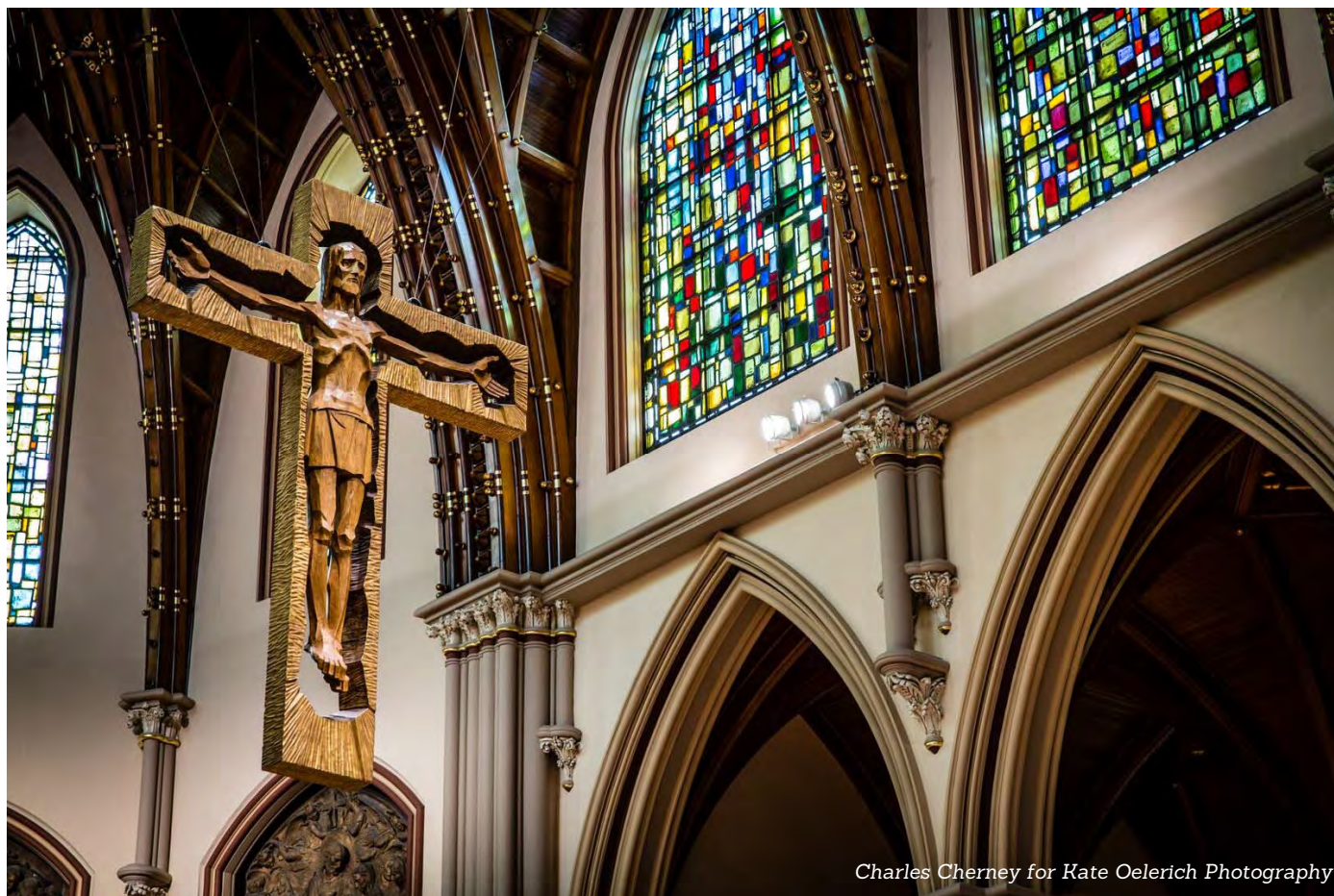

Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

Last February 21, I gave a talk here at Holy Name Cathedral entitled: *Forgiving is a Way to Stop Hurting*. I shared fifteen points with those who attended. I share with you what I offered the group. Lent is a time to repent . . . to rethink again . . . changes we need to make in our lives with the help and grace of God.



FORGIVENESS

1. To forgive is to set a prisoner free and that prisoner is you.
2. Those who forgive most, are most forgiven.
3. Forgiving is a way to stop hurting.
4. It's hard to forgive, but it's harder not to.
5. Forgiving or being forgiven means letting go of a hurt.
6. Forgiving is a process/forgiveness is a decision.
7. We must stop living in the past and forgive ourselves, others—and even God.
8. God forgives us for everything. Period!
9. Forgiveness is a gift to yourself.
10. Forgiveness doesn't change the past, it changes the future.
11. Let it go!!!
12. No matter how many steps we move away from God it only takes one step to get back to God.
13. Stop living in the past.
14. Anger comes naturally, forgiving takes strength.
15. As you grow older, is life making you better or bitter?

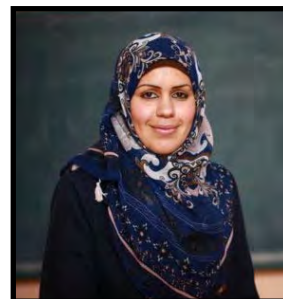
Who's Who in this new RCIA

If you attend the 9:30 Mass, you may notice that not all RCIA participants are included in the rites. Followed by a massive exodus of adults, dismissed by the priest. This may help:

- The RCIA is an ancient process for the unbaptized (catechumen) and the rites were created for them.
- There are adults, baptized in other Christian tradition, seeking to become Catholic, referred to as candidates. They, like us, witness the rites. Candidates also include Catholics seeking Eucharist and Confirmation.
- Seventeen adults are preparing to be received into the Church on Easter Vigil.
- The year round catechumenate allows us to begin the journey with 16 new adults, who will be received when they are ready.
- Adults continue to inquire, and we can begin their journey throughout the year.

JOURNEY TO GAZA

Ona always knew she wanted to be an example to her daughters. She earned a degree from a university. But in Gaza, jobs are hard to find.



Even though Ona had good grades, she could not find work as a teacher. Through CRS, Ona applied for a teaching internship. She took her knowledge, plus some of her income— and opened a tutoring center. Now, she helps students of all ages with their studies. After only one month, Ona's center has served 41 children. "CRS helped me start," Ona says. "They gave me the chance. Now I will be able to continue on my own."


