At the same time, I want to thank this marvelous Faith Community for attending Mom's wake and beautiful funeral liturgy on Tuesday, January 21. People waited in line over an hour to say a prayer and offer their deepest support to my family. I will always remember your many acts of kindness. Thank you for your presence in so many ways! I also want to thank Cardinal Blase Cupich, our HNC Staff, Priests, Deacons and Sisters for their tremendous support and prayers.



The grieving process has started. Not an easy journey! Someone once said: "Grieving is a process and recovery is a decision." However, grieving we must. As many of you know, I was extremely close to my Mother. I will continue sharing "Mom stories" from the pulpit. I ask for your continued prayers. The strength of God will be my source of strength, hope and courage. Our Mother would want her family to continue with their lives. We will move forward with the grace of God though everything will now be viewed with different lenses. The Resurrection of Jesus and the promise of eternal life will sustain us.

My Mother's health had been failing the last two years. I would always bring Mom a copy of our HNC bulletins on Sunday afternoons. Mom always got a chuckle from the cartoon and caption. Mom also enjoyed reading my column later in the week. However, my Mother made it a point to call me after she read my article from September 23, 2018. It truly touched her heart. In honor of my Mother, I share with you part of that article. It was one of the last columns she was able to enjoy before reading became much too difficult. I will always love you and pray for you everyday the rest of my life, Mom. You are now home with God and singing with the angels. Enjoy what touched my Mother's heart.

I would never trade my amazing friends, my wonderful life, my loving family for less gray hair or a flatter belly. As I've aged, I've become kinder to myself and less critical of myself. I've become my own friend. I don't chide myself for eating that extra cookie, or for not making my bed, or for buying that silly cement gecko that I didn't need but looks so avant garde on my patio. I am entitled to a treat, to be messy, to be extravagant.

I have seen too many dear friends leave this world too soon, before they understood the great freedom that comes with aging.

Whose business is it if I choose to read or play on the computer until 4 a.m. and sleep until noon? I will dance with myself to those wonderful tune of the 40's and 50's, and if I, at the same time, wish to weep over a lost love . . . I will.

I will walk the beach in a swim suit that is stretched over a bulging body, and I will dive into the waves with abandon if I choose to, despite the pitying glances from the jet set. They, too, will get old. I know I am sometimes forgetful. But there again, some of life is just as well forgotten. And I eventually remember the important things.

Sure, over the years my heart has been broken. How can your heart not break when you lose a loved one, or when a child suffers, or even when somebody's beloved pet gets hit by a car? But broken hearts are what gives us strength and understanding and compassion. A heart never broken is pristine and sterile and will never know the joy of being imperfect.

I am so blessed to have lived long enough to have my hair turning gray and to have my youthful laughs be forever etched into deep grooves on my face. So many have never laughed, and so many have died before their hair could turn silver.

As you get older, it is easier to be positive. You care less about what other people think. I don't question myself anymore. I've even earned the right to be wrong.

So, to answer your question, I like being old. It has set me free. I like the person I have become. I am not going to live forever on this earth, but while I am still here, I will not waste time lamenting what could have been, or worrying about what will be. And I shall eat dessert every single day (if I feel like it).

## A CHRISTMAS REPRISE

The Church's celebration three weeks ago of the Baptism of the Lord signaled the "official" end of the Christmas season. Today's feast of the Presentation of the Lord seems to extend the Incarnation celebration a bit longer. In fact, some have called this feast a "second Epiphany."

The first reading recalls the anticipation of Advent, as Malachi writes, "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me." The reading from Hebrews reminds us of the Incarnation, proclaiming that Jesus had a "share" in our own "blood and flesh." The Gospel finds the infant Jesus on his first visit to Jerusalem and his human parents once again surprised and in awe over the events surround his birth.

In the simplicity of the manger, in the grandeur of the temple, in the domesticity of Nazareth, Jesus comes. May we come to know him and so be filled with "wisdom" and the "favor of God." Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

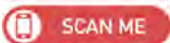
