Message from the Rector

Dear People of God,

Our New Year is already into the second week and this weekend concludes the Christmas Season as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. What does this mean? Jesus' Baptism begins his public ministry—a journey Christ takes with God his Father by calling all people of all ages to follow in his steps. The Baptism of the Lord Jesus is an opportunity for us to renew our Baptismal promises and recommit to help build the Kingdom of God in our daily lives.

I received a wonderful book over the holidays, a few years ago, entitled *Grace for the Moment* by Max Lucado. The book offers short daily reflections for each day of the year. The preface contains a passage from another book he wrote entitled: *When God Whispers Y our Name*.

As we continue our new year together celebrating the Baptism of the Lord this weekend, take the time to reflect upon Lucado's poignant words and pass it on.

I CHOOSE LOVE . . .

No occasion justifies hatred; no injustice warrants bitterness. I choose love. Today I will love God and what God loves.

I CHOOSE JOY . . .

I will invite my God to be the God of circumstance. I will refuse the temptation to by cynical—the tool of the lazy thinker. I will refuse to see people as anything less than human beings created by God. I will refuse to see any problem as anything less than an opportunity to see God.

I CHOOSE PEACE . . .

I will live forgiven. I will forgive so that I may live.

I CHOOSE PATIENCE . . .

I will overlook the inconveniences of the world. Instead of cursing the one who takes my place, I'll invite him to do so. Rather than complain that the wait is too long, I will thank God for a moment to pray. Instead of clenching my fist at new assignments, I will face them with joy and courage.

I CHOOSE KINDNESS . . .

I will be kind to the poor, for they are alone. Kind to the rich, for they are afraid.

And kind to the unkind, for such is how God has treated me.

I CHOOSE GOODNESS . . .

I will go without a dollar before I take a dishonest one. I will be overlooked before I will boast.

I will confess before I will accuse. I choose goodness.

I CHOOSE FAITHFULNESS . . .







THIS IS MY BELOVED SON

This Sunday's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. In the scriptures we see one more epiphany, or manifestation, of the Spirit of God in Jesus—but this time it is as an adult, rather than as a child. Jesus' baptism also serves as the inauguration of his prophetic mission and the messianic age.

Today's reading from Isaiah describes God's chosen Messiah, upon whom God's spirit rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with

rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power" (Acts 10:38). Finally, in the proclamation from Matthew's Gospel Jesus' baptism in water goes almost unnoticed. The crucial moment comes when the Spirit of God comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven echoes the words of Isaiah: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17).

THE RCIA @ HNC

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) traces its roots back to the earliest days of Christian communities. The process is for . .

- Those never baptized
- Those baptized in another Christian tradition who would like to become Catholic
- Those baptized as a Catholic, yet have not completed the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.

Based on input from those who have participated in the process at Holy Name, we are implementing revision in the experience:

- We will continue to implement the year round catechumenate, possibly allowing adults to at the point of initial communication, There are various stages of the process.
- Those adults who are unbaptized will enter the first stage, referred to as the Pre-*Catechumenate*. There is an emphasis on the basic tenets of Christianity. It is a time for the inquirer to ask questions and search to see if Catholicism is right for them.
- The next stage, the *Catechumenate*, It starts with the Rite of Acceptance which declares the individual's intention to become Catholic at the Easter Vigil.
- The Rite of Election and the Call to Conversion begins third stage, *Purification and Enlightenment*. Lent is a time for the adults to prepare for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist on Holy Saturday evening.
- *Mystagogy* is the final stage, allowing the new Catholics the time to reflect on the call to discipleship.
- Adults baptized in other Christian traditions, or baptized Catholic, begin with the catechumenate. Based on input from the team and sponsors, each adult will be invited profess their intent in the Rite of Welcome.
- The team, upon discernment, with the candidates, establish when they will be received into the Church. Reception can occur throughout the year.




