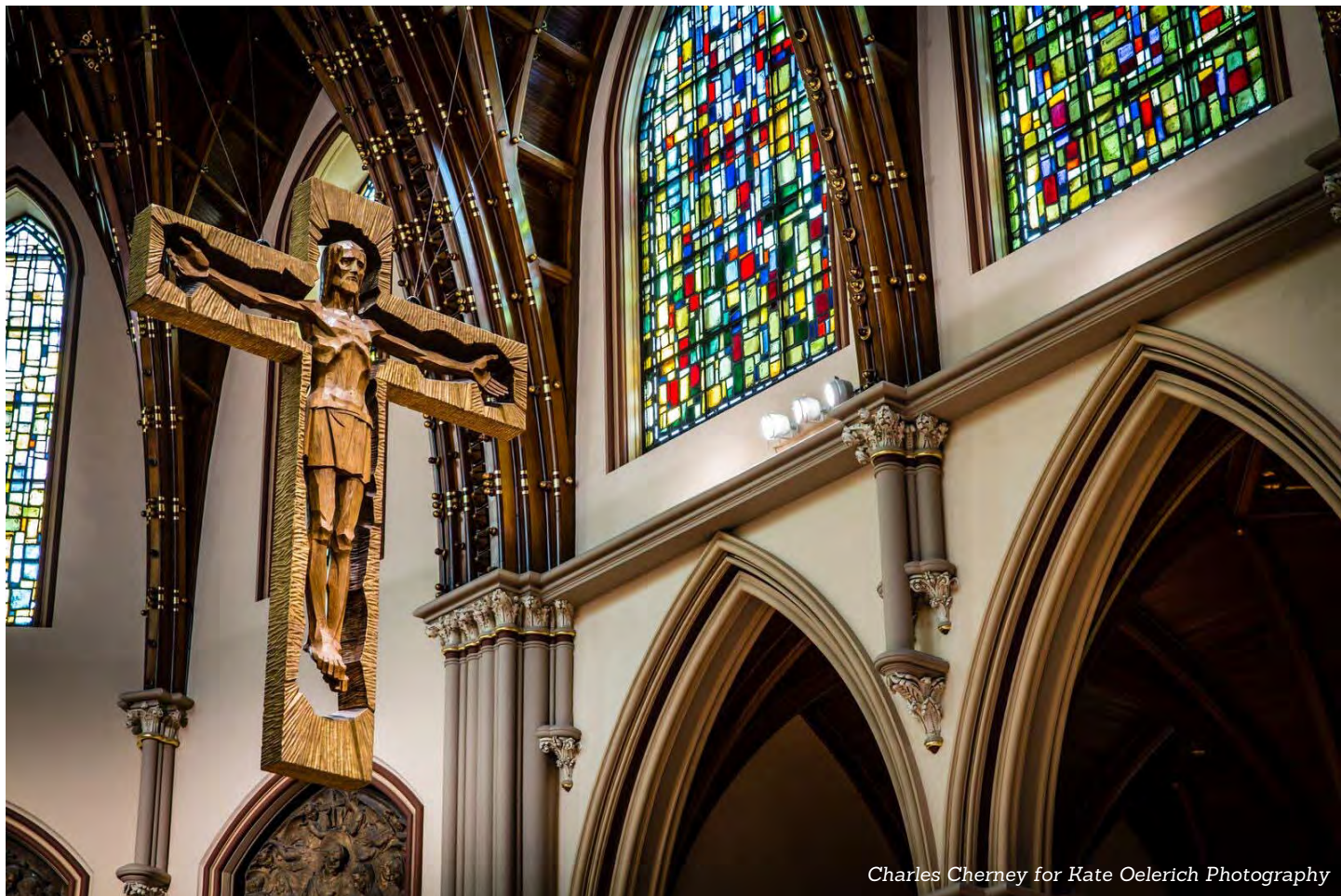

## Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

How quickly summer is moving! We always look forward to the warm days of summer and in the blink of an eye we're talking about Labor Day Weekend! I hope you had a chance to enjoy summer.

