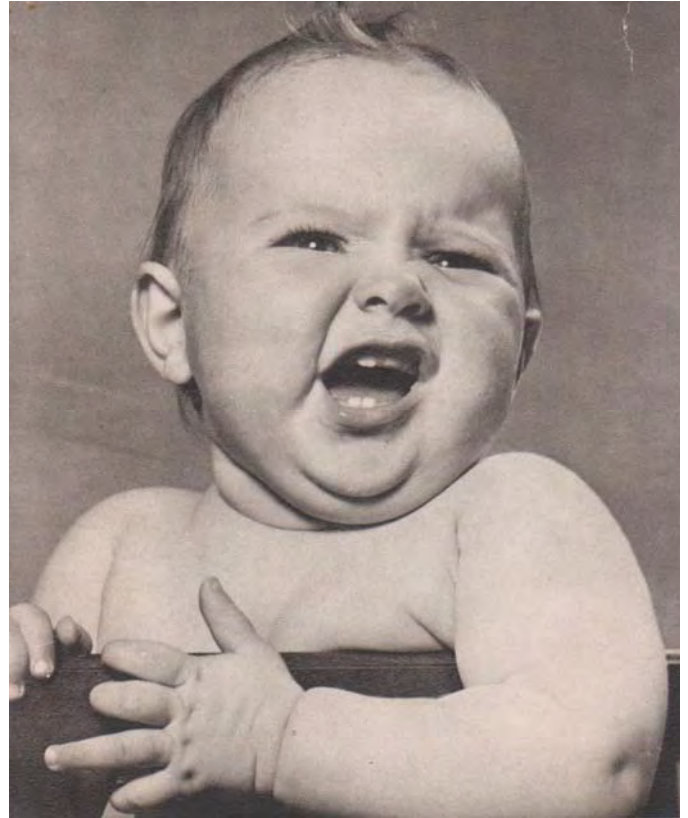
