Dear People of God,

As a child, I had considered Priesthood along with some of my grammar school classmates. 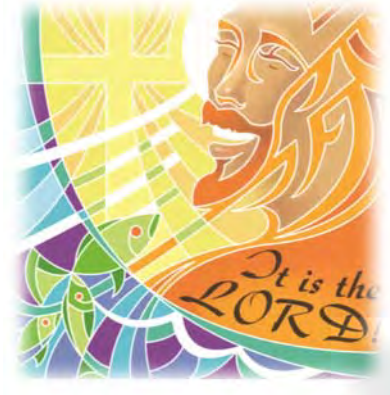

### MAY DEDICATED TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



May is such a beautiful month. The whole month is dedicated to our Blessed Lady, Mother of God. The pious practice of honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary during the entire month of May has been especially recommended by many Popes.

#### Some devotions to Mother Mary for the Month of May:

1. Recite the **Regina Coeli (during Easter Season)** or **Angelus (other days of the year)** daily.
2. Recite the **Rosary** daily as a family. Remember to meditate on each mystery and to pray with all your heart and mind.
3. Recite the **Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary** also known as the **Litany of Loreto**.
4. Attend Mass on **First Saturday** of the month or if not possible, on any other **Saturday** to honor our Mother.
5. Celebrate the **Feast of Our Lady of Fatima** on **May 13th**.
6. Visit a **Marian Shrine** as a pilgrimage.
7. Celebrate the **Feast of the Visitation** on May 31st. Contemplate Mary's ardent charity as she hurried to visit her cousin Elizabeth.

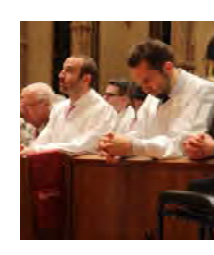
