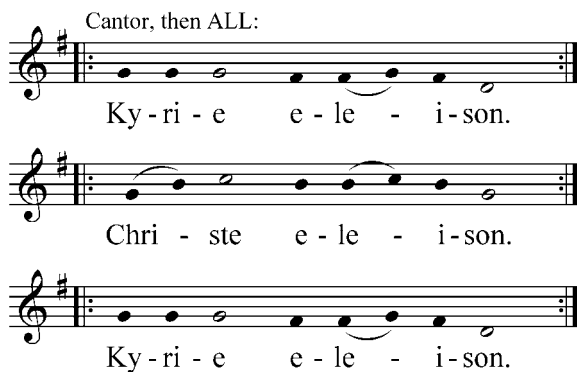

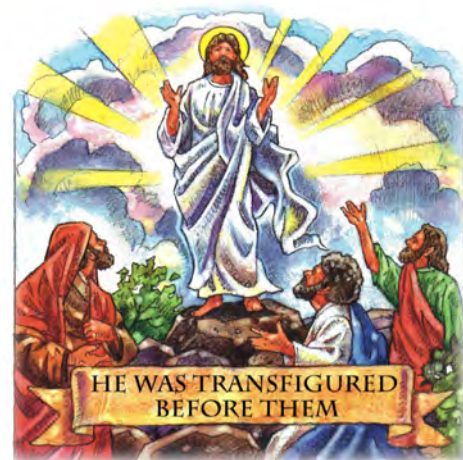

THE CATHEDRAL'S RESPONSE TO THE CORONAVIRUS

All Ministers must wash their hands before Mass begins and use an alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution before and after distributing Holy Communion.

For all of the faithful participating during all Masses and liturgies:

- ◆ Refrain from physical contact during the Sign of Peace as well as the welcome greeting (*note: the Sign of Peace and the welcome can be exchanged without physical contact*).
- ◆ At this time we will not distribute the Precious Blood to the faithful at Communion time.
- ◆ Given the frequency of direct contact with saliva in the distribution of Holy Communion on the tongue, each individual should receive Holy Communion reverently in open hands.
- ◆ Refrain from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer.
- ◆ Holy Water will not be available from the communal fonts.
- ◆ If you are sick or are experiencing symptoms of sickness, you are not obliged to attend Mass.

Let us pray for those infected with or recovering from the coronavirus, may Jesus, the Divine Physician, offer them hope and healing.

RITE OF ELECTION & NEW JOURNEYS



Those adults and children preparing to be received into the Catholic Church participated in the Rite of Election, Sunday, March 1, 2020, at the Cathedral. Joined by catechumens and candidates from other parishes, Bishop John Manz declared the catechumens as members of the Elect, to be fully initiated through baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. Likewise, Bishop Manz recognized the desire of those baptized in other Christian traditions, or Catholics seeking to complete the Sacraments of Initiation, and granted his blessing for their final preparations.

During this Season of Lent, the Elect and candidates will experience a period known as scrutinies. This time of spiritual self-exploration allows them to identify those behaviors, habits, or outlooks that may impede their desire to become full members of the Catholic Church.

As these persons prepare for reception of the sacraments at the Easter Vigil, approximately 15 adults are beginning the process of discernment to become Catholic. If you someone who wishes to consider the possibility, contact Dr. Ken Ortega