In an interview published in the Argentine weekly, "Viva," on July 27, 2014 Pope Francis listed the top 10 tips for bringing greater joy to our life. Definitely worth reading . . . . . And pass it on . . . . .



1. **“Live and let live.”** According to Pope Francis, everyone should be guided by this principle, which has a similar expression in Rome, “Move forward and let others do the same.”
2. **“Be giving of yourself to others.”** People need to be open and generous toward others because “if you withdraw into yourself, you run the risk of becoming egocentric. And stagnant water becomes putrid.”
3. **“Proceed calmly”** in life. Pope Francis, who used to teach high school literature, used an image from an Argentine novel by Ricardo Güiraldes, in which the protagonist—gaicho Don Segundo Sombra—looks back on how he lived his life. “Sombra says that in his youth he was a stream full of rocks that he carried with him; as an adult, a rushing river; and in old age, he was still moving, but slowly, like a pool of water.” Pope Francis said he likes this latter image of pool water—to have “the ability to move with kindness and humility, a calmness in life.”
4. **“A healthy sense of leisure.”** The pleasures of art, literature and playing together with children have been lost. Consumerism has brought us anxiety and stress, causing people to lose a “healthy culture of leisure.” Their time is “swallowed up” so people can’t share it with anyone. According to Pope Francis, families must also turn off the TV when they sit down to eat because having it on during mealtime, “doesn’t let you communicate” with each other.
5. Sundays should be holidays. Workers should have Sundays off because **“Sunday is for family.”**
6. Find innovative ways to create dignified jobs for young people. “We need to be creative with young people. If they have no opportunities they will get into drugs” and be more vulnerable to suicide. “It’s not enough to give them food. **“Dignity is given to you when you can bring food home”** from one’s own labor.
7. **Respect and take care of nature.** Environmental degradation “is one of the biggest challenges we have. I think a question that we’re not asking ourselves is: ‘Isn’t humanity committing suicide with this indiscriminate and tyrannical use of nature?’”
8. **Stop being negative.** “Needing to talk badly about others indicates low self-esteem. That means, ‘I feel so low that instead of picking myself up I have to cut others down,’ ” the Pope said. **“Letting go of negative things quickly is healthy.”**
9. Don’t proselytize; respect others’ beliefs. **“We can inspire others through witness** so that one grows together in communicating. The church grows by attraction, not proselytizing,” Pope Francis said.
10. Work for peace. “We are living in a time of many wars and **the call for peace must be shouted.** Peace sometimes gives the impression of being quiet, but it is never quiet; peace is always proactive and dynamic.

Wonderful words of wisdom—and challenging! Enjoy the remaining weeks of summer!

“...I enjoyed my classmates so much that it was important for me to accept the sacraments along with them.

Speaking about religion feels

vulnerable, personal and uncomfortable. My classmates were supportive, patient and open to participation and opening up in this vulnerable space for us. We all succeeded together through taking part in the classes activities.

RCIA both taught and encouraged me to be my best self both in the Church walls and outside. I am more thoughtful of others, giving to those who need it and feel a wholeness in being more spiritually connected.

My favorite moment (of the Mass) was just after being confirmed by Bishop Mark Bartosic. I sat back down at my seat, opened my hymnal and began to sing See Ye First. It was a hymn I used to sing back in my church choir days and suddenly my faith life flashed before my eyes as I sang: Singing in all those rehearsals growing up, reflecting on singing for God, appreciating God's creation on countless trail runs with my dad, being in RCIA, and the big commitment I made just a moment before. Everything felt like it came full circle. I became overwhelmed with elated emotion and uncontrollable tears rolled down my face as I tried to keep a tune without my voice cracking. The Holy Spirit was there in that moment and I'll never forget it.”
