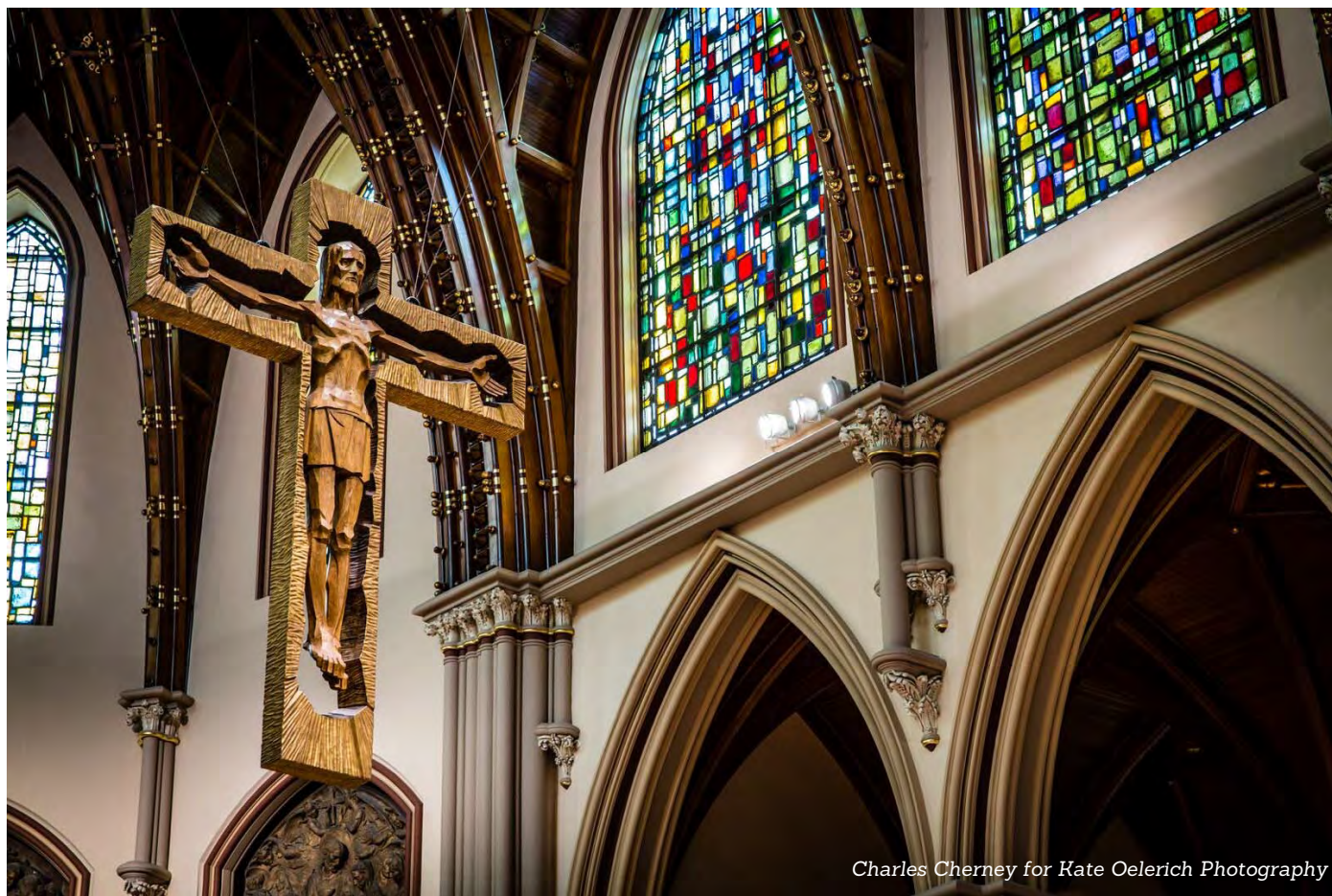

Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

Easter Joy!! On this most glorious of celebrations of the power of life over death, and love over hate, I would like to share the following story with you.

“It seems that two notoriously bad little brothers, Leo and Andrew, started to get into trouble soon after leaving the cradle. They were always catching blame and they usually deserved it. After they started up a small riot in school, their parents decided to send the older son, Leo, who was in the sixth grade, to their minister for counseling. Little Leo was terrified. He wondered what it would be like to be one-on-one with the minister. The minister looked at the boy compassionately and asked, “Young man, where is Jesus?” The boy had no idea what to say and he sat as silent as a stone. The minister asked again, “Where is Jesus?” Leo’s jaw remained locked. When the minister asked the question a third time with greater emphasis, Leo bolted out of the office, raced home and ran upstairs to pack. Seeing his younger brother, he said, “Andrew, you’d better pack, too. They’ve lost Jesus and I know for sure they’re going to blame us!”



