Some wonderful news for Holy Name Cathedral!

During the past year, I was informed that the original statue of Mary, which was in Holy Name Cathedral over hundred years ago, has been found and is in remarkably good condition.

Through the generosity of a donor the statue has been refurbished and will come back home replacing our present bronze Mary art piece in our sanctuary later this year. I feel very strongly that the original Mary statue belongs in our Cathedral as a symbol not only of who we were as Holy Name was established, but also who we wish to become as a Faith Community through the intercession of our Blessed Mother.



Our bronze Mary will be stored as we decide on a prominent new location for this treasured piece of art.

As we rededicate the statue of Mary, I am also very happy to announce that Cardinal Blase Cupich has approved the installation of a new baptistry in the Cathedral provided through the generosity of an individual donor who designated this project in his estate plan.

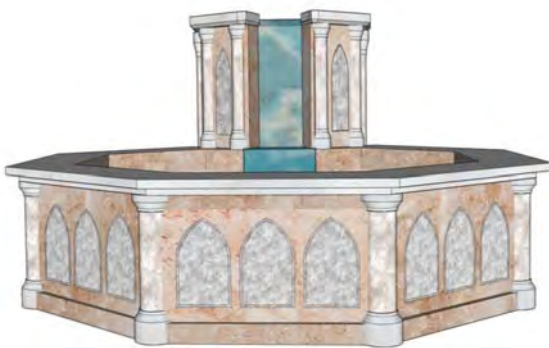
The baptistry will be located between the four pillars to the right of the main altar as you face the altar from the pews. This beautiful baptistry will allow us to appropriately baptize our RCIA candidates and so many others throughout the year. It will also provide a permanent and very visual symbol in our Cathedral reminding each of us of our call, through baptism, to participate in the mission and ministries of Jesus Christ. Together we are called to love this world back into life.

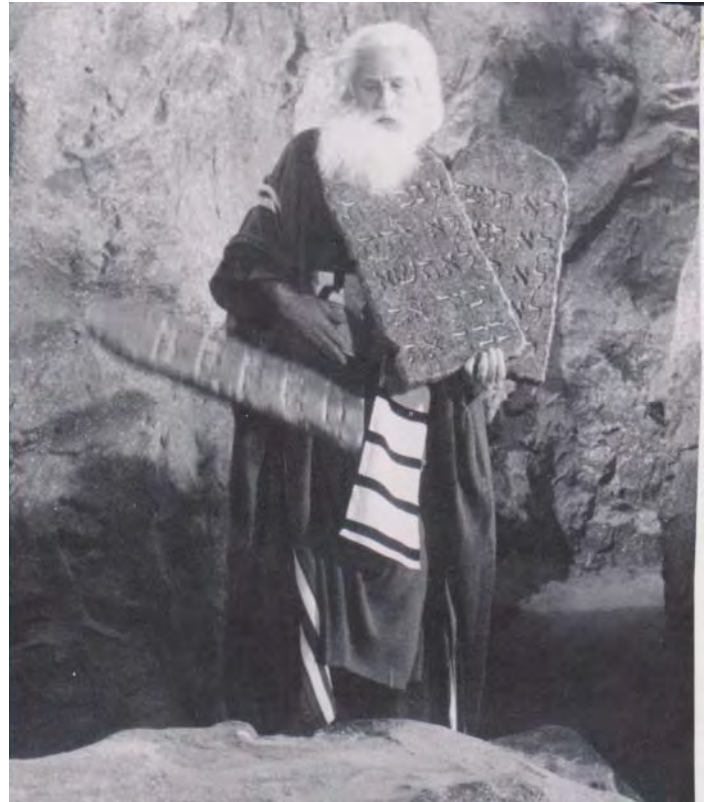
