## Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

Summer is quickly coming to a close. September has dawned and daylight is growing shorter. Seasons change ever so slowly and eventually burst in all their glory. The seasons of our lives also change and nothing remains the same.

Many people fight change or refuse to grow. Someone once said: "Heaven is a local call." What does this mean? How do we glimpse the Kingdom of God in our lives today? The following story powerfully connects change, growth and the ability to make heaven a local call.


### RCIA RECONVENES