We know that Jesus is not lost! He, who was thought to be dead, lives! In fact, Jesus lives forever! Because of Jesus’ victory over death, we are no longer lost; we are found and claimed as God’s children forever.

We travel with Jesus from aloneness to fullness within a Faith Community, from brokenness to healing, from death to life. The Lord is risen and we rise with Him.

We wonder what the meaning of this remarkable event is in our lives. On this great Easter Day, we share the Lord’s Easter peace, presence and power. In return, the Lord tells us that He wants our love shown through lives that are lived for others. Jesus wants us to be real disciples. To be a real disciple of Jesus means three distinct things:

First, it means vulnerability. I must acknowledge that I cannot always be in control and turn to the Lord, trusting completely in Him. It means I accept life will not always be on my terms and allow God to work through me.

Secondly, it means that I live life deliberately. We are a pilgrim and mission people. Through our Baptism, we have been called to give witness to our loving God through our actions as well as our words. We are called to love this world continually back into life by what we do and say, how we act and love.

Lastly, a disciple has a radical dependence on God. The Lord can make a difference in our lives if we give Him a chance. A disciple communicates frequently with God. The devil does not want us consulting with God.

The gospels do not explain Easter, rather Easter explains the gospels. Our lives do not explain Easter, rather, Easter gives meaning to our lives. Faith is the story we tell with our lives. Jesus discovered what to die for and what to live forever for.

For the believer, death means life is changed, not ended. We look forward to eternal life with God.

My prayers are with you and all your loved ones for a blessed and joyous Easter.



Easter 2019



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we walk on our life journeys in this world, we may often feel overwhelmed. Struggle and suffering can mark our lives because of health issues, job insecurity, family concerns, or the painful loss of a loved one. The world itself, in Saint Paul's words, "has been groaning" (Roman 8:22), as it struggles with wars, violence, ecological degradation, economic injustice, and natural disasters. And as we are keenly aware this past year, the Church herself has struggled mightily with the shameful legacy of abuse and its mismanagement.

It seems that the landscape of our lives is entirely shaped by struggle and suffering. And that might seem to be the sum and substance of it all, but, in faith, we know that it is not. Our celebration of the Lord's Resurrection in this Easter season opens our eyes beyond this desperate landscape to a new and hope-filled horizon. There is more to the story than our struggle and suffering. In the Resurrection of Jesus, we can begin to see a new life ahead of us that God offers to us.

As we go forth in this Easter season, I am reminded of the great Psalm 118 that the church so often prays:

*I was thrust down, thrust down and falling,
but the Lord was my helper.
The Lord is my strength and my song;
and has been my savior.
There are shouts of joy and victory
in the tents of the just. (vv. 13-15)*

May this Easter season renew within you and your loved ones the conviction that God is your helper and an abiding awareness of your victory in the Risen Lord Jesus.

From Lenten Almsgiving to Year-Round Almsgiving

Our Ash Wednesday Gospel urged us to be attentive to people in need, and one of the most basic needs is food. You have been generous to Operation Rice Bowl and Chicago Shares. But hunger is not only year round but daily, many times daily.

In March 2006 (already 13 years!) Our Human Concerns Commission sponsored our Thursday Suppers served at Catholic Charities. 130 guests dine in and an additional 80 people are given a take-away-bag (sandwich, banana, chips, juice box, dessert). *In August 2007, this outreach was expanded to include Friday Suppers.*

Though some local restaurants donate most Thursday dine-in meals, the Friday Suppers and all the take-away-bags are funded by people like you, parishioners and guests. Would you be willing to extend your Lenten almsgiving to a form of year round almsgiving?

Some benefactors donate once a year, some once a month and some once a week. Every penny of every donor dollar is used only for this ministry. If you are passing LaSalle Street on a weekday afternoon and see the lines of people waiting to enter Catholic Charities, they are the guests we serve.

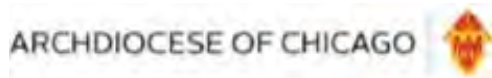
