

Gaudete – Rejoice!

On this Third Sunday of Advent, our liturgy changes its focus, which is marked by many external signs. Until now, our Gospel readings have




focused on the second coming of Christ. They now turn to the initial coming of Christ among us, how he offers us freedom, peace and life. As we move beyond the midpoint of our Advent season, let us renew our desire to prepare a place for our God within our lives and our hearts.

This week, we light our rose-colored candle on the Advent wreath, and the priest and deacon wear a rare color for their vestments — rose. This color is used only twice a year, during the midway point of our Advent and Lenten seasons.

The priest wears rose-colored vestments as a visible expression of joy and is different from the general season of Advent. By changing from purple to rosecolored vestments, it is an external symbol of the reality we will soon celebrate: the coming of God in the flesh.

This change in the liturgical focus is found in the entrance antiphon for Mass: "Rejoice in the Lord always: again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." (Phil 4:4-5). We rejoice today because we draw closer to the reality of God keeping His promise that he will not abandon his people to death and that He comes among us in the person of Jesus Christ, to bring us life in abundance.

The Third Sunday of Advent this year falls on Dec. 12, the traditional Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It is Mary who is the cause of our joy, for by her "yes," the word was made flesh and dwelt among us. It is Mary who shows us how to be strong in the face of trial and adversity. As we journey closer to Christmas Day, let us invite Mary to walk with us on our Advent journey, as she teaches us there is always a reason to rejoice, because Christ has renewed all things by the Incarnation.

Simbang Gabi, a cherished Filipino Christmas tradition that means 'Mass in the Dark," takes place at dawn. The novena starts on Dec. 15 ending with the midnight Mass on Christmas. The Christmas lantern called a "parol," a five-pointed star, is one of the most iconic symbols of Filipino Christmas spirit. It represents the Star of Bethlehem that guided the three wise men to the manger of Baby Jesus.

This year at Holy Name, we will host Simbang Gabi at 7 p.m. on Dec. 15. Parols will process at the start of the Mass sharing light into the darkened church while the Cathedral Filipino Singers (in masks) will process in singing "O Come, All Ye Faithful" followed by Filipino Christmas hymns and psalms.

Next Friday, December 17, is the 85th birthday of Pope Francis, elected in 2013 as the 266th Pope. Though not a canonized saint (yet), his words and reflections are saintly in their impact.



His devotion to St. Joseph is known worldwide. He introduced us to the image of St. Joseph Sleeping, a horizontal statue of this holy man asleep. In Matthew's Gospel, an angel twice spoke God's will to Joseph while he was asleep... and Joseph obeyed. So devoted is Pope Francis to him, we have just completed the The Year of St. Joseph.

As is true of all Popes and Saints, Francis has a devotion to Mary, the mother of Jesus and our mother as well. His love for her is evident in this prayer he wrote:

Mary, woman of listening, open our ears:

Grant us to know how to listen to the word of your Son Jesus, among the thousands of words of this world; grant that we may listen to the reality in which we live, to every person we encounter, especially those who are poor, in need, in hardship.

Mary, woman of decision, illuminate our mind and heart so that we may obey, unhesitatingly, the word of your Son Jesus; give us the courage to decide, not to let ourselves be dragged along, letting others direct our life.

Mary, woman of action, obtain that our hands and feet "move with haste" toward others, to bring them the charity and love of your Son Jesus, to bring the light of the Gospel to the world as you did.

Third Sunday of Advent

December 12, 2021 Zephaniah 3:14-18a; Philippians 4:4-7; Luke 3: 10-18

As adults, it's hard to accept that we are not in charge; it was for me.

It's been hard for me to accept that I've not ever been the captain of my ship; the master of my destiny.

Finally, I began to take account of my life. While believing that I was steering my destiny, I realized that every major and usually abrupt change in my life was not planned, or orchestrated, or even imagined by me. But change happened, usually, while I was busy planning, preparing and working hard at something completely different. And, after a bit of disappointment and sometimes a little hissy fit, I always found that I was completely happy and satisfied with what did come to fruition.

I now understand better what is meant by --have no anxiety at all... but pray and petition with thanksgiving (Phil 4:4-7). I've always thankfully accepted all daily gifts of life. Yet, it never dawned on me to give thanks for God hearing my prayers and petitions. Now, in knowing that God hears all my prayers, I am able to relax as never before without the burden of anxiety. Anxiety was my close companion for far too long. Now, I better understand that the love of God hears me and will not abandon me, and that prayers are answered with the clarity and sincerity that I commit to them, but not necessarily as I envision, and especially not within the control of my timing. Anxiety is fast losing its grip.

I'm learning to trust that God will not abandon me, misguide me, and always hear my petitions. Finally, I'm accepting that my logic, my thoughts, even my understanding of myself should follow instead of lead; and when I do that, I can indeed relax in the knowledge that God has plans for my life, has heard my prayers and petitions, and is always in charge whatever happens. He loves me, and I can trust this leadership wherever it takes me next.



Making a year-end gift from your IRA can benefit you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (OCD), allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. - If you are 72-years-old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

Prayers

What is a Mass Intention?

Holy Name Cathedral offers you different possibilities when you request that Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. First, it may be helpful to understand what happens when you ask that your intention join to a Mass. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life.

Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect. At Holy Name Cathedral, we celebrate single-intention Masses as well as gathered-intention Masses. You may find it more convenient to request one of the two weekly gathered-intention Masses (Wednesdays at 8:00 a.m. and Fridays at 12 p.m.). If you do, we can accommodate your request sooner, and it is the same as a singleintention Mass.


