

Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi—The Body and Blood of Christ. Eucharist means “giving thanks.” What is the real meaning of today’s Eucharistic Feast? Let me share a story.

On Sand and Stone

Two friends were walking through the desert. At some point of the journey they had an argument, and one friend slapped the other on the face. The one who got slapped was hurt and without saying anything, wrote on the sand: “Today, my best friend slapped me on the face.”

They kept on walking until they found an oasis, where they decided to take a bath. The one who had been slapped got stuck in the mire and started to drown, but his friend saved him. After he recovered from near-drowning, he wrote on a stone: “Today my best friend saved my life.”

The friend who had slapped and saved his best friend asked him: “After I hurt you, you wrote on the sand and just now, after I helped you, you wrote on a stone. Why?”

The friend replied, “When someone hurts us we should write it down on the sand so that the winds of forgiveness can blow it away. But when someone does some good things for us we must engrave it in stone so that no wind can ever erase it.”

So let us learn to write our hurts on the sand, and to carve our blessings in stone.

At the same time, we gather as the Body of Christ every weekend knowing God’s grace is entwined with our freedom. We gather every weekend to be strengthened and nourished by the Lord’s Word and fed around the Lord’s Table in order to go forth and “feed” our sisters and brothers—especially the poor, homeless and have-nots in our city, country and world. The Lord has promised to be with us always and continually be our hope, joy and eternal food. We need to “flock” together as “Church” - as God’s People, to realize we are a pilgrim people—to be nourished, strengthened and commissioned to reach out to others in His Name. We are fed by the Lord, but the Eucharist also means we feed each other.

Keep reading

One day I hopped into a taxi and we took off for the airport. We were driving in the right lane when suddenly a black car jumped out of parking space right in front of us. My taxi driver slammed on his brakes, skidded and missed the other car by just inches! The driver of the other car whipped his head around and started yelling at us. My taxi driver just smiled and waved at the guy. And I mean, he was really friendly.

So I asked, “Why did you just do that?” This guy almost ruined your car and sent us to the hospital!” This is when my taxi driver taught me what I now call, “The Law of the Garbage Truck.” He explained that many people are like garbage trucks. They run around full of garbage, full of frustration, full of anger and full of disappointment. As their garbage piles up, they need a place to dump it and sometimes they’ll dump it on you. Don’t take it personally. Just smile, wave, wish them well and move on. Don’t take their garbage and spread it to other people at work, at home or on the streets.

The bottom line is that successful people do not let garbage trucks take over their day. Life’s too short to wake up in the morning with regrets, so . . . “Love the people who treat you right. Pray for the ones who don’t.”

Life is ten percent what you make it and ninety percent how you take it!

And always “take life” by giving back and giving forward, for we must be Eucharist for each other. For Eucharist exists not only to change bread and wine, but also to change us! We need to love this world back into life for we are the Body of Christ.

NOW VENERABLE FR. AUGUSTUS TOLTON

This new title given to Fr. Gus is an important next step in his canonization process. The Archdiocese of Chicago completed a lengthy investigation, documenting his holiness. This evidence was sent to the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints and the Roman phase began. After an examination of the diocesan documents, the Congregation's theologians were convinced, and then the Cardinal and bishop members of the Congregation also found the documentation favorable. It was then sent to Pope Francis. On Tuesday, June 11th, Pope Francis issued a decree recognizing the 'heroic virtue' of Fr. Gus and now assigned the title 'Venerable' to him.



What was there about this First African American priest in the United States and in Chicago that he lived 'the cardinal virtues of prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance at a heroic level'? AS PROMISED - RESULTS FROM 35 - 55 YEAR OLDS

Surprisingly, this column received only 5 replies when it asked people in the 35 - 55 demographic to respond as to **what was missing from the programming and activities currently being offered by the parish for this age group**. One suggestion was to have an exercise session on Saturdays, which ACT II tried last year and which was discontinued due to lack of attendance. Another suggestion was to plan a group to go to a touring musical such as West Side Story, an "ask" which is logistically daunting when you consider having to choose an upcoming production, select a date and then collect the ticket money BEFOREHAND in order to place an order for tickets. One person had several interesting suggestions geared to young families: monthly "time away" gatherings for Moms / Dads; Friday night family movies; babysitting networking; week-end family meet-ups at a local park.

Like the Commissions and Young Adult Ministry, ACT II depends solely upon its dedicated volunteers. Any future activities will need not only suggestions, but also volunteers to make the suggestions a reality. Understandably people in the 35-55 demographic are busy building careers and busy with family and social relationships. But their participation and leadership are needed to make this group viable.

Last summer's parish survey identified this outreach as a need. Since this initial response number was low, future bulletins this summer, will try to reach out to a wider population for input.
