Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

The Lord is Risen! Alleluia!

We are an Easter people and the promise of the Risen Lord is so abundant we call it eternal. I would like to share with you a powerful story. It is truly worth reading—and sending to a loved one.



The Rose

The first day of school our professor introduced himself and challenged us to get to know someone we didn't already know. I stood up to look around when a gentle hand touched my shoulder. I turned around to find a wrinkled little old lady beaming up at me with a smile that lit up her entire being. She said, "Hi, handsome. My name is Rose. I'm 87 years old. Can I give you a hug?" I laughed and enthusiastically responded, "Of course you may!" and she gave me a giant squeeze. "Why are you in college at such a young, innocent age?" I asked. She jokingly replied, "I'm here to meet a rich husband, get married, have a couple of children, and then retire and travel." "No, seriously," I asked. I was curious what may have motivated her to be taking on this challenge at her age. "I always dreamed of having a college education and now I'm getting one!" she told me.

After class we walked to the student union building and shared a chocolate milkshake. We became instant friends. Every day for the next three months we would leave class and talk nonstop. I was always mesmerized listening to this "time machine" as she shared her wisdom and experience with me. Over the course of the year, Rose became a campus icon and easily made friends wherever she went. She loved to dress up and she reveled in the attention bestowed upon her from the other students. She was living it up.

At the end of the semester we invited Rose to speak at our football banquet and I'll never forget what she taught us. She was introduced and stepped up to the podium. As she began to deliver her prepared speech, she dropped her three by five cards on the floor. Frustrated and a little embarrassed, she leaned into the microphone and simply said, "I'm sorry I'm so jittery. I gave up beer for Lent and this whiskey is killing me! I'll never get my speech back in order so let me just tell you what I know." As we laughed, she cleared her throat and began:

"We do not stop playing because we are old; we grow old because we stop playing. There are only four secrets to staying young, being happy and achieving success. You have to laugh and find humor every day. You've got to have a dream. When you lose your dreams, you die. We have so many people walking around who are dead and don't even know it! There is a huge difference between growing older and growing up. Anybody can grow older. That doesn't take any talent or ability. The idea is to grow up by always finding the opportunity to change. I have no regrets. The elderly usually don't have regrets for what we did, but rather for things we did not do. The only people who fear death are those with regrets."

She concluded her speech by courageously singing "The Rose." She challenged each of us to study the lyrics and live them out in our daily lives. At the year's end, Rose finished the college degree she had begun all those years ago. One week after graduation, Rose died peacefully in her sleep. More than 2,000 college students attended her funeral in tribute to the wonderful woman who taught by example that it's never too late to be all you can possibly be.

Lent—Holy Week—Easter! It's never too late to "rise" to new heights with the Lord Jesus walking at our side.

REFLECTION ON DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

On this Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, we remember the dedication of this day by Saint John Paul II in honor of St. Faustna's vision of Christ, in which the Lord's heart radiated forth with divine mercy for the world. But what does mercy mean? It designates the suffering of the heart, a type of compassion, a deep, loving identification with people in their suffering. It is the characteristic of God, for God is love. Nothing in the world would exist if it were not, at every moment, loved into being by God—a great act of tender mercy. How is this love made manifest in us? Precisely through following God's commands and through forgiveness.



At the Liturgy of Canonization for Sister Mary Faustna Kowalski, Sunday, April 30, 2000, the late St. John Paul II, a great devotee of the Feast of Divine Mercy proclaimed: *"Before speaking these words, Jesus shows his hands and his side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in his heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity. From that heart Sr Faustna Kowalska, the blessed whom from now on we will call a saint, will see two rays of light shining from that heart and illuminating the world: The two rays," Jesus himself explained to her one day, "represent blood and water"....Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ's crucified: My daughter, say that I am love and mercy personified,"* Jesus asked of Sr Faustna. Christ pours out this mercy on humanity through the sending of the Spirit who, in the Trinity, is the Person-Love. And is not mercy love's "second name" understood in its deepest and most tender aspect, in its ability to take upon itself the burden of any need and, especially, in its immense capacity for forgiveness? Jesus told Sr Faustna: "Humanity will not find peace until it turns trustfully to divine mercy." Sr Faustna Kowalska wrote in her Diary: "I feel tremendous pain when I see the sufferings of my neighbors. All my neighbors' sufferings reverberate in my own heart; I carry their anguish in my heart in such a way that it even physically destroys me. I would like all their sorrows to fall upon me, in order to relieve my neighbor."

On this Feast of Divine Mercy let us echo the words of Thomas, "My Lord and My God," and through the intercession of Saint Faustna, let us ask the Lord of Mercy for the grace to become true messengers of Mercy in our own age.

An Early Inspiration to Serve Others

As we near the 40th anniversary of Fr. Greg's ordination as a priest, we learn about a very early influence for his vocation. As a six-year-old, he never forgot the frequent visits by Fr. Hugh O'Brien to his 1st-grade class at Mary Seat of Wisdom in Park Ridge. Always full of humor and making the kids laugh, young Greg thought to himself, "I want to be like him one day."

As he grew up, Fr. Greg's life filled up with family, a wide variety of sports, and the unique love of birding, eventually taking him to his high school, Notre Dame College Prep in Niles. But he never lost the feeling he had in the 1st grade, instilled by Fr. O'Brien.

Early in his high school senior year, he received a scholarship to major in radio and television at Northwestern University. Inspired by his father, Sig Sakowicz, a popular Chicago radio personality, Fr. Greg aspired to be a radio and TV sportscaster. But a churning inside him took him to his high school's guidance counselor, Fr. Lavelly, who asked him, "Do you think God might be calling you to the priesthood?"

But Fr. Greg still questioned, asking Fr. Lavelly, "Why doesn't God call someone else?" As he discerned his future, he came to realize that God was offering him a precious gift, a life of serving others through the priesthood. At eighteen-years-old, Greg turned down the scholarship to Northwestern University and headed to Niles College Seminary of Loyola University, never looking back.

As a priest, Fr. Greg lives every day by his mantra, "Were you there when we needed you?" and a willingness to be inconvenienced, making his pastoral role first and foremost. "Serving as a priest is about Jesus, evangelizing with a message of hope and mission," Fr. Greg shares. For him, the priesthood is about serving others, "bringing the Good News of Jesus to those in need, in good times and bad, in joy and sorrow during the ups and downs of life."

"It is a real privilege to be invited into people's lives in those critical moments when they need to be able to connect the mystery of God with their life through faith," he says. "It has been a wonderful ride, truly a gift from God." Fr. Greg thanks God each day for the gift of the priesthood.

As an ailing senior, Cochise relies on the help of a dependable home aide to help her with daily tasks and errands so she could continue to live in her home and enjoy a high quality of life. When she had trouble finding an aid that would fit her needs, she reached out to Catholic Charities who worked with her to find somebody she was comfortable with.
